Just a reminder...

Nominations for those wishing to place their name or another residents name in nomination for the upcoming 2018 election to the Board of Trustees must have that written nomination to the Co-Op office by April 20th, no later than 3:00pm. If nominated by someone else, the nominee must submit in writing their acceptance or refusal within 7 days.

Only one (1) Certificate Holder may serve on the Board at any given time.

Nominee must submit a short (1page max) bio/resume/qualifications to be published in newsletter.

Nominees running for a seat on the Board do not run for a specific office. Election places you on the Board and offices are voted from within the Board.

Tree Planting

Spring is around the corner so now would be a good time to remind everyone that if you're planning to plant a tree or shrubs, there are rules for planting. No property boundary lines are to be formed. They must not block line of vision from intersections or driveways etc. All requests for such plantings must be submitted to the Board of Trustees for approval. See rule # 12 of Rules and Regulations.

Planting a Garden...

A small garden - a maximum of 8' x 10' or 80 sq, ft is permitted when authorized by the Board of Trustees and it must be in a location that does not become unsightly to surrounding areas. It must be maintained and cleaned up after the growing season.

Pet Owners...

Dogs / pets MUST be on a leash when outside... They cannot be tied and left alone.

Doing some work around the house...

The State of New Jersey Uniform Construction Code Regulations is the rules that govern when and if permits are required. The following are some examples but should not be considered an all inclusive list.

Permits are required if:

- You cut away a wall or any portion thereof
- You cut any structural beam or bearing support
- Construct an addition or make alterations to your home
 i.e. enclosing a porch or patio cover
- Installing, replacing or re-locating a hot water heater
- Installing, replacing or re-locating any water drainage or venting
- Installing of heating or air conditioning systems
- Installation or upgrading any electrical wiring or plumbing

Permits are not necessary, but permission from the Co-op is if:

- You add or replace shutters, awnings or railings
- Installation of Solar tubes
- Installation of Satellite Dish (TV)
- Window replacements
- Residents are required to have their contractor provide a certificate of insurance to the Trustees office before any work is started. If you're having work done call the Maintenance Department and check if any of the above applies to your project.

Is Your Garage at Risk for a Fire?

We've all seen this.... you drive down a street and notice a car parked in the driveway and the garage door is open. The inside of the garage it is filled from floor to ceiling with clutter; bins, boxes, newspapers, magazines, old paint cans, furniture etc. A cluttered garage isn't just an eyesore it can also be dangerous. An important thing to remember is that garage fires tend to spread farther and often go undetected longer than fires in other areas of a home. There must be a clear aisle to exit your house through the garage. The fuse box must be kept clear! Clutter can make matters worse by preventing firefighters from quickly entering your garage to put out a fire.

Preventing Garage Clutter

- Go through all the clutter that you have accumulated and decide what you really need and what you really don't need.
- Install a heat sensor or smoke alarm.
- Store oil, gasoline, paint and varnish in a shed away from your home in metal fire-resistant cabinets or dispose of them properly.
- Put items that can catch on fire on shelves away from electrical appliance.
- Install shelving units to organize items that you store in your garage.
- Keep a working fire extinguisher by the door that you use to enter into your garage.
- Keep your garage tidy; do not allow junk to accumulate!

Spring is here and it is time to think about bocce / shuffleboard beginning. Volunteers have stepped forward to lead the Club and are excited to get organized and begin the competition.



Acceptable Materials: paints/thinners/boat paint, solvents, pool chemicals, pesticides and herbicides, aerosol cans, auto products, toilet and drain cleaners, silver polishes, oven cleaners, photographic chemicals, rug and upholstery cleaners, polishes and bleaches, waste oil and used gasoline, propane tanks and fire extinguishers.

ALL THE ABOVE MATERIALS, EXCEPT OIL AND GASOLINE, **MUST BE IN ORIGINAL CONTAINERS**

Maximum volume per household is limited to 200 pounds of dry materials and 20 gallons of liquid. Please, no containers larger than 5 gallons.


