Hi everyone,

Another successful snowmobile season has come and gone. This Newsletter will capture some of things that NLSF has participated in throughout the 2016-2017 season with emphasis on some of the season's highlights.

HIGHLIGHTS

2016-2017

- Season Start and End Dates are a Highlight in itself with a Start date of December 27th and a finish date of April 25th for some clubs.
- Western/Northern NL, as of May, was still playing with 15ft of base snow in the backcountry and only an hour away from home so the season was far from done for the adventurist.
- Central and Eastern Experienced extended snowmobiling seasons with an early start and a late end, with all clubs grooming into the month of April and beyond.
- NLSF has experienced a bounce back from a crippling start to the season
 with hurricane Mathew taking out 200 plus kms of trail on the main
 artery crossing Central NL but thanks to our Federal Disaster Relief Fund,
 the Emergency Measures department and Parks Canada/NL along with
 NLSF clubs collaborating with municipal leaders the trail system was
 safely restored by February for a record sales season for NLSF.
- 17 Clubs were active and successful this season with the potential for past clubs to return to the fold.
- ACOA Partnerships Economic Impact Assessment showing our potential going forward and the opportunities that exist to make this a \$100 million dollar annual industry for the province of NL. While the project is late in delivering the final product, our funders have agreed to put a greater focus on capturing industry spending (50 Dealers) to better position the NLSF and its members for growing and promoting the snowmobiling product in NL. Report is due in August of 2017
- Terra Nova Trestle Completion NLSF with support from the CCSO AND OHVA secured the \$65,000.00 in funding necessary to complete the Trestle (Total Project Cost \$650,000.00) connecting 300,000 of our provincial population to the trail system going East and West.

-4 Employees approved – Brush Clearing, Bridge Repairs, Signage placement and trail safety auditing -employees were absolutely exceptional, go anywhere, do anything, safe, mature and snowmobile enthusiasts who loved the outdoors. \$4500 in participant support, \$4200 in project cost supports, signage, supplies, wood, chain saws, tools, etc. - \$50,000.00 project in kind. With others pending.

Other Funding Partners...

Town of Gander – KSA / GASA Bridge Project - \$7,000.00 In funding from Town of Gander and \$10,000 from the KSA Club In partnership with NLSF to link both the Kittiwake and Gander Club. Final request for Quotes has gone out with stipulations of completion by Dec 1, 2017

Nalcor In Kind Support – 5 bridges approximately 25,000.00 along with countless hours of heavy equipment support to help share roads for both project development and providing NLSF with a groomed trail in more than 5 project areas throughout the island.

EMO – Green Bay Repairs -\$15,000.00 – Remaining Provincial (Non T'Railway) damages estimate and repairs are ongoing with completion set for this summer/fall in ETN, NDSA, JTB, HWL AND WSR club areas.

OHVA - \$20,000.00 Grant that will go towards Repairs in Terra Nova club

area to allow for groomer to safely pass over Bridge, with new rails.

Gros Morne National Park – Signage placed in all 3 Warm up Shelters promoting safe and accurate park instructions as a support to enforcement and educating riders to avoid fines and going off the trail.

- CCSO Canadian Council of Snowmobile Organizations 1st meetings were held March, in Ottawa, NLSF discussed Governance, Bylaws, Policies and ways to source funding to better positon NLSF for groomer modernization and long term trail maintenance strategies. Also met with MP Gudie Hutchings to support NLSF.
- Tourism NL Renewed membership with anticipated Economic Impact assessment to support winter tourism operators and how they can best maximize the revenue potential from alignment with NLSF. Our goal is to support members by offering quality trails and grooming and help businesses and stakeholders involved in the multi million dollar industry to understand what the industry needs based on recent studies and user group surveys. Teamwork makes the Dream work.

NLSF WHATS NEXT...

GROOMER REPLACEMENT STRATEGY -

NLSF is currently reviewing industry wide manufacturers for availability, pricing and options for financing new groomers to modernize our fleet and improve the groomed trail product being offered throughout the island. Once all details are secured from Manufacturers based on inventory available, we will submit to ACOA and the Province for Funding support in the NLSF Fleet modernization initiative.

Trail Maintenance Repair Process -

Deadline for submissions was March 30th (Projects) and April 30th (Maintenance) With feedback from all clubs in need of trail maintenance submitted the focus will be on working closely with all clubs and proceed with cost review and determine priorities and scheduling for completion by volunteer or use of contractor etc. Our focus will be on the following off season goals and objectives;

- Trail Development
 Proposals LTO'S, Permit requests, reroutes, major planning wish lists
- Trail Damages Washouts, Storm Damage (Claims), Culverts etc
- Bridge Replacement and / or Major Repair requests

- Decking, Runners and Lumber requests
- Signage Requests
- Vegetation Control Requests
