THE TRAIN WHISTLE IS BLOWING.....

I once had a friend in ministry I served with on two Epiphany Weekends. She carried a train whistle. One of those weekends sticks out in my memory. Epiphany is a Friday through Sunday ministry where you build a team, have team meetings for over a month, and then head into a maximum security youth prison together. Let me put it plainly, the kids aren't sent there for stealing hub caps. A young man, whom I have to leave nameless, wanted to speak with me. He was there because he shot his mother while on drugs. He was from a financially "well off" family. Parents were both professionals in the community. Another of those kids told me that he murdered someone while robbing them in inner city B'ham. They were from different sides of the track so to speak.

C.S Lewis noted something that we all should hear. I think it applies to where we are as a church. He said Jesus spoke and acted in such a way that one either had to follow Him or else decide that He was crazy. There was no middle ground in His kingdom. You either had to move toward it, risk letting go and being caught up in his project, or else you had, like the rich ruler, to move on, realizing that you wanted to retain citizenship in the kingdoms of this world. The point is not everyone will choose to move forward with this movement of God known as Hope. A believer has to be ok with that. We may not like this about church or Jesus for that matter. Not only do I not see Jesus chase people down, but I don't see him adjusting or toning things down afterwards.

Jesus was more concerned on the front end with his people. He was consistently telling people about his time. In story after story, we see Jesus challenge people to think differently. Yes, even about church. He talked about a party for everyone and then continued to teach that some who were invited would choose other things; other paths. OUCH! Now he's meddling! So, in light of the one that is leading us, let's not sugar coat our role in this church. Let's have the courage to look at ourselves in this journey.



I told them that no fence is high enough to keep out God's love. Later that day,


