Tech Tip Tow Bar Safety Tips By Lawrence Turner

For those of us that tow, the tow bar and all of its connecting points can easily be taken for granted. Here are a few suggestions to help insure a safe trip. 1. Be sure that the weight capacity of the tow bar is sufficient for the vehicle being towed. 2. The tow bar to tow hitch connection should be no greater than 4 inches in height differential. 3. Make sure that the tow bar arms move freely within the tubes and that the arm locks work properly. 4. Periodically check the base plate mounting bolts for tightness on the towed vehicle. 5. Check the attaching pins for rust and that none of the holes are elongated. 6. Check and double check transmission shifter and ignition switch are in the proper position. Also make sure the parking brake is released after making all tow bar attachments. 7. Make sure your turn signal and brake lights operate properly.
