APPALACHIAN DISTRICT (MD, PA, VA, WV): The hot, humid weather pattern finally broke the first week of September with needed heavy rainfall and a few toppled trees. Beekeepers reported bees were foraging on goldenrod and other wildflowers although the bloom and nectar supply weren't the best due to the weather. Most beekeepers had finished with honey harvest and had provided supplemental food and water to sustain colonies and build up honey stores for the upcoming winter months. Mites continued to be a sporadic problem and many Beekeepers were applying treatments. Area fairs displayed honey and comb entries with reports that entries were at about average levels. Prices for cartons 12 1-pound containers at the Jessup wholesale market were $\$ 85.00$ per case for wildflower and clover honey.

ALABAMA: Increased precipitation, especially in the northern regions of the state, resulted in most of Alabama experiencing normal ground moisture conditions. The fall nectar flow began, showcasing goldenrod, ironweed, sneezeweed, boneset, and partridge pea in many locations. Many beekeepers performed varroa mite treatments and fed colonies with sugar syrup, especially during the early part of September. High numbers of small hive beetles were reported. Many beekeeper clubs met in person, including for the state beekeepers' association annual meeting during the middle of the month.

ARIZONA: Thanks to an extended monsoon season, severe drought was limited to roughly 20 percent of the state of Arizona by late September. The extended season continued to improve forage growth and range conditions for bees in the southcentral part of the state.

In the northeastern part of the state, spotty rains helped to improve soil and rangeland conditions. Earlier in the month, heavy rains caused flash flood events on rangelands and affected alfalfa production.

Forage growth for bees was also affected by cooler night temperatures by mid- September. In the north central and southeastern part of the state, low temperatures below 60 degrees Fahrenheit were reported.

ARKANSAS: During the month of September temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation during September was below normal across most of the same area. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Arkansas had moderate drought conditions to an area of extreme drought across the center of the state.

No supply chain issues reported. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.
CALIFORNIA: Extreme heat and scarcity of forage made for a tough September for California bees. "September was not favorable to the bees," one beekeeper said. "The extreme heat did weaken many hives as the queens had quit laying eggs. Then as it cooled, we treated for mites, and that further weakened those colonies".

Another beekeeper noted that the summer honey flow in the Central Valley, primarily from cotton and alfalfa, was over by mid-September. Other than "a meager amount" of tarweed in some Sierra Nevada foothill areas of Central California, there was little forage for the bees by the end of the month. As a result, toward late September beekeepers invested heavily in supplemental feeding, including sugar syrup and frozen patties. Some say that has helped improve conditions for colonies as winter approaches.

Also, as heat subsides, plants are responding with fresh growth and bloom. Colonies continue to brood up.
Honey markets ranged from $\$ 2.50$ to $\$ 3.00$ per pound and higher, depending on color and quality, but there was little to sell due to the ongoing drought. Some beekeepers have been reserving honey only for longtime customers. Meanwhile, the same drought that has strengthened honey markets could weaken fees for almond pollination, which in recent years has become a crucial source of revenue for beekeepers. "Almond pollination demand is expected to be somewhat lower this coming year as additional acreage is projected to be pulled due to lack of irrigation water, although it is too early to tell how severe the water cutbacks will be next year," a beekeeper said. Some beekeepers had already begun offering discounts to almond growers to secure contracts early on. "We will see in the coming months where the pollination prices go," a beekeeper said. "I suspect that beekeepers will have to settle for fewer dollars this year."

FLORIDA: The month began with slightly higher temperatures than normal and variable amounts of rain mainly depending upon the path of afternoon thunderstorms. Bees were returning from the Dakotas and other northern areas in preparation for the beginning of Brazilian Pepper bloom around the middle of the month. Beekeepers were finishing mite treatments, and everything was going as planned. Then over the period of a few days just past the middle of the month, it became apparent that Florida was likely to be struck by a potential major Category 4 hurricane. The impact to Florida was devastating. Rainfall amounts for most of the state were much above normal in most areas because of the arrival of Hurricane Ian. The Panhandle area was the only part of Florida that did not receive excessive rainfall. After making landfall on September 28th around the Fort Myers area, Ian tracked to the northeast and exited the state near the Kennedy Space Center on September 29th. Most areas directly in the storms' path received 10-20 inches of rain. Other parts of the state, except for the Panhandle, received 3-10 inches of rain or even locally higher amounts. Flooding from rainfall was a major issue in most of the state because of the generally flat topography in Florida. Storm surge in many locations also contributed to massive amounts of water accumulating, even in inland areas. Wind damage, especially on the barrier islands and the Fort Myers area was severe. Other areas further from the storm also experience major wind damage to property and crops. The storm track of Ian through Southwest and Central Florida affected many hives and beekeepers with both wind and flood damage to hives and potential food sources. Further south of the main storm track in the Immokalee and adjoining areas beekeepers gather between mid-September and mid-October each year to split hives which requires many new queens. This area of Florida becomes a nursery for the creation of new hives. These hives are created here not only for Florida beekeepers, but beekeepers from many other states. This area is home to large amounts of Brazilian Pepper which normally blooms during this time frame providing ample nutrition for the hives. Flooding from Ian was severe in this area. Honey that had not been pulled yet was lost as well as potentially thousands of hives. Some beekeepers are presently estimating their hive losses between $33 \%$ and as high as $100 \%$. It will take some time to get an accurate assessment of losses in Florida since flooding continued for days after the storm and water and wind damage from the storm was widespread. More accurate storm damage estimates should be available by next month.

GEORGIA: August was fairly wet but then came September with a drought. Some beekeepers had a lighter crop this year in the southern areas but up in the north the Sourwood honey came out with good volume and quality to balance out the south areas. Cotton growing areas had the most problem with collecting this year and as the nectar was getting ready a chance rain would wash it out. Treatments for mites have kept the bees in fairly good shape for Fall. Sales are doing well for the commercial sellers and about average for the retail sellers and that should change as the holiday months appear. $\$ 2.75 \mathrm{lb}$ for bulk baker grade honey

IDAHO, COLORADO, UTAH: During the month of September temperatures were a little above normal across all Western and Eastern Idaho. Utah had temperatures that were above normal across the entire state. Colorado had temperatures that were normal across the entire state. Precipitation during September was below average for Utah, Precipitation was below average for western Idaho, eastern Idaho saw a little below average precipitation. Western Colorado saw precipitation that was above normal. Eastern Colorado saw precipitation that was normal for September.

In Idaho harvest is almost done or already done for some producers and most of them say it was an average crop or lower than average crop this year. A couple producers have said they already have had to start feeding their bees this year but other than that the hives have been healthy.

Utah harvest is pretty much done for all producers and most of them say their hives have been looking healthy, but it was a little below average crop except for a couple smaller producers say they got a bigger crop than last year. The late rain Utah has gotten this fall has helped the bees with gathering honey for the winter.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in September Idaho had abnormally dry soil in the panhandle and moderate dry soil to severe drought in the rest of the state, with a small patch of extreme drought. Utah is currently under severe to exceptional drought conditions with most of the state under extreme dry soil conditions. The whole state of Colorado is between no dry soil to severe drought with most of the state under abnormally dry soil to moderately dry soil.

Prices for the month of September were between $\$ 2.60$ and $\$ 3.20$ per pound with a mostly price of $\$ 2.80-\$ 3.00$ for Idaho, Colorado prices are too few producers reporting to determine a market. Prices for locally sourced honey in Utah are $\$ 2.80-\$ 3.00$ per pound with mostly $\$ 2.80$.

ILLINOIS: Temperatures for the month of September were normal with a lack of rainfall. Beekeepers are checking for mites. Most beekeepers report that their bees are in good to excellent condition. Beekeepers also report a little bit of foliage for their bees to feed on, such as goldenrod and aster. Beekeepers say there has been very little production in September. Comb honey is still in demand. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.

INDIANA: Temperatures for the month of September were in line with the historical average. Rainfall in most parts of the state was below average for this time of the year. Beekeepers report that their bees continue to feed on foliage, such as alfalfa, clover and goldenrod, and have pollen, but no nectar. Beekeepers report their bees in good condition and that they have a healthy population. Beekeepers report low mite counts and have begun treatment with oxalic acid. Beekeepers have started supplemental feeding of the bees. Beekeepers say there has been very little production in September. Prices are generally unchanged.

IOWA, KANSAS, MISSOURI, NEBRASKA: No report issued.
KENTUCKY: As summer slides into fall, beekeepers have been able to harvest honey in pleasant temperatures. Some have sold their honey at the Kentucky State Fair at market Value. Although the numbers are preliminary, sales for this year at the KY State Fair seem about the same as the sales in 2019 (pre-pandemic) at approximately $\$ 61 \mathrm{k}$ in gross totals before paybacks to beekeepers, expenses, etc.

This summer, there has been a plethora of goldenrod species as well as asters, ironweeds, bonesets and yarrows. Syricias and ragweeds are in full bloom.

To date, no cases of diseases although small hive beetles continue to be a problem because of excessively high temperatures. However, given that some apiaries were affected by EKY flooding, there may be some hives that will become sick later in the winter. The beekeepers almost certainly cannot harvest honey if their hives are on surface mine sites.

Beekeepers are doing their best to prep hives for winter clusters.
LOUISIANA: During the month of September temperatures were about normal across most of the state. Precipitation was well below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, Louisiana had abnormally dry to moderate drought conditions across most of the state.

No supply chain issues reported. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.
MICHIGAN: No report issued.
MINNESOTA: During the month of September temperatures were normal across the entire state. Precipitation in September was lower than normal for the entire state.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, in September the entire north end of the state of Minnesota had no dry soil and the south end of the state is mostly moderate dry soil to no dry soil with a small patch of severe dry soil.

Producers are done harvesting this year and say they had an average harvest and things are looking better than they did last year with overall health and harvest. A couple producers are saying they are feeding their bees right now because their fall crop isn't adding up to very much so far. Prices per pound in Minnesota were $\$ 2.80-\$ 3.75$ with mostly price of $\$ 2.80-\$ 3.00$ for locally sourced honey for the month of September.

MISSISSIPPI: September was wetter than most areas surrounding the state and the beekeepers were able to finish pulling honey before the Fall season gets ready. Most are treating their hives regularly each month and losses are about normal. Sales and demand are moderate and steady, but interest will increase for the holidays.

MONTANA: No report issued.
NEW ENGLAND: No report issued.
NEW YORK: The autumn equinox heralded much cooler wetter weather; soil conditions good in most of the state, with the northwest region, the Hudson valley and Long Island still having dry conditions. While it did extend the growing season a bit, the much-needed rain came too late - the Fall honey flow did not meet expectations. The honey production season has come to a close. The bees are moving honey down into the lower boxes of the hives and
backfilling the reduced brood areas. Beekeepers are beginning to feed hives and preparing for winter. Honey demand remains strong with prices tending upwards.

## NORTH CAROLINA: No report issued.

NORTH \& SOUTH DAKOTA: Warmer weather continued while topsoil and subsoil moisture were generally adequate all around. Harvest advanced and most commodities were near average but most were behind last year's early harvest. Harvest wound down for most commodities as the month progressed and moisture availability ranged from fair to good. By the end of the month harvest for most commodities was complete or nearly so.

OHIO: The weather in Ohio was typical for September, normal rain falls and temperatures in the low 80s. Nectar flow was above normal, continuing the good 2022 honey flow. The soil has plenty of moisture helping flowers to produce both nectar and pollen. The golden rod flow has been excellent, Ohio has 13 different types of golden rod. Those areas that have wingstem and boneset had a good flow of both nectar and pollen. Common white aster and New England aster are in bloom presently. Ohio has 404 different types of soil, those areas that had glacial ice during the ice ages produce the most honey. Beekeepers this year have several different flavors of honey to sell from the many nectar flows. The price of honey is stable: Wholesale is 5.50 to 6.50 per pound, retail is 8.50 to 10.50 per pound.

OKLAHOMA: During the month of September temperatures were well above normal across most of the state. Precipitation was below normal across the state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, there was extreme to exceptional drought conditions across most of the state.

Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.
OREGON: No report issued.
SOUTH CAROLINA: No report issued.
TENNESSEE: September in Tennessee has been hot for most of the state. The main sources of pollen and nectar were goldenrod and aster. It appears that the stat is having a better than average fall flow. There have not been any significant pest or disease issues reported in September. Beekeepers are reporting a range of $\$ 10.00$ to $\$ 15.00$ per pound at retail sales. Honey container availability and price continue to be the main supply chain issue heard from beekeepers. This is also driving the price of honey up.

TEXAS: During the month of September temperatures were consistently well above normal across the state. Precipitation during September was again well below normal across the entire state. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor website, soil moisture conditions for September showed soil moisture conditions from moderate to exceptional drought conditions across the state. Texas needs rain for an extended period. The showers that are popping up help where they fall but do not last long enough to stifle the drought that plagues the state currently.
Truck availability is not an issue, currently, due to lack of supplies. Too few prices exist to establish a current market price for wholesale white honey.
WASHINGTON: Dry and hot conditions began September. Soft fruit and berry harvest wound down seasonally. Along with summer fruit, summer vegetable harvest was completed or winding down. Harvest of fall crops, such as apples, pears, hops, and other fall fruit and vegetables continued in full swing. The apple and pear harvest was off to a slow start but picked as the month went on and nights began to cool off.

WISCONSIN: According to a few of the beekeepers, temperatures for the month of September were mild and rainfall was above normal for the state of Wisconsin. Beekeepers have begun combating mites with miticidal strips and oxalic acid. They report a normal, healthy population of bees. Beekeepers report wild foliage for their bees and aster is the most prominent. They have begun supplemental feeding of the bees. Very little production is reported. Demand for honey is good at the retail level and fairly good at the wholesale level. Prices are generally unchanged.
