


Author Profile

Author of *The Scarlet Letter* and The House of the Seven Gables, Nathaniel Hawthorne (1804–64) wrote tales that lie at the heart of the American Romantic movement. 

A leading figure in the Irish Arts and Crafts Movement, Harry Clarke (1889–1931) began his career as an award-winning stained glass artist. In a style that recalls Aubrey Beardsley and Kay Nielsen, he illustrated the works of Hans Christian Andersen, Poe, Goethe, and others.

Charles Perrault (1628–1703), a lawyer and member of the French Academy, attained immortality with his 1697 publication of *Tales of Mother Goose*, a new and skillful treatment of traditional folklore that served as inspiration for the Brothers Grimm.

Quiller-Couch, a distinguished Cambridge don, recounts seven tales of enchantment: "Minon-Minette," "Felicia, or The Pot of Pinks," "Rosanie, or The Inconstant Prince," "The Man Who Never Laughed," "John and the Ghosts," "The Czarina's Violet," and the title tale. The stories are illuminated by 23 color plates by Kay Nielsen, a Golden Age of Illustration master whose exotic Art Nouveau images recall the style of Aubrey Beardsley.
