There's been an internal call within JACL national, and this week I'll be sending the word out to journalism job lists and to various individuals who have been referred to me. Carol and I hope to have some candidates identified very soon, and then it's up to Carol and the JACL's hiring committee at the National Board, to choose the talent who will take the PC to the next level of excellence.

I have every hope that the PC will recover from the loss of its terrific leadership and that JACL will continue to support the important work of the PC. 
