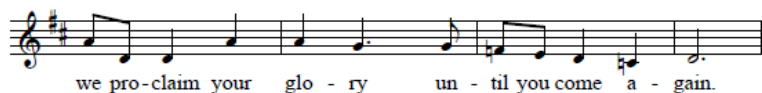
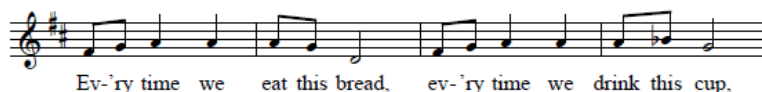
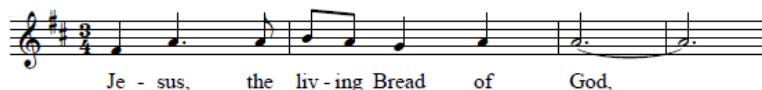

# Bread of Life Discourse

## CATECHESIS ON THE MASS

WEEK 3 OF 5

### GLORIA

The **Introductory Rites** take on a celebratory character on the occasions when the **Gloria** is sung. The *Gloria in excelsis* (*Glory to God in the highest*) is a most ancient and venerable hymn by which the Church, gathered in the Holy Spirit, glorifies and entreats God the Father and the Lamb (GIRM 53). It praises God and signals the festivity of the day. It is prescribed for Sundays, except during the seasons of Advent and Lent, and it is omitted on the rare instances when **All Souls Day** falls on a Sunday. It is to be sung or said for solemnities and feasts on the calendar, and it is appropriate for “special celebrations of a more solemn character.” These might include Ordinations, Weddings, and Confirmations.

The text probably comes from the Oriental Churches. The first line of the hymn comes from the Gospel account of the birth of Jesus; therefore, many have deduced that the hymn has its origins in Christmas celebrations. There is an instruction that “heads should bow at the name of Jesus in the middle of the text” and “at the mention of the Trinity” at the end (GIRM 275a), but few people observe this forgotten (if ever communicated) teaching.

Reminded of our call for **unity** and **active participation** at Mass, perhaps the mention of instruction above might enhance our intentionality behind this hymn of praise and petition to God, serving equally as an invitation to those who do not sing the **Gloria** to begin doing so. God deserves to hear the loudest response from His creatures!

### COLLECT

When the priest celebrant prays the **Collect** (kol-ect), from the Latin, *collecta*, formerly and more commonly known as the **Opening Prayer**, it is the gathering of the people together, and he is “collecting into one” the prayers of the individual members of the assembly. The invitation, “**Let us pray**,” is quite ancient and even has roots in pre-Christian Jewish prayer. It leads everyone into a period of silence, and the silence following this invitation is integral to its purpose.

During this period of sacred silence, the faithful are to formulate in their hearts the prayers they hold this day,

the prayers they bring to this Mass. The priest gathers these prayers of the assembly into one, addressing a formal, structured, and, often, very ancient text to God. The people answer, “**Amen**.”

This brings the **Introductory Rites** to their conclusion as the assembly that has gathered in song, signed itself with the cross, greeted one another, acknowledged individual faults, and praised God, now gets down to business.

A traditional Roman Collect is **carefully** constructed. It contains: **1.)** an invocation that names God; **2.)** a phrase that amplifies who God is or what God has done; **3.)** a petition that names the request; **4.)** a purpose that expresses the goal of the request; **5.)** a motive that clarifies the reasonableness of the petition; and **6.)** a concluding doxology. Consider these elements contained in this weekend’s **Collect** for the **Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**:

**Almighty ever-living God,  
whom, taught by the Holy Spirit,  
we dare to call our Father,  
bring, we pray, to perfection in our hearts  
the spirit of adoption as your sons and daughters,  
that we may merit to enter into the inheritance  
which you have promised.  
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,  
who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the  
Holy Spirit,  
one God, for ever and ever.**

The doxology makes the prayer *to* the Father, *through* the Son, *in* the Holy Spirit. When the people answer “**Amen**” to the **Collect**, they are saying “yes” to its contents. Toward the end of the **Collect** (as the doxology begins) the priest’s gesture of bringing his outstretched hands in and together expresses the reality of his “collecting” the prayers of the people.

The **Introductory Rites**, alone, demonstrate the fact that there is great intentionality behind everything we do in the Church and how we worship publically. The reasons the Church goes out of her way with gestures, words, and translations, are, because what we say and what we do, says something of what we believe.

# Welcome Back to Saint Charles Borromeo Parish School

## 2015-2016 School Year - Merciful Like the Father

**FAMILY FOLDERS:** The folders that contain significant information and forms for the opening of the school year will be available for pick up in the school office beginning **Monday, August 17** from 8:00 AM until 2:00 PM as well as during Curriculum Night. All the information contained in the family folders will also be on the school website and Ascend SMS. Class lists will only be posted on Ascend SMS for grades one through grade eight. This is an additional way that we are keeping kids safe.

### **CURRICULUM NIGHT: Monday, August 24, 2015 - Grades 1-8**

- **Grades 7 & 8** – meeting in gym at 6:00 PM followed by classroom visits until 7:30 PM (grades 7 & 8 get their locker assignments and combination locks on this night)
- **Grades 5 & 6** – meeting in gym at 6:30 PM followed by classroom visits until 8:00 PM
- **Grades 1 through 4** – from 7:00 – 8:00 PM, families may visit classrooms in twenty minute increments for a presentation by the homeroom teacher
  - 7:00-7:20 PM (1<sup>st</sup>), 7:20-7:40 PM (2<sup>nd</sup>), and 7:40-8:00 PM (3<sup>rd</sup>)
  - Usually the first two sessions are most crowded
  - Presentation format is in response to parent request for additional information about curriculum and expectations for year
  - Due format, there is little time for “visiting” former and current teachers
  - Respectfully, hallways should be quiet so all can hear the presentations in the classrooms
  - Any private conferences that are required should be scheduled once the school year has begun – you and your child deserve such confidentiality and attention
  - Be sure that your child’s name is on all supplies prior to dropping them off



**PRESCHOOL:** Parents/guardians will receive an August mailing detailing their special schedule for the opening of preschool classes. Preschool will be phased-in during the week of August 31, with parents/guardians joining their children to learn more about the preschool program.

**KINDERGARTEN:** Parents/guardians will receive a letter prior to August 14 detailing a special schedule for the opening of kindergarten classes. We call it “staggered entrance” on August 26 – parents come to school with their kindergarten child for a scheduled time to hear information in a small group setting about the kindergarten year. The first full day of kindergarten will be August 27.

**GRADES 1-8:** Students are to report for school on Wednesday, August 26 beginning at 7:45 AM. Students should be in their school uniform and report to the designated place for their grade level. Check the [Opening of School Information 2015-2016](#) that is posted on the school website: [www.saintcharlesschool.org](http://www.saintcharlesschool.org). **ALL STUDENTS MUST PACK A LUNCH THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL.**

**SCHOOL SUPPLIES:** School supply lists are posted on our school website and app. Children’s name should be on all supplies prior to the first day of school. Specific “bookstore” items such as canvas pencil pouches, canvas book bags, laddie pencils, etc. are able to be purchased on Curriculum Night as well as kindergarten staggered entrance day and each morning of the school year in the office.
