Without the many volunteers involved in 4-H and the organizing of the fair, this opportunity would not exist. Thank you everyone! It is amazing to watch all of the pieces come together to make the fair happen (after the year round planning and learning that goes on).

Sending thank you notes is thoughtful, responsible, important, and **critical!** If you received a trophy or award, it is your obligation to send the sponsor a thank you note. In some cases, this is the only way they know the recipient of their donation. And in many cases sponsors will not renew if they do not receive a thank you note.

Sending thank you notes and auction pictures to the buyers of their animals is also an expectation and is critical for continuing sponsorship from the donors. Their generosity needs to be recognized by our 4-H members. Country Kids Livestock - In July, we went on our annual tour to see everyone's fair animals. To add to the fun, we had a weight guessing contest. Winners will be announced after the weigh-in at the fair. After the tour, we had a potluck lunch and went over fair expectations, barn decorations, and our upcoming Loons fundraiser. **Pony Creek** - Fair was a success for our club members! At our August meeting we elected new club officers and

had a presentation from Community Cancer Services of Isabella County. The 18th Annual "Into the Light" Cancer Awareness Walking Event is September 23 at the Isabella County Fairgrounds. Our club voted to participate by decorating luminary bags, collecting donations for the walking event and being there to help setup and take down. We discussed giving livestock and small animal buyer gifts as a club next year. In September, we will be having our roadside cleanup for the Adopt a Highway program with a pizza party at the end.

Rural Routers - In April we were very busy getting ready for the Maple Syrup Festival. The clubs activities included: sprucing up the Shepherd United Methodist yard, making a float for the parade, serving pancakes at the festival and hosting a petting zoo. Our float won 2nd place in the parade and was awarded \$200. The club voted to donate \$100 to the Shepherd Fire Department's Christmas Fund and the other \$100 to the Trail Blazers 4-H Club to put towards Cloverbud ribbons at the fair. In May we held a business meeting followed by a hotdog roast and ice cream. Our June meeting consisted of a filling out final registration forms, discussing the Still Exhibit Auction, and talking about the importance of buyer letters for both the still exhibit and animal auctions. Fair preparation was the topic of our July meeting. Topics discussed included the still exhibit auction, animal feed records, barn set up dates, horse members fair fees, animal care at the fair, individual preparation for the animal auctions, food stand requirements, the clubs baby animal barn, and the new series of educational events and contest at the fair. Following the meeting was a potluck dinner and time to play. At our July business meeting we discussed last minute details in preparation for the fair and enjoyed a potluck supper. On July 17, the club helped with the cleaning and set up of the 4-H food stand at the fairgrounds. The club enjoyed a great week at the fair with many members earning top awards in various areas. The clubs Baby Animal barn was once again a success. Visitors to the barn were happy to see that we had chicks hatching again in our incubator. The club sold water throughout the week to earn money for community projects in the coming year.

4-H National Youth Science Day: Drone Discovery!

Are you, or do you know, someone who wants to be part of the world's largest, youth-led science experiment? If you would like to take part in a fun, hands-on, 4-H National Youth Science Day (NYSD) (http://bit.ly/lHWfd7K) is for you.

On **October 5**, thousands of young people from 4-H clubs, groups and school programs across the country (and around the world) will participate in *Drone Discovery*, this year's 4-H NYSD Engineering

Design Challenge. Drone Discovery explores

the science behind drones and how drones are being used to solve real-world problems. For example, rescue workers mapping damage from natural disasters, farmers determining how to increase crop yield or filmmakers looking for the perfect aerial shot all might use a drone. This experiment, designed by a Cornell University Cooperative Extension (http://cce.cornell.edu), will allow youth to experiment with fixed- and rotary-wing designs, explore the concept of remote sensing and dive into the world of coding for real-world drone applications. Participants will learn everything from

real-world drone applications. Participants will learn everything from flight dynamics and aircraft types, to safety and regulations, to remote sensing and flight control.

You don't have to be a teacher, science enthusiast or expert to be part of the fun. National 4-H (http://www.4-h.org) will provide everything necessary to make your 4-H.

NYSD event a success. Materials for the *Drone Discovery Challenge*, including the youth (http://bit.ly/2aVuTES) and facilitator (http://bit.ly/2aFBGOs) guides, are available for download. Engineering design challenge kits (http://bit.ly/10IV9KM) are available for presale at the 4-H Mall. Each kit comes equipped with all the materials necessary for 10 youth, aged 8 to 14, to complete the experiment, including instruction booklets for both youth and adult facilitators. 


