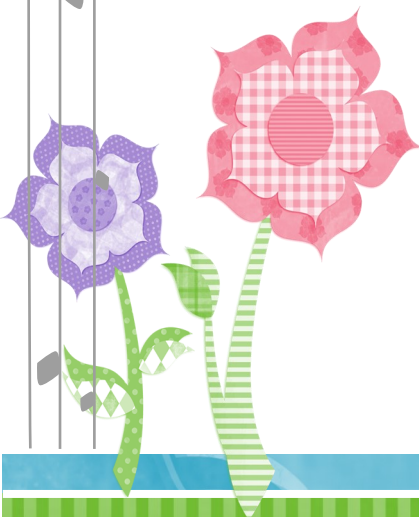
2. May 3: Hug Your Cat Day

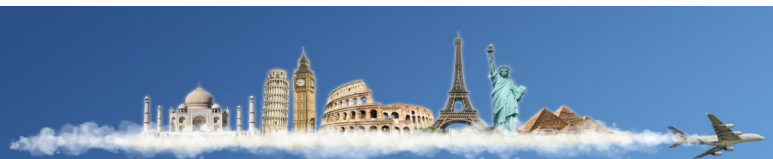

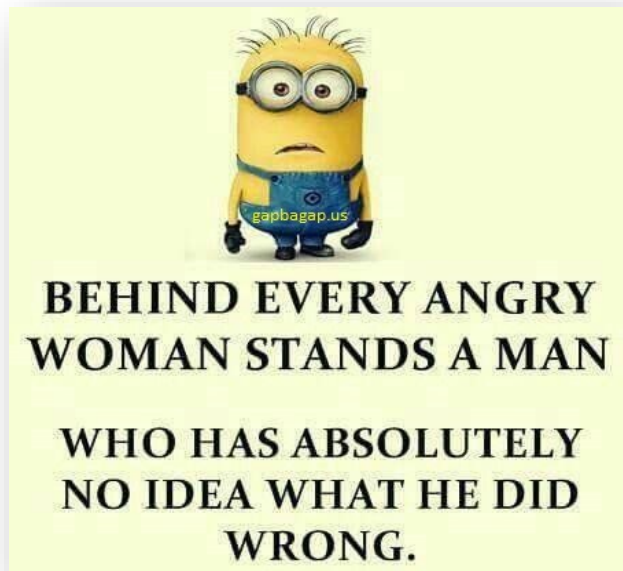

9. May 13: Frog Jumping Day

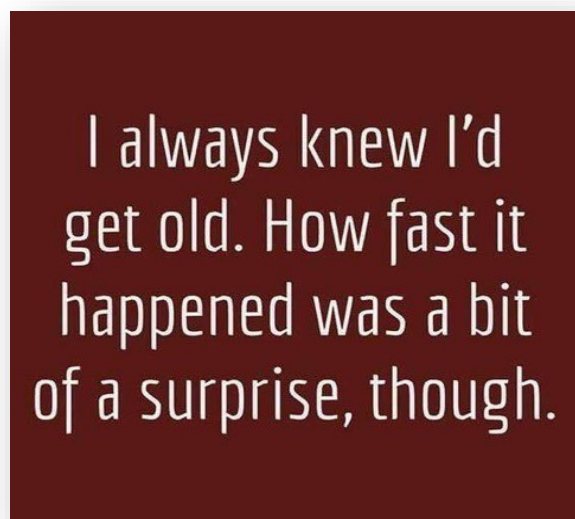

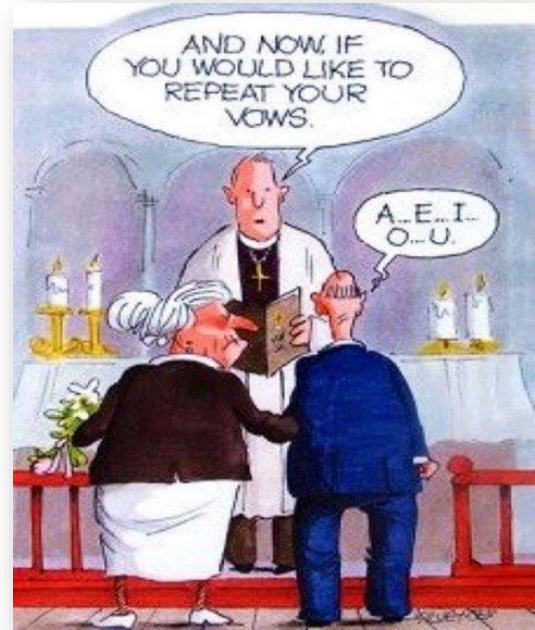

Did you know that each donation of Blood could help save the lives of three people in need of a transfusion. Tonight Monday March 19th, there were 109 registered Donors of which 97 were able to Donate. Blood Services Canada had a quota of 89, they were very happy with the turnout. 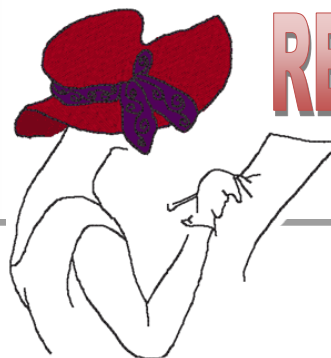

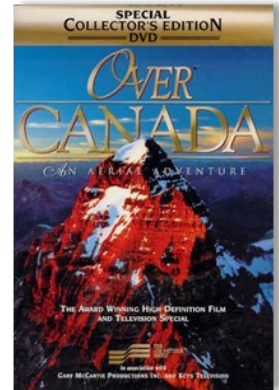

To date for 2018, the various trade "wars" have had minimal impact upon the prices for aluminum. Here are the statistics for 2018:

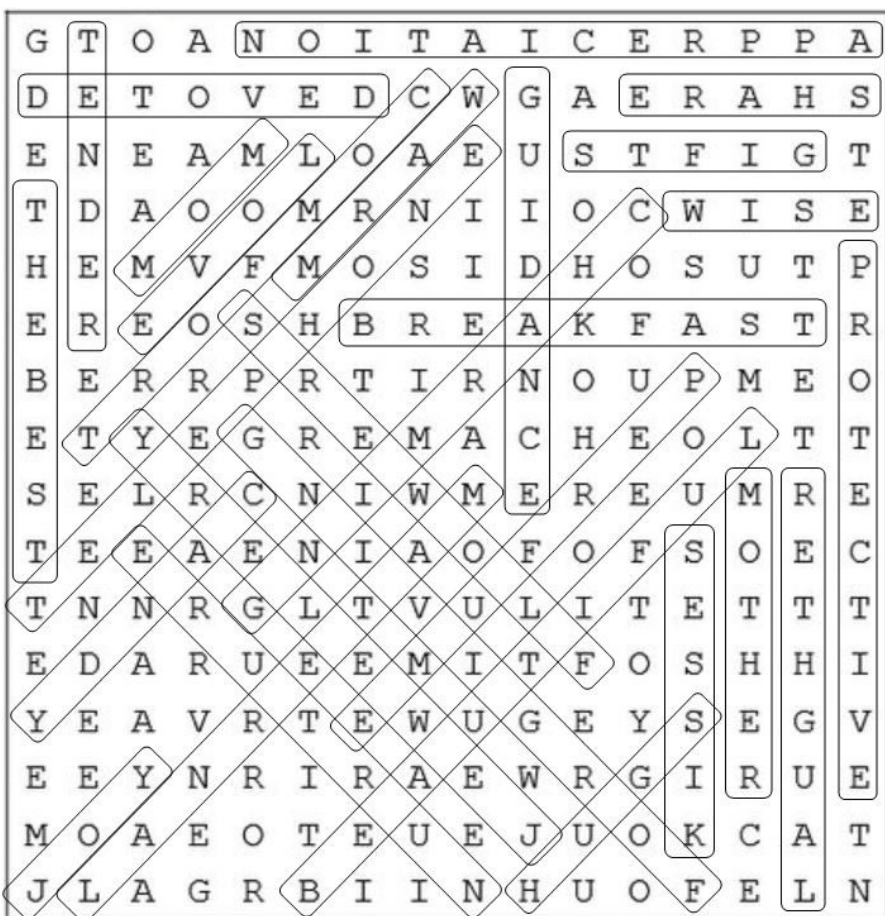

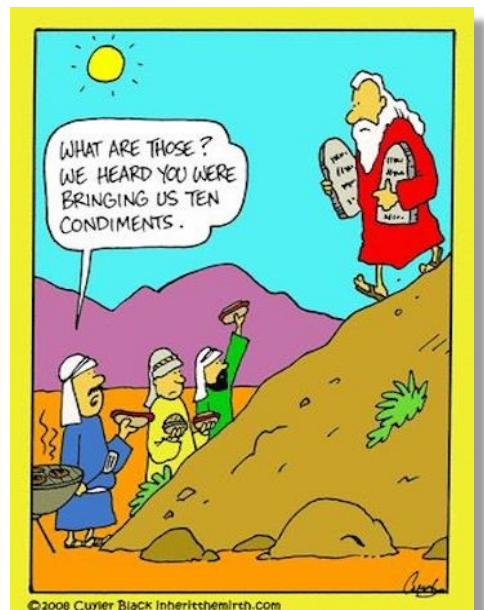
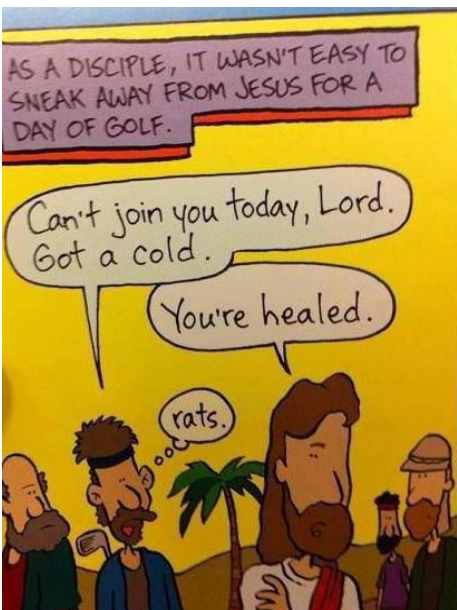
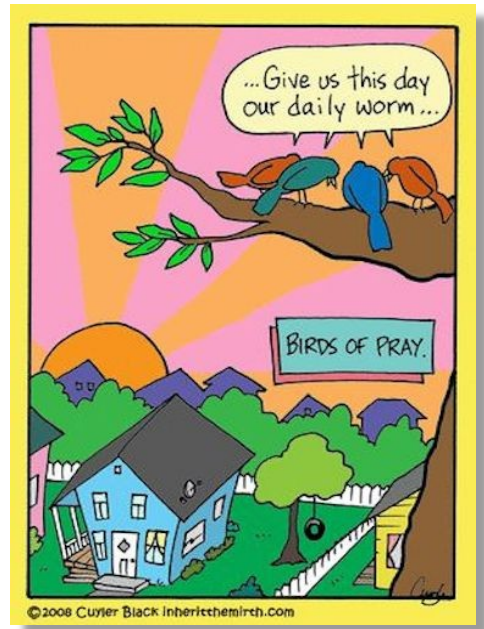
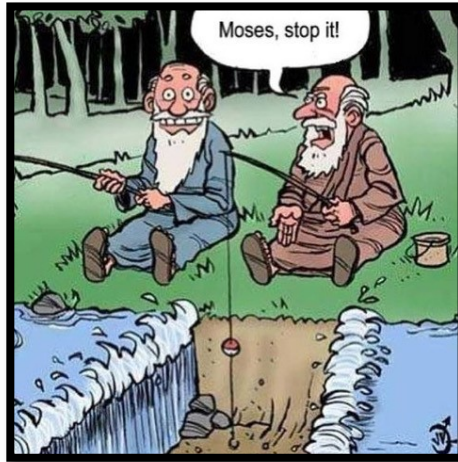


Do to the weather, the start of Monday Golf at Woodstock has been moved forward 1 week. Our first official golf day will be May 7th.
