Nottinghamshire U3A lecture "U3A – a community asset?" Speaker Alex McMinn, Ormskirk & District & national U3A executive member

I attended this lecture a few weeks ago and thought you might like a summary of what we heard and perhaps it may give you some ideas for the future.

As life expectancy increases our retirement should be enriched by improving well-being in later life. U3A has several aims which help to achieve this: Mental wellbeing, Physical function, Social connectivity and volunteering. Recent research from Bangor University has proven that learning a new instrument, skill or language reduces the onset of dementia by 5 years! Retirement can lead to: Loss of significance – loss of self-worth – loss of self-efficacy, all these can be overcome by Volunteering. The 3rd Aim of U3A is to celebrate the potential of older people, it was suggested we look locally to identify opportunities for our organisation to improve the lives of retired people, to do this we need to identify the skills and experience of members and use them creatively.

Loneliness is a worse health hazard than cancer, diabetes and heart problems combined, the worse time for people is Sunday afternoons. It is suggested we contact the local Older people's champion and organisations, perhaps the local authority, to identify people that would benefit from membership of our organisation. The Ormskirk group got funding to develop tele-links for housebound people and they run poetry groups through Skype, they have a regular column in the 50 plus magazine, they work with government departments, the department of health and local education!

I am not suggesting we follow the very grand route that Ormskirk has taken, but we are struggling to find someone to lead the "Weekenders" group, could this be you? Perhaps we need to leave copies of our newsletter in the local chemist shops or Surgeries? Food for thought, let's all benefit from U3A Volunteering and hopefully use our knowledge and skills to support local people who would also benefit from being a member of Ashfield U3A.
