Staff Training Day Report

We had a very engaging staff training day last Friday, with all staff participating in a full day program on how Restorative Practices can be used to further support student wellbeing and connectedness.

The first two hours of the program delved into the neuroscience of student behaviour, which enabled us to explore more deeply the underlying needs and motivation behind many behaviours we see in our students. The middle part of the program focussed on equipping teachers with the fundamental skills to be able to hold a 'restorative conversation' with students. This was very practical component of the day, whereby teachers worked in groups to role play a number of different school based scenarios. The last session of the day focussed on the nuances of how to undertake restorative conversations with students with additional needs.

In summary, the essence of restorative work can be summarised and remembered by using the simple acronym **WARM**:

W – what happened (listen to stories)

A – affect (who was armed)

R – repair (fix the mistake)

M – move forward (prevent & learn)

The framework around restorative practices dovetails beautifully with many of the school's existing practices developed over recent years as part of the School Wide Positive Behaviours Support program. The school will continue to work very hard in this area to ensure the social and emotional wellbeing of every child is strongly supported through our day to day practice.

Parent Information Sessions

A huge thank you to the many parents who have attended information sessions over the last week. We have really appreciated your time to participate in these sessions to find out more about the learning programs being undertaken this year as well as some of the key procedures and processes that will operate at each level.

Year 5 and 6 Information Session will be held today at 4:30pm.

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, Tamy Stublely (Campus Principal of Williamstown High) has very kindly offered to attend today's Year 6 session to provide an overview of the Transition Program that will unfold for many of our students over the coming months.

For those parents who were unable to attend these sessions, the presentations will be uploaded to the website and located under each year level e.g. Foundation, Year 1 etc

Early Release

All children collected from school before 3.30pm must be signed out at the Office. With an 'Early Release Pass' to hand to the supervising teacher. If a child is signed out at Recess or Lunch time, your child will be called to the Office and the Early Release Pass will be given to the supervising teacher.

Working With Children Cards

Cardholders who are required to renew their WWCC will no longer need to go to Australia Post to lodge a paper form and present their current card. Cardholders will go to the WWCC website to complete their renewal application online and, if applying for an Employee Check, pay the fee using a credit card when using the **online renewal process**, cardholders will be notified by SMS, letter or email 28 days before their WWCC is due to expire. It is important for cardholders to keep their contact details up to date so that they receive this important reminder.

After receiving a notification, individuals continuing to do child-related work should go to MyCheck on the WWCC website and apply to renew their check. Cardholders will be asked to register with MyCheck if they have not already done so. Once logged in to MyCheck, cardholders will be prompted to confirm or update their personal contact and work details, complete the online form and, if applying for an Employee Check, pay the non-refundable fee.

Student Safety

- Please take the time to regularly remind your child/ren about safety, especially when going to and from school. Here are the important points to mention:
- Do not talk to strangers and never accept a ride from a stranger, or accept lollies or gifts from a stranger.
- Immediately report any issue or problem you may have when going to or from school, to your mum and dad, or to your teacher, the Principal, Assistant Principal or office staff.
- Always get permission from mum or dad before going to play with a friend after school and always let mum and dad know where you will be and what time you will be home.
- We advise that, wherever possible, children should travel to or from school with an adult or with their friends, rather than travel alone.

Bikes & Scooters

Many children ride bikes and scooters to school each day. All bikes and scooters must be locked up in either the Bike or Scooter Enclosure to prevent theft. Please ensure your child has a chain and a lock.

All children who ride a bike or scooter must wear a helmet which is a requirement by the Government. The school regularly reminds all children about wearing helmets for their safety.

All bikes, scooters, skateboards, ribstic and helmets must be labelled, with your child's name and class. **Children are reminded they must walk their bike, scooter, skateboard or ribstic to and from the school gates.**

No bikes are to be brought through the school buildings and we request, where possible, that scooters are also not walked through the building.



CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

CSEF is provided by Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent you may be eligible for CSEF. The annual CSEF amount for primary school student is \$125.

HOW TO APPLY (by 21/06/2019)

Contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef. If you applied for the CSEF at this school in 2018 you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your families circumstances. You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- * **New student enrolments** – if your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- * **Changed family circumstances** – such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

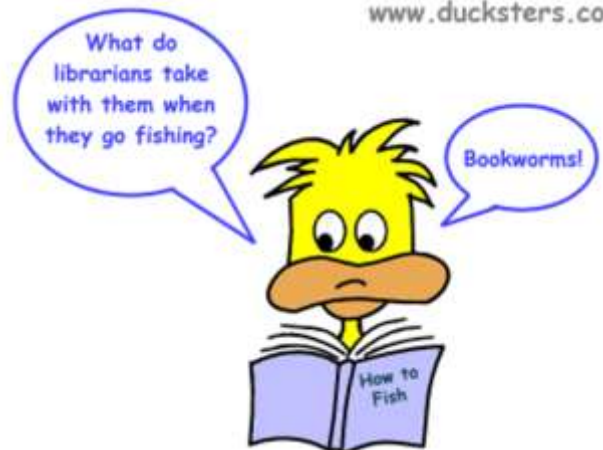

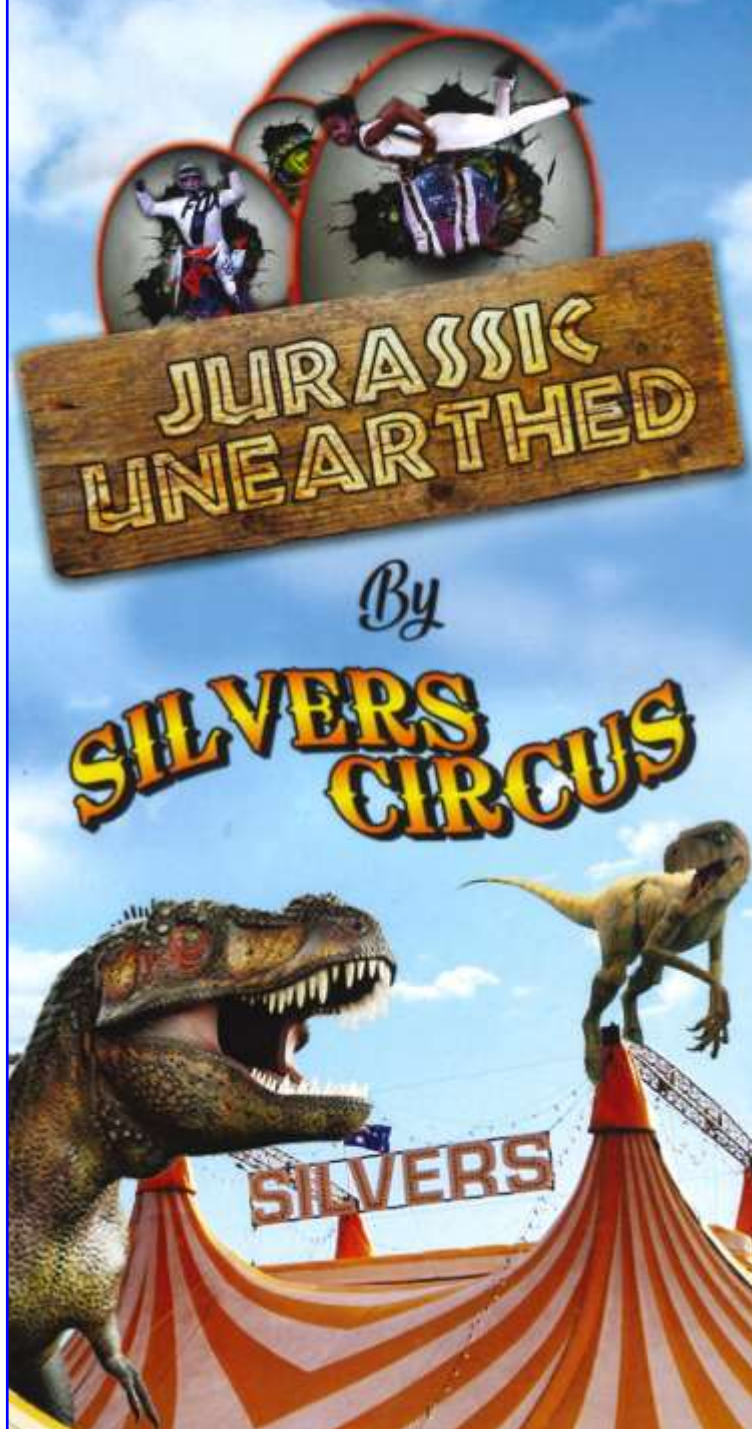
