Nawakwa Wins National **Awards**

Mike White, the SR7A Section Advisor announced that Nawakwa Lodge 3 of the Heart of Virginia Council will be receiving both the E. Urner Goodman Camping Award and the National Service Award for 2012. These awards are presented to two lodges in each region annually and it is rare for a lodge to receive both awards in the same year.



The E. Urner Goodman Camping Award has been a tribute and testimony to the Order's founder since 1969. Its purpose is to encourage and challenge Order of the Arrow members and lodges to increase their effectiveness in promoting and increasing Scout camping in each council. The other recipient for 2012 from the Southern Region will be Quapaw Lodge of the Quapaw Area Council in Little Rock, Arkansas. Nawakwa previously won this award in 1980, 2000 and 2010.

Since 1999, the National Service Award recognizes lodges in each region that have performed outstanding service, in a qualitative and a quantitative sense, to their council. The National Service Award petition is submitted along with the lodge recharter application. The other Southern Region recipient for 2012 will be Mikanakawa Lodge of the Circle Ten Council Dallas, Texas. Nawakwa previously won this award in 2007 and 2009.



These recognitions will be presented to Nawakwa at the upcoming BSA National Meeting in Grapevine, Texas, during the Southern Region Luncheon and Award Ceremony.

Congratulations to Lodge Chief Marc Reiner, Lodge Adviser Mack Ruffin, Staff Adviser Mic Mullins and all of Nawakwa Lodge Arrowmen for this outstanding recognition and on a job well done! Visit the museum to see the awards.



NAWAKWA TRAIL CREW



The fourth year of the Nawakwa Trail Crew kicked off over the April 5–7, 2013 weekend and brought the Lodge's service home to the Heart of Virginia Council at our own Albright Scout Reservation (ASR). The initial goal at ASR is to create a five mile loop hiking tail with a handicap accessible Adirondack shelter at the beginning.

When Arrowmen arrived Friday evening everyone registered, set up camp, got the required tool safety brief and were treated to a wonderful Cracker Barrel prepared by our fantastic crew in the Bear and Antelope Cafe.

Saturday morning saw everyone awaken to the wonderful aromas signaling a great breakfast which was enjoyed by all. After a Trail Crew opening ceremony, individual crews were briefed on their group's assignments and the days work got underway. Unlike the work on the Washington/Jefferson trail, the terrain at ASR is relatively level, making the task of building trails somewhat easier.

Joining the Nawakwa Trail Crew for the first time was the Trail Crew mascot, Arrow. The friendly dog was seen throughout the project site and enjoyed the great weekend weather.

Lunch was eaten on the trail with lunch bags given to everyone before setting out in the morning. Work on the trail and the shelter continued in the afternoon until it was time to head back to camp to clean up for the day.

Trail Crew participants were treated to a hearty dinner before being treated to a lively performance by the local band Sunbox. Saturday Cracker Barrel followed before everyone headed to their tents for a well deserved sleep.

Sunday saw a fine breakfast and a half day of service before it was time to depart.

The Trail crew was able to get a great start on the loop trail and the foundation for the shelter has been set. More work on the shelter is scheduled to get it completed this year.




