ADORATION DURING LENT
TUESDAY & THURSDAY
Mary's Chapel from 7:00AM until 7:00PM



Even first-year law students could have told you it was an open and shut case. The finest trial lawyer in the country couldn't have gotten her out of this one.

"The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery; and making her stand before all of them, they said to him, 'Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery'" (Jn 8:3-4).

She was caught in the act. The scribes and Pharisees say so. They believe it, and they are the authorities. They have everything they need: a crime, a defendant, witnesses, accusers, a law, proof—and now all they needed was a judge, a trial, and a sentence.

They chose as their courtroom the crowded and open temple precincts where Jesus was teaching: an open and shut case. And so, the proceedings begin. Something different emerges, however.

It seems there is Another, a second Defendant in the background yet to emerge. As is so often the case, the woman is placed "in the middle." Jesus had been preaching about love of enemies and care for the weak. The Pharisees now present someone very weak. The Pharisees point out what the Law of Moses commands: "Now in the law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?" (Jn 8:5).

The drama sharpens with those words put to Jesus, "Now what do you say?" (Jn 8:5). They seem to have no doubt about what to do next. So why do they go to Jesus? The woman is placed "in the middle," but their real target is Jesus: "They said this to test him, so that they might have some charge to bring against him" (Jn 8:6).

What will Jesus do? Will he turn away from his own teaching on love in order to follow the Law of Moses? Or will Jesus reject the Law of Moses and—so they thought—incriminate Himself? The Pharisees want to cast stones not to fulfill the Law of Moses but because they have hearts of stone.

Jesus is now on trial. "Jesus bent down and wrote with his finger on the ground" (Jn 8:6). "When they kept on questioning Him, He straightened up and said to them, 'Let anyone among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.' And once again He bent down and wrote on the ground" (Jn 8:7-8).

The sentence is handed down and the penalty decreed. The first-year law students would find themselves in over their heads. And so do the Pharisees and scribes. The case is not open and shut at all. In fact, where others shut, Jesus opens (see Rev 3:7).

The scene shifts quickly. The woman becomes the witness, the scribes and Pharisees the defendants, and Jesus the judge—who writes mercy into the world. They see quickly that as they took aim at Jesus they involved something more, they have allowed something different into this makeshift courtroom. They have admitted new and unheard of evidence; they have introduced a new Witness, and the tables begin to turn. The shape of the earth itself is changing. The very hand of God is upon them.

"When they heard it, they went away, one by one, beginning with the elders" (Jn 8:9). They leave one by one. Why? Because of love. They must depart. Jesus cross-examines the witness: "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" (Jn 8:10). Is he referring to the Pharisees and scribes, or to her sins? In either case, they are gone. Mercy has driven both away. At last, she has her opportunity to speak: "No one, sir" (Jn 8:11). Saint Augustine tells us that with the words "No one" the woman confesses her sin to Jesus, and with the word sir, translated "Lord" she confesses her faith in him.

"Neither do I condemn you. Go your way, and from now on do not sin again" (Jn 8:11).

In the Sacrament of Confession, Jesus writes not in the earth, but He brushes away the dust and writes upon and recreates our very heart.

Tenebrae (Latin for "darkness") was originally a medieval practice of the church. Our modern version of the ritual is a prayer service, comprised of spiritual readings and songs. This is an opportunity to observe the solemn content of the liturgical Matins and Lauds in a meditatively dramatic setting. With emphasis on the contrast between the darkness of Christ's suffering and death and the brilliance of Easter glory, light plays a large part in the presentation. Candles are gradually extinguished and, with the church in total darkness, a symbolic representation of the earthquake that followed Christ's death sounds. To conclude the service, the Christ candle is brought to the altar, signifying the return of Christ to the world in His Resurrection.

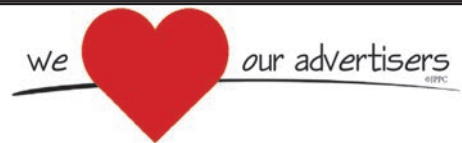
