

### **Pastor's Corner**





"This book of the law shall not depart from your mouth; you shall meditate on it day and night,"so that you may be careful to act in accordance with all that is written in it.

For then you shall make your way prosperous, and then you shall be successful.

I hereby command you: Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed,

for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."

#### Joshua 1: 8-9

his is the Word of the Lord that came to Joshua as he was preparing to lead God's people into the Promised Land. The promise was that God would abide and guide as Joshua meditated on the scriptures, the book of the law. This meant that Joshua had to spend time reading the scriptures and mediating on them, so that the Word would continually be at the forefront of Joshua's thought and guide his actions as he led the people of God. The purpose and the importance of dwelling in the Word of God, the Sacred Scriptures, has not changed! In the gospel we are encouraged to delve even deeper into the scriptures to know Jesus as the Christ and allow the living Word to dwell with us always, to the end of the age.

Word was God."

He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him...

What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people.

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory,

The glory as of a Father's only son, full of grace and truth.

#### John 1: 1-4, 14

During the upcoming months we are going to emphasize dwelling in the Word so that the Word can dwell in us, as disciples of the Kingdom of Jesus Christ. We want to come to know Christ, in order to make him known! This means we must engage in the practice of dwelling in the scripture, the Word of God, to know Jesus and to allow him to instruct us as his disciples in the world. You will note several ways, in this newsletter, we are going to engage the Word through disciple education and formation opportunities beginning Sunday, September 11th. There will be a new Disciple Zone time for the nursery through upper elementary children. There will be a disciple confirmation course for the middle school and junior high age youth. There will be a disciple formation course and practices offered for the high school youth. We will also be offering three Enhanced Disciple Education opportunities for adults on Sunday morning. The new emphasis will be on discipleship formation through engaging the Word of God, that it may produce the activity of God through our discipleship service. We will develop the habit of dwelling in scripture to guide our discipleship practices in the world. If you are learning about Christ, it's fair to assume you'll become more Christlike, and thus he will become more present and visible in the world through your daily life practices. The habit of spending time knowing God through scripture will translate into making God and his reign known in the world.

To this missional end, I invite you into the weekly practice of reading the scripture lesson listed for each week of worship, (See separate article), and then ask ourselves four key questions.

What does it say about God? What does it say about us as people?

If this is the Word of God in scripture, what is it saying we should do as his people and his disciples in the world?

How can we then do one thing the scripture tells us to do during the upcoming week?

This is a simple practice that doesn't take too much time (10–15 minutes of reading and reflection). I believe the results will be not only in having the Word dwell more deeply in each of us, but the real fruit will be in the application of what we hear and put into practice as God's witnesses to this age of world.

Please join me in this spiritual practice to enhance the discipleship of our congregation for the Lord!



themed decorations, food, games, crafts and a treasure hunt. Don't miss this adventure of both land and sea!




New This Fall!

LuAnn's workshops focus on tapping further into the spiritual dimension of our existence and engaging in practices to enhance positive energy in our lives.

On Sunday evening, October 16th, at 6:30pm in the Wallace Chapel, LuAnn will return to conduct a new seminar relating to Chakras. Based on ancient Ayuvedic concepts, chakras represent various forms of the spiritual energy within us.

#### **Council's Corner**

Please note the following announcements from Wallace Council:

- The Council took action on the retirement request of Ron Bruscemi as Facilities Manager. He will conclude his service on September 30th and we will recognize him for over 18 years of service to the congregation on Sunday, September 11th.
- We will be adding two large screen monitors in the sanctuary for use in worship services. They should be installed in September.
- We will be replacing the sanctuary windows in October. We will continue to make sanctuary improvements during the upcoming years as we evaluate the space and create a master plan for renovation.
- The Transept area will undergo a renovation process with the removal of the pews and the addition of padded chair seating. This will make the area a multi-use space for new worship service offerings, spiritual practice opportunities (Labyrinth Space), hospitality options, exhibit space, and teaching opportunities.
- A roof for the New Vertical Columbarium will be installed in August, with the potential of further expansion of two more vertical Columbarium units as needed.
- The horizontal (original) Columbarium will undergo a restoration process in the Fall. The Council established the price of \$1,200 per unit for the new vertical Columbarium. A promotion of the available Columbarium space will be made in the fall, once improvements have been completed.
