SECTION ONE – THE BOARD

President's Report



This has been a year of change for Softball New Zealand with the return of the Provincial Championship at the expense of the National Softball League; a change from the Management Support Programme to Regional Game Development Officers; the introduction of a

pitching/catching development programme funded by SPARC; a change in the Men's World crown with the Black Sox achieving a very creditable silver medal.

Discussions still continue over the National League versus the shorter four day tournament concept for our elite players. It is essential that we are all clear on the objectives of our top provincial championship. If it is to provide an opportunity for our top players and promote our sport at the same time, then hosting associations will need to "lift their game" and Softball NZ will need to resource it to a greater level.

The Softball New Zealand Championships are core business and yes, they cost money. However, it is a relatively small percentage when compared to the regional contributions made. It is ultimately the pathway we can provide for our members whether they are coaches, officials, managers players, or host It is also one of the major talent associations. identification opportunities available. I believe these tournaments to be one of the best investments we can make in our sport.

Whilst the disappointment of the men losing their crown last winter remains, the incredible Black Sox mana and history make us all so proud of their achievements. I have no doubt they will come back the stronger in 2013 at North Harbour. Congratulations Eddie and team.

It is timely that SPARC have invested resource into a development programme for our pitchers and catchers for both our men and women – a target area that has been needed for sometime.

The White Sox will have completed their World Championship campaign in Venezuela by the time this report goes to print. These women have made more personal sacrifice, more personal financial contribution than any other senior women's team to leave our shores and represent our sport. My congratulations and thanks go to all and I can only hope the efforts can be translated into results – you deserve them.

In another positive change, it was extremely pleasing to see our Junior Women's team beat Australia in a Test series. This is a first for sometime and very encouraging for the future. Another change is the decision of the International Federation to hold world championships every two years instead of every four years. There are a number of countries that will struggle to sustain entry or be able to host including New Zealand – this could well affect future player availability and should be of serious concern to us as a sport. I urge our delegates to be proactive in establishing a sustainable international model.

National sports administration can be measured by the strength and success of its' regional members and the successful delivery of programmes. This requires a strong communication ethos regardless of size and a strong desire to find solutions to meet actual needs. Rarely will there be a "one size fits all" solution. I firmly believe this will be even more important as we move into a new Board structure where it is possible that there will be little or no softball knowledge by some new members. Sound governance can only be effective if there is good honest communication, flexibility in approach and a shared vision within the organisation.

I am heartened to see the work being done in the Wellington and Hutt Valley areas. Merging of resource but retention of identity is no easy task. The challenge is to find a structure that is not only workable, but sustainable.

In closing I would like to thank our funders, sponsors and supporters for your continued confidence in our sport. Our programmes are reliant on you and we are very thankful for your support.

Change continues and after a 25 year association with Softball New Zealand at national level I am not seeking re-election as President. I thank the Board for indulging me; thank all those volunteers and workers in the regions for your amazing work – long may it continue. I also pay homage to those administrators that have gone before and thank them for their hard work over the years. They established the 'baseline' – it is now up to those in the present to strengthen it for those to come.

To each and every "softballer" – all the very best for the future.

PRESIDENT SOFTBALL NEW ZEALAND





The 2009-2010 year for Softball has been another where much has happened and many accomplishments can be acknowledged.

There are many achievements that Softball New Zealand proudly highlights in the past year

- across the whole spectrum of the game.

Our High Performance programmes continue to prosper – and the High Performance programme was reviewed during the year.

The Junior Black Sox and Junior White Sox teams continue to develop and advance their preparations for the upcoming World Championships.

The Black Sox finished runners up at the Men's World Championships in Saskatoon, Canada – while this may not have been the result the team aspired to – second in the world is still no mean feat, and I can proudly commend the management and players for their exemplary behaviour and ambassadorial qualities which I observed as Head of Delegation for this campaign.

The White Sox increased their presence on the world stage – and made the most of the increase in resource and support shown by participating in the Australian domestic competition – the Gillies Shield – as solid preparation for the Women's World Championship in Venezuela.

From a competitions perspective – considerable debate and discussion took place – ultimately resulting in the status quo for age grade tournaments and with the abolishment of the National League – replaced by the ALAC National Fastpitch tournament at the elite level. This was significant in that it provided the opportunity for ALAC to come on board as a sponsor/partner – and assisted in creating some alignment and synergies with the improvement of the image of softball – a point highlighted by the Board and Softball NZ member associations the previous year.


Softball NZ is also well represented administratively on the international stage. New Zealand had a presence at the biannual ISF Congress held in Venezuela – where Bob Leveloff was elected as the ISF 2nd Vice President and Don Tricker, Mark Sorenson, Wayne Saunders, Naomi Shaw and Rhonda Hira all being elected into the ISF Hall of Fame – our congratulations goes out to these very worthy recipients. Also – during this year – Rex Capil was elected Chair of the Oceania Softball Confederation.

The office also bedded down its structure after significant review of the operation and delivery of service requirements. Continuous improvement and a quality

service delivery agent are important milestones for the Softball NZ office.

Stakeholder engagement has improved and the softball community network benefits. The financial result for this year is a credit to the prudent management and improved relationships with various stakeholder groups which has allowed this position to be attained. This not only provides security for the future but allows for new initiatives to be investigated and trialled and for the benefits to be filtered through to the games delivery arm – our associations.

This leads to reiterating the Softball NZ Board and office focus for 2010-2011 – that of Regional Game Development and support and alignment within our current delivery structure. Softball NZ's regional game development function is about support, assisting, influencing and aligning with our regional associations and clubs. Softball NZ programmes should benefit our regions and clubs – just as much as our regions and clubs should not be operating in isolation – but be aligned with an overall game plan and strategy. Where softball really happens is at the regional and local level and it requires great delivery of local softball experiences. This will assist all in achieving OUR aspirations for OUR sport. So what is it we aspire to?



Change is inevitable – progress is optional and the opportunities we take up on rely on a game of singles – not home runs. The ball is in our ballpark – we must make it happen as a collective.



At this point I take the opportunity to thank our major stakeholders – including our association members, the New Zealand Community Trust and SPARC. The continued support and confidence shown is greatly appreciated – and our efforts can only be enhanced with the support of all.

Finally - it is a pleasure to continue to work with so many good people in Softball – can I once again thank and commend all involved – especially our volunteers. Our reliance on the skills, commitment, energy and efforts of

our volunteer sector is priceless - and is of immense value. I also wish to thank Dane and the Softball New Zealand staff – a challenging and rewarding year. Thank you all for your efforts and support - greatly appreciated by all in our Softball Community.

CHAIRMAN SOFTBALL NEW ZEALAND





2009-2010 has been another very interesting year in the world of softball, with a lot of happenings across all the different areas we operate in.

I would like to outline a number of highlights, but as always it is important to thank our major

funders, SPARC and the NZCT whose support we are extremely grateful for. There are a number of other partners who have come on board over the last two years who continue to support Softball New Zealand, and I would like to acknowledge and thank them for assisting Softball New Zealand to operate effectively throughout the year.

Firstly it is important to acknowledge the performance of the Black Sox at the World Championships in 2009. The team headed off shore looking for an unprecedented 4th World Title in a row. After what was an impressive run through the round robin they were looking good. Unfortunately, after a tough loss in the playoff round they had to fight their way through to the finals, where an impressive Aussie team played some very good Softball to beat our guys. I would like to formally congratulate Eddie and the team on a very credible second.

With extra resources and increased emphasis the White Sox have managed to have a solid build up to the World Championships in June. Participation in the Gillies Shield has been a success, with a commitment from Australia for the team to continue to compete into the future. Bartercard was a key partner in allowing this to happen and I would like to formally acknowledge their support.

We are also seeing continued development in both our Junior Programmes as we head into their respective World Championships over the next two years.

Clearly the decision made at the 2009 Congress to shift World Championships to every two years has changed our thinking and we are currently working through the best pathways to address this.

Softball New Zealand are extremely proud of our International Softball Hall of Fame Inductees, Rhonda Hira, Naomi Shaw, Wayne Saunders, Mark Sorenson and Don Tricker. It has been great to be able to recognise their contribution to the sport.

On the world stage Softball New Zealand are very well represented with Chairman Rex Capil also Chair of the Oceania Softball Confederation and Bob Leveloff elected to 2nd Vice President of the ISF. Well done to both individuals and we look forward to working with you to create more influence on the international stage.

The other major announcement for New Zealand was the confirmation that North Harbour will host the 2013

Men's World Championship. A great deal of work has already been completed by the project team and Softball New Zealand look forward to working with them over the next two years.

On the domestic front, there was a great deal of discussion around the Domestic Provincial competition and the form it should take. This resulted in a change from the National Softball League to the ALAC National Fastpitch Championship. We are very supportive of ALAC coming on board as a key partner of the tournament and we look forward to working with them in the future. Timing of the tournament this year was cause for great debate and as such, timing has been changed to reflect the feedback.

From an administrative perspective, after nearly a year with our new structure in place we are now committed to further improve over the next year in terms of stakeholder engagement. One of the organisations key priorities for the year is resourcing and embedding in of our new Regional Game Development Structure. This is vital for our sport as we look for alignment across the board.

Looking forward, there is a great deal of work going on in a number of areas, but one key area is improving the running and in turn the commercial appeal of our tournaments. I appreciate all the work you do in the regions to make these tournaments happen and we need to continue to up the delivery of these tournaments.

I would like to thank all 23 of our Associations who in tough times do stellar jobs within their regions in the delivery of Softball. I encourage you all to utilise the resources and expertise in the form of the local Regional Game Development Officers. They are there to help and support you.

I would like to thank all the staff who have done a great job throughout the year with the passion you all show for the sport shining through in everything you do. Special thanks to those who have left this year, including Fiona Patterson who left to go home to Scotland and Neil Morrison.

The Board of Softball New Zealand deserve a great deal of thanks for their support and guidance and a special thank you for Ray Tibbits who is standing down after a number of years of service. Ray you will be missed.

Finally, a big thank you to all the volunteers who keep the sport running. Without you we would not have a sport.

GENERAL MANAGER SOFTBALL NEW ZELAND



The financial result reported for the 2009/2010 period is very positive primarily due to prudent management of costs in an uncertain year and relationship building with new funders. The result allows us to operate in an uncertain environment with some certainty. For the 2010/2011 year Softball New Zealand are currently budgeting a \$27k profit. As with last financial year this is somewhat misleading as the Board has indicated that the budgeted surplus is there to be used on a project type basis. Essentially it gives Softball New Zealand flexibility to apply to the Board for funding certain activity based projects. Softball New Zealand are not aiming to make a \$27k profit, but are looking to break even.

No different to last year, a review of the accounts will show that Sport and Recreation New Zealand (SPARC) and New Zealand Community Trust (NZCT) are our major funding partners. Softball New Zealand are extremely thankful for the support and confidence shown in us by these key partners.

It is also important to acknowledge the support of other partners such as SAS Sports, Bartercard, Sirus Sports, Air New Zealand and Exclusive Sports who with their assistance give Softball New Zealand the means to operate efficiently and effectively. We appreciate the support they have all given us.

Publicity

This area continues to be a challenge for our sport.

However, during the year one of Softball's pinnacle events, the Mens World Championship from Saskatoon Canada received excellent coverage in print media and radio. Due to the lack of TV Coverage, there was little exposure on our screens.

We will continue to work on this area and look for innovative ways to improve the coverage of Softball in this country.

Softball New Zealand are also working hard on securing a TV deal which will of course increase the commercial attractiveness of our sport.

I would like to acknowledge the work and support of Tony Smith from The Press and Doug Golightly who have been and still are strong supporters and advocates for our game. We appreciate all your hard work.

A big thankyou to Robbie Neha, his team at Woolf TV and Maori TV for funding, producing and screening the Black Sox documentary A Band of Men. The program was well received and the office was inundated with positive feedback.

ALAC National Fastpitch Championship

This year saw the inaugural ALAC National Fastpitch Championship (NFC) played in Christchurch. There had been a considerable amount of debate regarding the format of our domestic provincial competition and we have now embedded this structure for the next three years. This event needs to be seen as the pinnacle event on the domestic softball calendar.

After a rocky start to the tournament there were some strong sides competing at the four day event. In the women's competition, Hutt Valley won the title for the fourth year in succession (inclusive of three National League Titles) which is an outstanding effort.

After initial fears that the team may not be able to compete at the tournament, Wellington dominated it and turned out to be deserved winners of the Mens competition.

I would like to acknowledge all involved with the ALAC NFC. As always Cheryl, Moira and their team down in Christchurch who do a great job in running tournaments. A Good job as always and I look forward to working with you again in the future. Finally I would like to formally acknowledge ALAC who came on board this year as the naming right sponsor of the tournament. The organisation is an integral part of Softball New Zealand's push to increase the spectical that is the ALAC NFC.

National tournaments

As always tournaments are a key pillar of the work conducted at the Softball New Zealand office and with 16 tournaments nationwide, a lot of work goes into getting these up and running. Feedback this year has been positive in terms of the running of these tournaments and the standard of play.

A big congratulations to all the winners!

I would like to thank all those players, coaches, administrators and other volunteers who sacrifice their time to attend these tournaments. I am sure you all have a great time and I look forward to seeing you all there next year.

Finally, thanks to all the Associations and volunteers who ran tournaments and did a great job. The work you all put in is amazing and very much appreciated. You provide the opportunity for our players who wish to exceed in our sport.

International Tournaments

The major international event in the years calendar was the Men's World Championship in Saskatoon Canada. The Black Sox went there with the clear goal to win their



fourth successive world title and although that goal wasn't achieved, a very credible second was attained. Softball New Zealand are excited to have Eddie Kohlhase and Dave Workman back on board and with the introduction of Doug Golightly, Chubb Tangaroa and Clayton Willocks we all await the development of the team as they build towards the 2013 World Championship in North Harbour.

The White Sox have had a busy build up with inclusion in the Australian Domestic Competition and the introduction of the Edebone-Weber Shield. This provided and will continue to provide the team with a consistent programme of a high quality. The team learnt a lot over there and now have a greater understanding of what it takes to compete on the international stage. At the time of writing the team was about to assemble for the World Championships in Caracas and this is where the hard work and build up will pay dividends.

Both the Junior White Sox and Junior Black Sox went on tours to Australia. Both teams have started their build up to their respective world champs and both teams performed to a high standard in Australia. The Junior White Sox not only won the Waverley Easter tournament in Australia but also won a 5 game test series against the Australian Junior National Team. All positive signs as we move towards world championships.

The Junior Black Sox have a series against Australia in the coming year.

Communication

Always an area where improvements can be made but Softball New Zealand have endeavoured to be as open and honest in their communication style as possible. We will look to continue to improve in this area throughout the 2010-2011 year as we refine our processes.

Partnerships

With a general downturn in the economy over the last two or three years, building partnerships that have a financial return for the sport has been difficult.

As indicated earlier both SPARC and NZCT contribute greatly to Softball New Zealand and for that we are thankful. The relationship with both parties is strong and will continue to grow in the future.

With SPARC we have continued communication with Michael Taylor, our Relationship Manager who provides relevant and timely information. This year SPARC also identified the importance of the White Sox and contributed financially to a special "battery" project in the build up for the World Championships. For this and the continued support of Softball New Zealand and the Black Sox we are most thankful.

SECTION TWO - REPORTS High Performance Manager's Report

As we move into a new financial year and finalise the plans that will take the High Performance programme and the respective national teams closer to their objectives, much can be learnt from the activities of the past 12 months.

The future of International Softball is changing as a result of some decisions that have been made internationally over the last 12 months. The IOC voted to not include Women's Softball in the 2016 Olympic Programme which has had far reaching consequences across the international softball community. At around the same time the ISF made some important announcements concerning the future of World Championship events. From 2010, World Championships will be contested every 2 years as opposed to the 4-year cycle which we are all used to. While the decision will see an increase in the amount of international softball available to teams, it will also take some careful planning to ensure that teams from this side of the world are able to be exposed to the increase in competition. At the same ISF congress, it was announced that North Harbour would host the 2013 Men's World Championships. The announcement of a home World Championships has further motivated the Black Sox to avenge their defeat in Saskatoon.

On the playing front, it was a mixed year from Softball New Zealand. The Black Sox headed to Saskatoon to win an unprecedented 4th consecutive World Championship title. While they were unstoppable in round robin play, they met some tougher competition in the post section play, qualifying for the final the hard way. Eventually, the Black Sox had to settle for runners up after losing the final to an impressive Australian outfit.

Following the World Championships and subsequent debrief and review, the management team for 2013 was appointed. It is with great pleasure that Softball New Zealand announced the appointments of Eddie Kohlhase (Head Coach), Dave Workman (Assistant Coach), Doug Golightly (Manager), Chubb Tangaroa (Pitching Coach) and Clayton Willocks (Technology Advisor). At the same time I would like to thank Wayne Small (outgoing Manager), Eric Wilson and Jim Wana (outgoing Pitching Coaches) and Helen Townsend (outgoing Technology Advisor) and acknowledge their involvement in the Black Sox programme. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Rob Cashman who has been involved with the Black Sox for many years as their Physiotherapist. Rob has put in many hours of work into the team and we thank him for his involvement.

The Black Sox have also had confirmation of ongoing support from SPARC as they work into the 2013 campaign. This support is invaluable to the team and allows the players and management to focus more single-mindedly on their preparation without being side-tracked by some of the financial issues which our other teams are only too aware of.

2009/10 saw the White Sox involved in the inaugural Edabone-Weber Series. This involvement signalled the beginning of a positive and ongoing relationship with Softball Australia. The 3 weekend series was played across states and culminated in a 5-match test series against Australia. Their involvement in such a high level of softball less than 9 months out for the World Championship has been beneficial to the squad. In addition, Softball New Zealand secured a project grant via SPARC to run a battery project in the lead up to the 2010 World Championships. Bevan Martin and Chubb Tangaroa have been working with identified members of the battery fine tuning their development in the final 8 month countdown to Venezuela.

The Junior Black Sox have begun their 2012 campaign, with the appointment of the key members of the management team occurring in the middle of 2009. John Love, Phil Johnston and Roger Aranui have named an enlarged training squad with the focus on player skill and team culture development. In April this year a smaller travelling squad was selected to attend and contest the 2010 Friendship Games and test series versus Australia.

The Junior White Sox have also had a successful 12 months as they build up to their 2011 World Championships. They travelled to Australia to play in the Waverley Easter tournament where they not only won the tournament but also were successful in winning a 5-match test series against Australia.

Finally, at the time of writing, the Tenga Pickering Contractors Ltd White Sox are a week away from heading to the Women's World Championships. While their result will be recorded in next year's annual report, I would like to take the opportunity to wish them well in their travels and I am sure that they will represent us all with pride, integrity and commitment.

The last 12 months have been interesting in softball, both internationally and on the domestic front. I look forward to the challenges and opportunities that the next 12 months bring and believe that Softball New Zealand is well on its way to achieving its vision of being a leading sport – on and off the diamond.

National Director Of Coaching Report



Once again it is my pleasure to report on the Softball NZ Coaching Programme.

Another year passes very quickly. The restructure has impacted significantly. Going from 7 coaches

(in the past) to 2 has put the coaching programme in a hugely challenging position. It is apparent that the coaching programme structure requires "rebuilding" for this new decade and along with it some new challenges for us.

Regional Game Development Officers Venita Hokai (Upper Nth Is) Dave Render (Lower Nth Is) Lesley McIntosh (Upper Sth Is) & Kath McGilbert (Lower Sth Is) have significant and important roles to support Association's and Game Development. Coaching requirements remain a focus if that is the desire of the Association. They, along with me and Debbie Mygind are readily available to promote, present and support Association Coaching needs as requested. Thanks are expressed to Neil Morrison who was RGDO for the Upper Nth Is earlier this year. Coming from a strong softball background, Neil was able to contribute extensively to grass roots development.

The Board have approved funding for a "Train the Trainers" workshop. At the time of printing the Annual Report it is anticipated that a 2 day workshop will have been held with 12 identified presenters from around the country. Along with the support of Regional Game Development Officers it is anticipated that coaching courses will be readily available and more regionally than in the past.



A Softball NZ Regional Coaching Convention was held in May in Nelson. It was a dreadful winter's day...but you couldn't dent the enthusiasm of the coaches and players 22 Softball New Zealand Yearbook 2009/2010 who attended. The facilities are superb at Saxton Park and the envy of many. Marty Grant, Thomas Makea, Pogo Powers, Dennis Dolejs and I presented a variety of topics to an engaging audience. Feedback from the participants was extremely positive and suggested that they want the convention concept to be a regular activity on the Tasman area calendar. Well done RGDO Lesley McIntosh for getting this organised.

The new Softball NZ Coaching Development Framework Pathways document will provide more clarity around the mix and match of units and modules on offer. The Framework is a work in progress...albeit, a slow one. Developing appropriate resources to "Grow the Game" is a constantly evolving task. Yesterday's news is old news and we must keep up with current trends as much as we can. Whilst observing the Women's NCAA College Championship Finals on ESPN. I was blown away with how much the short game had developed at this level. Almost every hitter was a leftie...and they could also put the ball over the fence at whim. You can learn so much from watching games like this and with today's technology like the Internet, Facebook, You Tube and Live Stream TV, access to what the rest of the world is doing is so much easier. In the words of Whoopi Goldberg in Sister Act ... "you have to sit up and pay attention!"

New ways of securing SPARC funding to support coaching initiatives are available through various avenues. Auckland, North Harbour and Counties Manukau Associations have engaged with the Greater Auckland Coaching Unit (GACU) to deliver a coaching project called "Better Coaches, Better Players". RGDO Venita Hokai is the project manager of which the objectives are to increase the quality and quantity of age grade representative youth coaches through the provision of coaching courses, services and training. Regional Sport Trusts are also an impressive link to generic coach development. Remember that any RST course undertaken by softball coaches can be recognised on the Softball New Zealand Coaching Database.

Sport Wellington recently conducted a forum to investigate ways and means that sport can leverage off each other to present Entry Level Coaching Courses. It is conceivable that a Softball coach can attend a Rugby course and get signed off by Softball as having completed basic entry level criteria for coaches covering generic topics such as

Communication,

ch as Behaviour -



Management, Planning, Leadership etc...watch this space!

Kiwisport has the potential to change the face of sport. How many Associations have "sat up and paid attention" to the available funding avenues at Regional Sport Trusts to grow our game at school and club level? Congratulations to those who have....and good luck to those who have a proposal in.

The 3rd Bi-annual "Coaches Spin" National Coaching Convention will have been held in August in Lower Hutt. If it is anything like the 2006 & 2008 coaching conventions, then it will have been another resounding success. I hope you were there to further your knowledge!

At the time of writing, the White Sox Team head off to Venezuela for the Women's World Series and the Junior Black Sox Team to the Friendship Games in Australia. The Black Sox & Junior White Sox Teams have extensive plans leading up to their respective International Games. Best wishes are extended to them all. The Bi-Annual ISF World Series Programme kicks off in 2012 with the White Sox & U19 Boys, 2013 Black Sox & U19 Girls, 2014 White Sox & U19 Boys, 2015 Black Sox & U19 Girls and so forth. I bring this to your attention if you have the desire to be part of coaching at international level. Strategic planning and coach development are key focus areas for you. Don't leave it to chance, but think about what credentials you might need to be in the frame for consideration. It is crucial that you plan now, not later.

I wish to thank my colleagues at the Softball NZ office, Dane, Eugene, Glen, Chris, Alison, Clarissa & Tracy, also Debbie Mygind, Megan Harlick, Venita, Dave, Lesley & Kath for their support to the coaching programme. There is no "i" in team and we could never progress without the collective work of everyone involved.

Over the 2009-2010 season I have continued to oversee the development of Pitchers and Catchers.

Overall, where is the game at?

Pitching speed is a very good factual place to start. The biggest improvement in speeds was evident at the U17 Boys & Girls Nationals. The best pitchers are above the U17 measurable standard in both genders. This is putting our Junior White Sox/Black Sox teams at a definite advantage compared to the 2006 & 2008 Junior Teams. We have the pitchers at this level who currently have the potential to dominate. This makes for an exciting future.

What do we still need to improve on?

We need to create & develop the talent. We always need more pitchers and catchers coming through the grades. It all starts with the home grown beginner. This is where Associations and Regional Game Development Officers can really have an impact on the game. A new version of the U13 Rookie Sox Pitching & Catching Guidelines with a 7 minute DVD was written to help advise "How to Coach" this age group. Thanks to Kath McGilbert for her technical skills and use of her personal equipment to help produce the DVD and Naomi Shaw's help in putting this 20 page booklet together.

The next level of player development is the U15 Raw Sox. This new version of U15 Raw Sox Pitching & Catching Guidelines offers more information than the previous Rookie/Raw Sox combined document. With coaching checkpoints, mental approach notes, the expectation is clear of both the coach and the players in this developing age group. These documents are available as a free download on the pitching resource page of the Softball New Zealand website.

How did we get here?

I travelled extensively in September/October 2009 throughout the country holding Regional Battery Camps. The three one day camps in the South Island, and three camps in the North Island catered for both genders and made the most of the pre-season school holiday period.

All Associations were given the opportunity to talent identify their key youth pitchers and catchers (13-18 years) and send them along to the pre-season camp. Some Associations made the most of this opportunity and others did not. In total 132 players attended the 3 camps. The main objective of the camps was to help get the Battery off to a good strong start to the season and was also an opportunity to Talent Identify (TID) players and to work with and influence the newly appointed RGDOs. Getting the developing coach to a higher more knowledgeable level was a focus. Congratulations are also to be extended to Canterbury & Otago Softball Associations for being proactive in funding extra visits to regions for the sole purpose of Battery their Development.



The Essential Skills Battery Module was created and presented to help the bridge gap between the developing and the advanced level of coach. This is a 2 hour **PowerPoint** presentation which covers Pitching Technique. the 3 "Must Have Pitches". and The Calling

Formula – an introduction to calling a game. I presented this module in Southland, Otago, Central Otago, Canterbury, Nelson, Hutt Valley, Hawkes Bay, Waikato, North Harbour and Auckland. The module finished with a crossword on calling as the test. The coaches, who attended this session, are now better equipped to cope with the more advanced Competitive Athlete Unit Pitching Module.

The U15 'Share the Load' Rule continued at all four U15 National Tournaments and extended to include all U15 year olds pitching and catching at U17 & U19 Nationals as well. The tournament scorers did a great job of ensuring the rule was adhered to and we really appreciate the coaches acceptance of this rule.

There is no doubt that one of the best game development tools available is the radar gun. I encourage all Associations to consider the purchase of a radar gun in their 3

funding applications. The accurate information provided enables the pitcher and coach to determine where the player is in comparison to the age grade measurable standards. From this, goals can be set to develop further. It's also a great motivator for players as evidenced by a recent posting on facebook titled "I pitch faster when Debbie Mygind is watching!"

The Measurable Pitching Velocity standards were amended in July 2009. With more U15 boys throwing a more consistent higher speed – the top speed was increased from 101 to 106 kms. A rise ball speed was added to the U17 girls standard to reflect the improvement in skill in this gender. Also for the first time we introduced the Catchers overhand throwing standard for the 5 different age categories.

The best way to keep an eye on the better pitchers overall development from season to season is to see them in game situations. As usual I tried to attend as many National Tournaments as I could:

The New ISF Pitching Rules will undoubtedly have an impact on the game and on the current velocity standard. Softball New Zealand Chief Umpire Wayne Saunders and I have been liasing to ensure that the new pitching rules are clearly understood. Wayne & I together presented a photo/-film based Power Point Presentation at the Womens & Mens Club Nationals to

get the word out on these new rules which come into effect in NZ August 2010.

This presentation has now also been presented in Hawkes Bay, Auckland, Hutt Valley, and Wellington and in Nelson at the Upper South Island Coaching Convention by Marty Grant. The intention is to continue with these presentations throughout the winter and pre Christmas months to ensure that players, coaches and umpires are all fully aware of the rules.

In April both Naomi & I attended the Junior Black Sox



Camp and offered benchmark testing for the first 2012 Junior Black Sox squad. The talent at this level is exciting for the future.

SPARC funded a White Sox Battery Programme specifically focusing on the pitchers & catchers attending World Series this year. Bevan Martin and Chubb Tangaroa were used to coach catching and pitching

respectively and I provided factual information based on Radar speed readings and Revfire spin readings. Auckland scorer Lynette Leathart provided Turbostat information from which I was able to provide the pitchers with real game analysis and evaluation.

What is the overall conclusion for 2009-10? Ed Dolejs says "the talent is always out there...find it and develop *it*".

It is my privilege again to report on the activities of your Softball New Zealand Umpiring programme. Your National Umpiring Staff continues to work very well as a team for the good of the "The Programme". Again it

has been a pleasure to lead this group of widely experienced individuals that understand the importance on meeting the needs of our membership. As a team we continue to place high importance on communications and transparency as the corner stone on how we try to deliver on our "Mission Statement". Our Mission Statement developed in partnership with Softball New Zealand's, sets the challenge to deliver world's best practice. A benefit of this is our umpires and national teams are not disadvantaged in international competition. The pitching regulations were enforced more strictly at the last Men's World Championship and this approach can be expected at future World Championships. Feedback from prominent players and coaches on our former passive approach towards infringements of the pitching regulations was noted. Last season showed an important step up by umpiring in delivering world's best practice in reference to enforcement of the pitching regulations. A continuation of this practice can be expected at all national tournaments and it will be expected that all Softball New Zealand registered umpires will see that the same standards are upheld at local association level.

At the 2009 ISF Congress a number of changes to the pitching regulations were approved. The major change being "Leaping" is now legal. As Umpire-In-Chief (UIC), I have been working closely with the National Director of Pitching in support of her nationwide presentation on the new ISF Pitching Rules. This approach by the National Coaching Staff can only be commended and supported.

At the 2009 Softball New Zealand AGM Nicky Ogier (CB) was named "Umpire of the Year", whilst Distinguished Service Awards were bestowed on Jeremy England (WN), Stuart Hodges (HB), Cass Seeling (WBOP), Manu and Bill Smith (NH), Trevor Stratford (HV), Lance Type and Riki Tourangi (AK).

NATIONAL UMPIRE STAFF AND CLINICS

AGM reports are the main source of recording umpiring history. Your National Umpire Staff for last season were Wayne Saunders (UIC), Deputy Directors Cass Seeling, Daph Turner and Mark McFarlane. We were joined by Regional Directors; Nicky Ogier (South), Lindsay Edwards **26** Softball New Zealand Yearbook 2009/2010 (Central) and Bill Smith (North) with Wiremu Tamaki recently appointed as a new Regional Director (at large). Notable among our many tasks; Nicky was NZ Rules examiners, Wayne National Tournament appointments, Wiremu Website Manager. Lindsay, Mark, Nicky, Wiremu and Glen Nalepa the Level 7 Advisory Group, whilst Ray Dyason and Don Poy joint members of the NUS as National Tournament Chief Umpires. In addition the Rulebook sub-group has provided considerable lead-in support to Softball New Zealand for production of the new Rulebook.

Successful Regional clinics were held in Wanganui, Oamaru, Christchurch and North Harbour. Again there was a good attendance at each clinic and it was pleasing to see new faces amongst this year's list of facilitators. These clinics held in September are now well established. They are an important part of national umpire training as we prepare for each season and upcoming International Examinations.

NATIONAL TOURNAMENTS

This year's National Tournaments were well staffed, again the use mainly, of National Staff members as Tournament Chief Umpires has provided for in depth reporting and consistency in evaluating. The continuation of "10/2" sessions again proved popular in the developing of umpire knowledge through shared experience.

A total of 105 umpires (including school supplied umpires) worked 1802 assignments at this year's National Tournaments. This season we played host to Jason Carter (Australia - Trans Tasman Exchange) and Randy McLamb (USA - ISC Exchange).

Congratulations and "Pike Ake" to Rikki Tourangi, Mark Porteous, Tara Harris, Jeremy England and Dave Shedlock who have been selected to attend the Oceania ISF Certification Seminar, Feb 2011, Australia.

INTERNATIONAL UMPIRING

As the Regional Umpire Coordinator I represented both Oceania and New Zealand on the Umpires Commission and the Rules Commission at the 2009 ISF Congress in Venezuela.

The Rules Commission considered 65 proposed rule changes, of those 11 were withdrawn and 10 were rejected. As mentioned earlier there were significant changes to the fast-pitch pitching regulations whilst most other approved changes were of a minor or housekeeping nature. The Umpires Commission considered and approved a number of improvements to the ISF 3/4 umpire field mechanics. Post Congress the ISF Point of Emphasis for Rule 6 the Pitching Regulations (Fast-pitch only) was released.






