"With Grace or a Race ?"

This question is appearing more often in National Square Dance Publications. A wider interpretation would be: Is competition for the advanced dance levels and greater dancing skills replacing to some degree the gracefulness and sense of balance that has always been a part of the fun of square dancing? If we have asked this question of ourselves in the last few years, it is of some comfort to learn that it is also a concern elsewhere in the national Square Dance community.

Some of the questions asked are:

- 1- When dancers move to Plus I, Plus 2 and Advanced Levels, is it necessary to replace hand holds with touch gestures to gain speed? Thus the expression, are we dancing with grace or going to a race? Firm hand holds are very much a part of square dancing, to permit balance and counterbalance of dancers with each other in forward and back movement.
- 2- Why use an arm-waist circular walk-around in place of a do si do when it often puts you in a wrong position for the next Call?

 Another area of concern is as follows:

After a few years of Square Dancing, many dancers are ready to move to the more challenging levels. There is therefore a need for Clubs that can provide these levels. But what about the other end of the spectrum, namely dancers who enjoy dancing at Extended Bascis, Mainstream and Q.S.? If all clubs move the dance level to Plus I, Plus 2 and Advanced at the same time, what is to become of these dancers? Are there enough Extended Basics, Mainstream and QS Clubs available for those who want to dance at these levels? Also, there has to be a place where new Graduates can be comfortable. They are the nucleus of future Plus I, Plus 2 and Advanced dancers.

No matter which level we dance at, let us all make a concerted effort to get the feel of smooth dancing.

GARDEN STATE SQUARE DANCE CAMPERS





This column is presented by the Koveds to start the dancers thinking, and develop and encourage input into their committee.

" BACK TO BASICS"

by Harriette & Sol Koved

Somehow we have lost track of the number of figures which compose the current "basic" group — it seems to vary from year to year and from place to place. Nor does the composition remain the same because certain figures which were considered basic at the time that we took lessons are today recognized only by challenge dancers. Funny how things change.

The fact that more than a dozen years ago dancers enjoyed themselves with far fewer calls afforded the square dance movement the time to concentrate on things which were then considered to be fundemental. Since that time these characteristics have become submerged, if not totally disappeared.

Good humor - friendliness - inclusiveness - these were all traits which our teachers and leaders taught both by personal example and conscious indoctrination. The fact is, the people who are attracted to S/D-

activity generally have these desirable traits. If they didn't have the temperment at the outset, they sure did learn through the outpouring of genuine, unselfish devotion by the angels who helped them through the prescribed lessons.

For some reason these basics of human behavior fail to stay with some dancers who reach the clubs and dance regularly. To soon they forget the assist that they received. too soon are they unwilling to support a club by being an officer. Too soon do they aspire to higher levels and abandon the clubs to which square dancing owes its very existance. (continued on page 44)







When the NNJRDLC was born in '63, Bob & Jean were valuable & concerned members helping guide it thru those first bumbling years- serving as moderators in '71-'72. In '74, the year CCNJ was conceived, Bob's versatility & vast background was very much in evidence as CCNJ gradually weathered growing pains & developed into a viable organization. Bob served as president in '77-'78.

After retirement Bob was able to devote more time not only to his regular clubs, but also develop a program for Senior Citizens & others, as well as do some choreography -"Easter Parade" & "Spanish Serenade".

A member of CALLERLAB, Bob worked extensively to promote S/Ding "for its fun, for its recreation, for its friendship". This is the legacy Bob left. People like Bob Kellogg come along once in a person's lifetime. Truly Bob is one of those who touched the lives of many with happiness & friendship. Our entire area extends its sympathies to Jean & family.



In 1958 six couples showing concern over the need for a good promotional program, clearance conflicts, classes, summer dance opportunities instigated a plan of action. 11 clubs sent delegates to a meeting from which the NNJ-SDA was born. We are still following many of their original directives.

Then, as now, delegates had the responsibility of presenting their clubs viewpoints at meeting & of keeping their club informed of activities within the Ass'n. In 1959, as a further means of communication between the widely scattered clubs, GRAND SOLIARE was created. Now 35 clubs strong, & still growing, NNJSDA is proud of its accomplishments & constantly works to improve & expand the S/D activity. Club dues are minimal with almost all of the income derived from its dance program. Monies are expended on printed/ promotional materials for clubs & services (e.g. classes, Singles Club formation, Leadership Seminar-LUST, Drop Out Program-Catch All Eights, etc.).

? other organizations share our concern - The NNJ Liaison is an active member of the NNJRDLeaders Council who meet quarterly to exchange information, plan specials & select ROMs. The Callers Council of NJ (Reardons are Liaison) meets monthly to improve knowledge & techniques of its members. 





A Couple of Clever Ideas from the SQUARE PINCUSHION




First, a most unusual and clever idea from Anne Sorenson from Country Promenaders. Ann's idea is to get the most mileage from each outfit as possible so make a love-

So, the health of the square dance movement is a direct reflection of the basic response of all dancers to nuture the new people who annually enter the activity - those who are now entering class, those who graduated last Spring and those who never seem to get the hang of it but do want to participate.

How do you answer the following questions?

Do you consciously seek out weaker dancers to insure that they improve their abilities? And feel included? Of an evening do you try to dance with as many different people as possible? Do you make visitors feel welcome? Do you dance at many clubs other than your own?

Each of the foregoing involves one or more basics of square dancing. To partially repay the tremendous dividend that you have received from square dancing -- smile and be friendly. Join us in the movement Back to Basics.

QUARTERLY SELECTION COMMITTEE reports...

The International Association of Square Dance Callers

For the quarter beginning July 1, two calls have been selected.

TRACK & TRADE written by Ed Fraidenburg in 1976 (also rewritten by Ron Schneider in '78 as Launch It) - Starting from columns: Lead two dancers Promenade around the outside as in TRACK II; trailing two dancers Extend to a Half Tag Formation and TRADE, ends in two faced lines.

MAKE ME A COLUMN by Dick Bayer - Starts from two faced lines: Centers facing in step forward and walk straight ahead to become lead dancer in column, Ends facing in follow along behind to become Number two dancer in column, Centers facing out turns towards the center and falls in behind end who was facing in and follows to become Number three dancer in the column while the ends facing out turn towards the centers and follow the adjacent center to become the number four dancer in the column. (ends in right or left hand column depending on starting two faced lines).

At its 6th International Convention last spring, CALLERLAB members took several significant actions — revision of Mainstream program and the Quarterly Selections List with a minor revision to Plus I list; clarified definitions for basics 39 thru 69; and passed a resolution on dance level clarification".....that members call movements within the advertised/designated plateau & use calls from any plateau other than that which was designated, and/or any unlisted experimental, only after walking or workshopping that call, & be it resolved that conducting a designated level workshop shall mean, workshopping the calls listed for that plateau." They also discussed = styling and smooth dancing; bridging the gap from class to club; creative choreography with sessions on one night stands, contras, note series, women callers, callers' partner, formation definitions & teaching & traditional dancing.
