

Dear Friends,

It began with a simple question. The scribe asked "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answered with an equally simple reply: love God with your whole self and love your neighbor as yourself.

Straightforward enough, isn't it. But, then there's that simple sounding phrase that makes all the difference in the world: eternal life. What did *that* mean? Is it about living endlessly...more than 10,000 years, as Amazing Grace tried to guess? Or, is it deeper?

It wasn't the length of days. It was the quality of the life that made *eternal* the significant adjective. Eternal referred to God so eternal life meant God's life. Unlike human lives, which pass away in "seventy years or eighty, if we are strong," as the psalmist wrote, eternal life is always now. "I am who am", God said of himself. It also was creative, powerful, just, merciful, and compassionate.

This was no idle curiosity on the scribe's part. He wanted to know how to live in a way that just doesn't "pass away." He must have already guessed that having things wasn't the answer, nor was having a checklist showing you followed all the dictates of the Law of Moses. They all couldn't be of equal significance. He wanted a life of lasting significance.

Because this was so important to him, the scribe had to ask, "And who is my neighbor?" After telling the story of the Good Samaritan, Jesus then asked the scribe, "Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" Do you hear the shift in perspective in Jesus' reply? It's not who the neighbor was, but who was *neighborly*. Not to whom should I be merciful, but who *was* merciful.

The scribe's reply was meaningful: "The one who treated him with mercy." It must have killed him to answer this way. He had to admit that it wasn't the professional religious people who were in touch with God's life, with eternal life, with merciful life. It was a hated Samaritan, one who didn't even know the Law as the others must have who acted like God.

Jesus' response to the scribe's answer was even more offensive. Jesus urged him to follow the lead of such a man! "Go, and do the same."

To catch how this recommendation must have sounded, imagine if Jesus was speaking with us today. Who do we find offensive? The Samaritan today could easily be someone who is gay; or a Muslim; or a Republican; or a Democrat; a liberal; a conservative; or even a secular atheist. "Go and do the same as one of them," Jesus could say to us.

This parable isn't just telling us to be nice to people in need. It's telling us much more. It's telling us not to think we've got God in a box. He's not going to fit into our preconceived notions, not even those of the Law of Moses. As Jesus says in John's gospel, "The Spirit blows where he wills." He can move even the least thought of by us to do his will.

Once we have the key to knowing what God's life is, what eternal life is, we can then start to look for models to experience his presence. What's the key? It's what Jesus, especially Jesus on that Cross, who shows us – eternal life is self-giving life; it's forgiving life; it's merciful and just life. You can't pin this kind of life down. It appears when we least expect it. It creates itself in whomever it wishes.

Do you want to have eternal life? Of course you do! We all do. Follow Jesus and we'll find him all over the place, for his life can't pass away.

"Jesus said to him, 'Go and do likewise.' " (Luke 10:37)

This was Jesus' command at the end of the Good Samaritan story. But did you know that the Samaritans and Jews despised each other? The moral of the story is to love our neighbor, who may be someone you don't know, someone that looks different than you or someone you don't like, without expecting anything in return.

Love is generous. We have repeatedly said that to love one another, we must first love ourselves. Paul's hymn to love, however, states that love "does not seek its own interest." The Bible makes it clear that generously serving others is far more noble than loving ourselves. Loving ourselves is only important as a psychological prerequisite for being able to love others. Consequently, love can overflow and transcend the demands of justice, expecting nothing in return. "What you received freely, give freely." (Matt 10:8)



# **Online Giving...**

You have the opportunity to make donations to our Sunday collection online! To sign up, go to the St. Anne website – <u>www.stannefairlawnnj.org</u>

#### There are several ways to access the system:

- 1. Underneath the scrolling slideshow on the home page, on the bottom right-hand corner, you will see a light blue icon with a \$ sign. Click that icon to go directly to the system.
- OR
- From the homepage, check the left-hand menu options. The second to last menu option says "envelopes & online giving." Click that link, and a page with various giving options will appear. Select the Online Giving option to be taken directly to the system.

Once you are taken to the new site, click on the section that says <u>Create New Account</u>. Next you will see New User Account Registration. Fill out the form and click "submit."

When you are enrolled, you can go into <u>Manage My Account</u>, where you will see **My Payment Methods**. Here you can choose to have the funds deducted from your checking or bank account (you will need your routing and account numbers on hand). Under <u>Manage My Account</u>, you will also see **Give a New Gift.** There you will decide when and how much to give. (In the list, Offertory Collection means the Sunday collection.) You can select recurring or one time gifts. You also have the option to access all the other special envelopes you would normally find in your envelope packet and which are generally one-time donations.

Each time you go to Mass, get a card that says "I have made my donation online" and put it in the collection when the usher comes around. Thanks so much for giving online!
