#### **Education Maintenance Allowance**

If you are a current concession card holder, you may be eligible to claim the Education Maintenance Allowance. Depending on the age of your child, payments range between \$150 and \$300 per year which can assist with payment of the Essential Educational Items charge. Applications forms were sent home with the students' reports last year, however if you require a form please contact the school office.



All applications must be submitted with a **copy of your current concession card** to enable them to be processed. **Applications close 27<sup>th</sup> Feb 2014** and unfortunately late applications cannot be accepted.

#### **Student Absences**

The Coolart Wetlands: Class 9 and 10 had a wonderful excursion to the Coolart Wetlands as part of our Integrated Studies Program involving the local environment. Brian the Ranger met us and explained the importance of looking after the National Parks and his work at Coolart. In the Educational Centre we were able to see species of birds found in the local area such as Wedge Tailed Eagles, Cormorants and Grebes.



The students loved using the binoculars and maps to identify the local bird life in the bird hides. We were lucky enough to see several species of ducks, ibis, cormorants and purple swamp hens. Students wrote excursion reports on the Coolart Wetlands.

**Michael** learnt to be quiet in the bird hide and don not feed the animals. Seth said "We all own the park. I saw an old well and a fountain." Brian the Ranger told us that Wedge Tailed Eagles eat rats and mice. By Rhiannon

Andrew said we can look after National Parks by not leaving trash everywhere, sticking to the paths and being respectful to the environment. Joshua saw different feathers in the centre, bird's nests and bird hides. He liked using the binoculars to check out the birds and loved following the map. He wants to take his family there. Ruby learnt that she should stay away from bird's nests.
