Remember Using Carbon Paper?

Using carbon paper between two blank sheets of paper for many years was the only process by which to make copies of a typed or hand-written document. Anyone who has used carbon paper knows how messy it can be. Another NCR inventor to the rescue!

Microencapsulation involves encapsulating a liquid or solid into tiny capsules where it is contained for later release. An inventor at NCR, Barrett Green, used this method to produce the first carbonless paper. The back of the top sheet of paper was coated with microcapsules filled with an ink-like fluid. The second page was blank. Pressure from writing or typing on the first page broke the microcapsules, leaving an imprint on the second page. The patent for this process was granted in July, 1955. Carbonless paper became a must in the business world and was the duplication method of choice until its usefulness was diminished by the copy machine and later the computer printer. Today, 55 years later, carbonless paper is still in demand -- especially for forms.

The next application for microencapsulation was scratch-and-sniff advertisements. Greeting card use would soon follow. Here's how it works. When a person scratches the card, the capsules break down, releasing whatever odor is contained within. The first use of the scratch-and-sniff process was a cooperative program between NCR and the Dayton Power & Light Company. To educate the public on how to recognize gas leaks, DP&L mailed these cards to each of its customers. When customers scratched the cards, they quickly learned how to identify the smell of natural gas.

Later, the use of microencapsulation that had the greatest impact on society was time-released medication. This is where aspirin and other medicines were enclosed in special microcapsules, which included a shell through which the medicine is slowly released instead of all at once. Eventually, the process was adapted for use in many other products, including detergents, baking products, and even the ever popular Mood Ring.

Working Conditions Under Close Scrutiny

When Mr. Patterson purchased the National Manufacturing Company in 1884, one of his first tasks was to improve working conditions for his factory employees.

In the factory, the very first day, he had all production stopped and had the employees clean their tools and their work areas. The men complained that the drinking water was bad, so he purchased earthen crocks and kept them filled with lemonade. Other changes led to a model manufacturing factory of the day.

Even after the move to the new factory, new problems in employee relations presented themselves. In 1892, cash registers on a \$50,000 order were returned to the factory because of mechanical defects. Said Mr. Patterson, "It was all in the attitude of the employees; they had no heart in their job." He admitted that even with the many changes he had made, while he was busy building the sales organization, he had not spent enough time on the factory. He moved his desk into the factory and began to find out what was wrong. He soon discovered problem conditions, many of which he thought had been corrected before the move to the new location. Mr. Patterson found he was losing skilled workers for no apparent reason. Lighting and ventilation were poor: the plant was dingy and unsanitary; there was a lack safety features. He realized, "You can buy head power and hand power, but not heart power; that must be earned." He set about earning his employees' hearts by making changes to the working conditions and by establishing benefit programs which he placed under the heading, "Welfare Work."

Next, in an upcoming 2011 newsletter, we'll discuss Mr. Patterson's "Welfare Work" programs, many of which were "first" in the Manufacturing Industry.

RECAP OF THE THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REA MEETING FESTIVITIES, SEPTEMBER 2010

The thirteenth annual NCR REA meeting was held on Thursday, September 23, 2010 at the NCR Country Club. This year, 110 people attended, which is 20 more than in 2009.

Of the 95 people who stayed for lunch, 17 participated in a post-luncheon tour of the NCR Archives (Downtown Dayton), and 13 competed in the annual putting contest (see winners on page 6). You could say it was a fabulous afternoon filled with fun and camaraderie.

Informative Presentations

After REA President Gordon Meister's eloquent introduction and State of the REA, attendees were privileged to hear from two guest speakers, including Bruce Langos, Chief Operating Officer, Teradata Corporation, and Richard Arnold, Vice President, Global Field Marketing, NCR Corporation.

Mr. Langos had over 30 years of service with NCR before joining Teradata during the spinoff in 2007, and also shared with us how proud he is of his father who worked at NCR for 40 years! During his presentation, he shared some very compelling information. For example:



- Gartner Group has named Teradata the leading provider of Data Warehousing solutions.
- Teradata is the last remaining "independent" Data Warehousing company.
- They maintain over 1000 customers and 7000 employees worldwide with no outsourcing.
- The company has no debt, and maintains significant cash reserves.
- Company officials anticipate 30-33% growth over the next five years.

Currently, the company is constructing a two-building complex just south of Dayton and plans to stay in the Dayton area.

Mr. Arnold's presentation covered NCR's position in its traditional retail and financial markets, both of which remain strong despite the current economy. In addition, the company is focusing considerable attention on fast-growing markets like transportation, hospitality, medicine, entertainment, and gaming. Because of the continuing growth in all areas of consumer activity, NCR is now focusing a lot of marketing research on its customers' customers.



Because Mr. Arnold started his NCR career in the Dayton sales office, he expressed his pride in NCR's history as a Dayton-based company. He also indicated that photos and other historical items are prominently displayed in the company's new Georgia facilities, and that considerable information on NCR's history and legacy is included in the orientation material provided to new hires.

Following the presentations, Mr. Meister announced the REA's appreciation for three retiring trustees, and announced nominations for four new trustees. For complete details, photos, and bios, see page 8.

As a major highlight of the meeting, we announced that an NCR REA reunion will be held in Dayton, OH on **September 22 & 23, 2011**. Although complete reunion details will be provided in upcoming newsletters, please plan NOW to be with us next year!!!! We hope you can make this grand event!

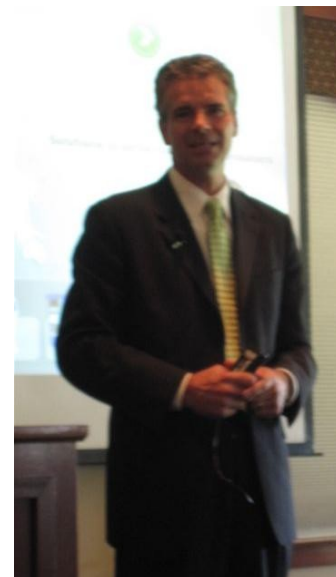

During the proceedings at the Annual NCR REA meeting in September, REA President, Gordon Meister, announced the retirement of three trustees, including: **Peg Butts** (six years service), **Jim Carroll** (three years service), and **Howard Reams** (three years service). Mr. Meister recognized the retired trustees with much congratulations, then presented them with gifts of appreciation. Next, Mr. Meister presented and inducted the NCR REA's four new trustees. Following are their profiles. **WELCOME GENTLEMEN!**

Lew Cluxton started with NCR in June, 1951. He began in the Overseas Department, working in the Overseas Sales Promotion for Accounting Machines, and later for Electronic computers, including 304, 315, 390 and 449. He became Manager of 390 sales for International Division. Later, he was appointed Regional Coordinator for marketing efforts in Latin America, and served as Director of Operations and Administration for the Latin America Region. Lew's last assignment was in Product Management, covering the product launch of the Decision Mate computer line. Lew retired from NCR in March, 1985.

Greg Jump started his NCR career in late 1976. He began in the CI/MEG marketing division of what was then the United States Data Processing Group (USDPG). From 1980 - 1992, Greg worked in the Field Support and Customer Services divisions, supporting operating systems software on a variety of NCR computer systems. From 1992 - 2000, he managed the Dayton Operating Systems Support group and helped turn out the lights on operations at the NCR Technical Education Center near the Dayton Mall. From 2001 - 2002, he worked in the Worldwide Customer Services Process Quality Management organization. Finally, from 2003 - 2010, he worked for the Customer Electronic Interface group, which was responsible for establishing data connections to customers, subcontractors, and business partners. After 34 years, Greg ended his NCR career on March 31, 2010.

Charlie McGratty joined NCR in 1971 as a computer salesman in the Queens branch office. He worked as an Account Manager and District Manager in Long Island, New York City, and Newark, NJ until he transferred to Dayton in 1985. In Dayton, he worked for Hugh Lynch's General Systems Division as the Program Director for Unix systems. He chaired the Unix Resource Team and was very involved with the NCR Tower family of systems. Following a year on loan to the Europe Group as Marketing Director for ITX systems, Charlie transferred to E&M Columbia in 1988 as Director of Product Management. He returned to Dayton in 1992 as Marketing Manager in the Pacific group. Following the AT&T acquisition, he worked in Worldwide Product Marketing before taking early retirement in 1996. He was the Director of Product Management for Gasper Corporation when NCR acquired that company, and managed both product management and marketing for Gasper until 2004.

Dan Taylor started his NCR career in Dayton on November 25, 1961. He worked in the following organizations: Site Preparation, US Marketing (1961 - 1973); Corporate Real Estate (1973 - 1979); Facilities Planning, US Group (1979 - 1985). In May, 1985, Dan left NCR, then returned in May, 1988. Next, he worked in USG Facilities Planning (1988 - 1994), then in Property Management Services, Corporate (1994 - 1998). In 1998, Dan's job was outsourced, so he retired. He has spent the last 12 years working at NCR as a Property Management contractor.

Cash Registers and other Artifacts Galore!

Needless to say, this place is amazing! What we saw was unbelievable. There were one-of-a-kind cash registers, prototype registers never seen before, used registers that were formerly owned and donated. There were hundreds (maybe even thousands) of old pictures, beautiful men's and women's clothing dating back from the late 1800s and early 1900s -- all retrieved from Moraine Farm and other NCR facilities. We even saw Mr. Patterson's old desk, which was huge, and much much more!

To really grasp all the history this place has to offer, you need to go through the archive multiple times.



Although Mr. Opt conducted a thorough and comprehensive tour augmented by his wealth of knowledge, the details are simply overwhelming and very worth studying!

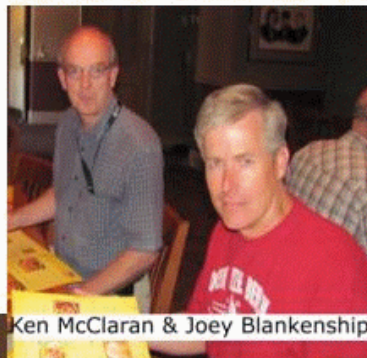

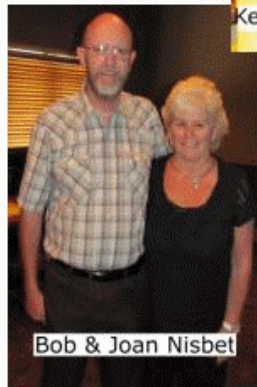

NCR REA RETIREE BECOMES AUTHOR

Tom Fulks has written and published his second book: *HERESY? The Five Lost Commandments*. It is about a graduate school social science seminar where one of the doctoral candidates reveals his epiphany of five commandments that, when added to the Ten Commandments, would constitute natural law for humankind. The other candidates thoroughly research these new commandments and report on whether each is valid or not.



Tom's first book was *UNDER WRAPS: one soldier's hidden diary of WWII* by the late Jay Coffman with Tom Fulks. Coffman was Tom's uncle who kept a diary of his adventures during World War II in the Pacific theater of action. Keeping a diary was a court-martial offense during that war, so Coffman hid the notes containing his diary until after the war. Even then, he only shared the diary with his siblings until his death in 1960 of complications from the malaria he contracted in the war. Fulks discovered the diary in 1999 and researched the information in it until having the book published in 2004. Tom and his wife Barb visited the South Pacific, especially Tonga, to research the diary and take photographs for the book. Tom wrote the Preface, Introduction, footnotes and endnotes, Epilogue, and a section on WWII history—about one-third of the book's text. *UNDER WRAPS* was received with critical acclaim.

Fulks worked at NCR for 40 years, retiring with the group on February 8, 1994. He began his NCR career at the University of Cincinnati work-study program while he earned his degree in Engineering. He spent most of his career in various product-development assignments, including four years at the Clemson facility. Tom also worked for a time in European Marketing, and finished his career in corporate Quality Assurance. He worked with and knew many people at numerous NCR sites.

Fulks has three more books in the works. One is about remarkable figures of the 20th century. Another is about the momentous change in America's culture in 1950. Yet another is a prequel to the current book *HERESY?*

Currently, Tom is recuperating from heart bypass surgery at his home in Sarasota County. His wife, Barbara Fulks, is also an NCR veteran, with over 25 years of service..
