MESSAGE PRINCIPAL'S

We understand that there are a variety of circumstances affecting students' attendance at school. Regardless of the reasons, the evidence is clear non-attendance affects student outcomes in significant ways. The effects of non-attendance add up over time and if they begin in the early years of schooling, they continue in later years. As a result, early attendance patterns, particularly in Kindergarten and Year 1, are crucial. In particular, unauthorised absences are strongly associated with compounding declines in achievement and engagement.

I'm certainly not suggesting that you shouldn't keep your child home from school when they are sick. Sickness occurs every year and that's normal. What I am saying is that as a community we need to be setting an expectation that school is important. We must send a very clear message to our children that learning is critical for their future success and that sometimes we are faced with challenges that in the moment are difficult but will pay dividends in the future - that hard work and sacrifice is good for them.

At Muswellbrook South we take a broad approach to achieving high levels of attendance at school. Our primary influence is in the classroom, where we provide individual support for students, engaging them in learning



and providing opportunities for success. We want school to be an inviting place that children enjoy, so that they are motivated to attend. We also have layers of support for children and families who face challenges. We make sure our gates are open early, so that if students need to be at school early they can be. We use our bus to pick up students who are having trouble coming to school on time. Our teachers make regular phone calls to see how they can help. We monitor attendance weekly to celebrate students who attend consistently and to investigate strategies to help those in need.

Attendance is a priority for us because we know all the benefits that come from consistently being at school. While we understand that 100% attendance for all students is unrealistic, we strongly believe that all students can achieve above 90% attendance (that's still 20 days off per year!). Currently as a school we only have about two-thirds of our students with attendance above 90%. For me that's not good enough. As a community, we must ensure our children engage in learning by attending school.




WELLBEING AT MSPS

Good for Kids good for life CHOOSE WATER AS A DRINK



We know that water is the best drink to guench thirst and stay hydrated. But sometimes it can be difficult to persuade children to choose water over sugary drinks.

How much water should our kids drink everyday?

1-5 years:

1.25L or 5 glasses 📃 🔤 🔤 🥁

- 1.5L or 6 glasses 🛄 🔤 🔤 🥁 6-12 years:
- + extra water if they have been active and on hot days

Here are some tips to encourage water intake:

- Pack a refillable water bottle for school and when you go out.
- Encourage your child to drink water before, after and during physical activity.
- Be a role model. Make a point of drinking water with vour kids.
- Try adding slices of fruits such as lime or lemon to water for extra flavour. You could even try mint or cucumber.
- ullet Try keeping a jug of water in the fridge or adding ice cubes.
