
#### **Mazey Day Music Performance**

#### **Shifting Horizons**



The Shifting Horizons 180 programme has just come to an end at MBA. The programme took place at Godolphin National Trust woods, which now grow over an old mining site. We were a small group of Year 9, 10 and 11 students. We went out of school half a day a week for about 10 weeks and also had some one-to-one mentoring. The programme helps students develop skills such as confidence, trust and teamwork through different outdoor activities such as building fires from natural sources; you can learn to cook outdoors and it also teaches you how to build shelters from small amounts of resources - this isn't easy!

In my opinion it helps you to be able to ask for help, which is something that I used to struggle with myself. The programme helped me to engage in a team and to become more confident in myself and it is also one of the best experiences I've ever had. Codie Stafford, Year 11, who was on the programme with me commented, "It's never too early to start preparing for your exams, don't leave it until year 10!" She added, "MBA was the best school I have ever been to because it gave me chances."



Golowan, the feast of St John, the Midsummer celebrations in Cornwall, England, UK: widespread prior to the late 19th century and most popular in Penzance and Newlyn. The celebrations are conducted from 23 June (St John's Eve) to 28 June (St Peter's Eve) each year, St Peter's Eve being the more popular in Cornish fishing communities. The celebrations are centred on the lighting of bonfires and fireworks and the performance of associated rituals.
