

## What is Smart Cooling in the Tropics?

Smart Cooling is a great **free** new project working with low-income households to help find ways to reduce electricity usage and stay cool.

# That sounds cool - tell me more

If you are eligible for the project, Smart Cooling will come to your home and provide a free home electricity assessment. We will work with you to show you:

- how to understand your jacana energy bill
- which appliances are using the most electricity
- how to save electricity and money through simple changes to your home

## Why is it free?

The Smart Cooling project is funded by the Federal Government's Low Income Energy Efficiency Program (LIEEP).

The information and lessons learnt from the project will be used to improve future energy efficiency policies - to help all Australian's live comfortably while playing their part in protecting and preserving the environment.

## Am I eligible?

To be eligible you need to be living in Darwin on a low income and have one of the followina:

- a low income health care card
   or
- receive an approved Centrelink payment
- live in Yilli Rreung Housing (Berrimah Estate and Bagot Community).

## You will receive

As part of this free service, depending on your particular needs, Smart Cooling may provide a range of free services including:



Cleaning of your cooling appliances



In home displays and monitors to better manage your cooling appliances



Free community workshops



Structural modification to your home where necessary
