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### 2019 Annual Report of Region VII

#### I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The National Telecommunications Commission Region VII is committed to achieve its target for the year 2019. The agency has been proactive and constantly creates a responsive regulatory agency that ensures the welfare and rights of our stakeholders. As a government regulatory agency, NTC 7 worked together in 2019 in implementing its regulations, in issuing permits and licenses to its clients. The Consumers' Welfare and Protection unit of the agency also improved its services by having faster resolution of complaints received and facilitates immediately the needs of the clients through timely resolution and prompt actions.

The regional office had been a consistent partner with other local government agencies and private sectors in various activities within the region, especially in major events like the Sinulog Mardi Gras and the Fluvial Procession. We have also worked and collaborated in various activities with other organizations and agencies like the Office of Civil Defense (OCD), National Economic Authority (NEDA), Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), Philippine Cost Guard (PCG), Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT), Philippine National Police (PNP), The Federation of Volunteers through Radio Communications (FVRC) and others. As support to DICT's Activities, NTC Regional Director was one on the resource speaker during the DICT Information Caravan, with the theme: Bridging Disaster Response, Advancing ICT Capabilities where he imparted to the audience the importance on these information and communications technologies in saving life during disasters. NTC 7 also participated during the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter Full Council Meeting of the RDRRMC (Regional Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council).

To improve and strengthen the efficiency and the performance of its employees, personnel were sent to trainings and seminars relative to their field of work; allowed to participate in activities that will enhance their skills and improve their self-esteem. Gender and Development (GAD) activities and seminars were also conducted to increase awareness and to strengthen their understanding on current gender issues and concerns. Women employees were empowered and were sent to trainings as well. The region has also participated in the 18-day campaign on Anti Violence Against Women and Their Children Act of 2004.

In accomplishing the set targets, the agency conducted strategic planning sessions to come up with a good roadmap to meet the goals and objectives for the year 2019. Assessments were conducted monthly to keep track of the agency's accomplishments, and to provide solutions to deficiencies and shortcomings in the performance of duties and responsibilities and to motivate each other in order to achieve the targets.

#### **II. PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS**

- 1.) NTC took part during the grandest celebration in Cebu which is the fiesta celebration of Sr. Sto. Niño de Cebu held every January of the year. The major activities in the fiesta celebration aside from the daily novena masses were the Fluvial Procession, Foot Procession and the Sinulog Grand Parade. Our regional office in coordination with Cebu City government and the Philippine National Police and other organizations helped in the success of these activities. We partnered with the Federation of Volunteers through Radio Communications (FVRC) in ensuring the smooth flow of the activity and in securing the safety of the spectators, participants, and devotees thru radio communications.
- 2.) Attendance of NTC VII personnel to conferences and trainings conducted by their respective professional associations and groups. Engineers of this regional office were sent to Iloilo City last May 2019 to participate in the IECEP 69<sup>th</sup>National Midyear Convention 2019 of the Institute of Electronics Engineers of the Philippines, Inc. with the Theme: "IECEP @ 69: Bigger. Bolder.Stronger". Other personnel were also sent trainings relative to their field of work and professions. Seminar on Public Service Continuity Plan Orientation Seminar was also conducted by the offices which were attended by all personnel of this regional office.
- 3.) In compliance with RA 9710 otherwise known as Magna Carta for Women where Gender and Development were given focus, the office to support its mandate conducted variety of activities to enhance awareness and to support GAD advocacy. The agency participated in the annual celebration of Women's Month in March. Establish a GAD Corner and always included the Gender and Development agenda and information drive during the RLMOP/SROP and other seminars facilitated by the region. The conduct of GAD Orientation and awareness for NTC 7 employees were also conducted annually to increase awareness and to support women empowerment. The active participation of the employees of the regional office in the once a month wearing of the Purple Shirt to show the agency's support to End VAW (Violence Against Women) Campaign. The agency's attribution to GAD had reached ₱1,374,575.05 which is more than the 5% required on its budget.


#### **OPERATIONAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

# A. PERFORMANCE (TARGET VS. ACCOMPLISHMENT)

The year 2019 had been a good year for NTC VII in terms of achieving the Physical Targets. The agency was able to surpass the set targets, for the number of licenses, permits, registrations and certificates issued; NTC VII had accomplished a total of 70,257 which is 59% higher than set target of 44,289 for 2019. For the number of frequency channels assignments made, there were4,896 frequencies assigned which is 14% over target. In strengthening the inspection of radio station licenses, NTC VII had inspected 15,177 units which were41% higher than the set target of 10,741 units which translate to the number of administrative cases disposed which reached 185 cases which were 70% higher than the year's target.


**Graph Showing the Target vs. Actual Accomplishment for 2019** 

NTC VII had surpassed the set physical targets as well as the financial target for 2019. As part of the NTC's function, in 2019 NTC VII had monitored 14,472 radio communications frequency channels.


In providing service to our clients, the following activities were conducted such as Mobile Licensing, RLMOP and SROP Seminars, and Seminars to Students having their educational tour in the office. The office were able to conduct 98 times RLMOP/SROP/Student Seminars all throughout the year including that of the two field offices in Tagbilaran City, Bohol and in Dumaguete City, Negros Oriental. The total number of participants had reached to 3,218.

The consumer welfare and protection services of NTC VII received various complaints and lost cellphone blocking request. A total of 1,971 lost cellular phones blocking requests were catered in 2019 and 162 various complaints were also addressed which includes poor service complaints on telecommunications provider, text spam and scam, complaints on malicious text and request on TOA (Tape on Air) and other various complaints which were all acted upon within the prescribed time.

The region was able to collect ₱169,986,206.00 pesos for 2019 which is 69% higher than set target for the year which is only P100,691,981.25. Comparing to 2018's income of ₱130,462,496.80, the income generated for 2019 is 30% higher compared to last year.



NTC 7's commitment in reaching the targets set for 2019 only showed that the agency is really serious in achieving the physical targets as well as the financial targets for 2019. This symbolizes that when we all work together as a team, we can always achieve great things.


# IV. STATISTICAL ANALYSIS OF ACCOMPLISHMENT (FY 2018 VS. 2019)

To determine how NTC 7 performed in 2019 compared to 2018, the accomplishments of said years were matched. The result of the comparison showed that 2019hadimprovedin achieving the set target and accomplishment compared to 2018. On the number of licenses, permits, registrations and certificates issued, from 65,460 issued in 2018 to 70,257 issued in 2019 which is 7% higher than last year. For the number of frequency channel assignments made, there was a 12% increase in 2019 at 4,896 compared to 4,360 in 2018. The number of inspection and investigation conducted in 2018 was only 14,575 compared to 15,177inspections in 2019 which is 4% higher compared to the previous year. The number of administrative cases disposed also increased in 2019 which total to 449 compared to 406 cases in 2018 which is 11% higher compared to last year's output. The number of frequency channels monitored had a slight decreased in terms of percentage at 3% from 14,960 frequency channels in 2018 to 14,472 channels monitored in 2019. In relation to its Consumer Welfare and Protection Service, OSPAC concerns / complaints received regarding cellphone blocking, text spam and scam, malicious text, TOA (Tape on Air) and other various complaints which totaled to 162 various complaints received in 2019 and bulk of the request by OSPAC received for 2019 was on lost or stolen phones (Phone Blocking) request which reached to 1,971 request while there were only 1,986 total OSPAC assistance request in 2018.




