Nomination and Registration Deadlines

The deadlines for nominating your players, coaches and student assistants are coming up soon, so don't miss out on getting them the recognition they deserve. Below is a list of awards along with their nomination deadlines. All nomination forms are on the TABC web site.

UIL All-Region: (February 17) These are for both boys and girls. The all-region nomination form nominates your player for all-region, all-state, Player of the Year, Mr. or Miss Basketball and all-star team so you only need to send it once.

Private School All-State: (March 7) These are for both boys and girls. The all-state nomination form nominates your player for all-state, player of the year, Mr. or Miss Basketball and all-star team so you only need to send it once.

Assistant Coach of the Year: (April 1) These are for both boys and girls and both public and private schools. Make sure your assistant coach is a member before nominating them.

Middle School Coach of the Year: (April 1) These are for both boys and girls and both public and private schools. Make sure your Middle School or Junior High coach is a member before nominating them.

Student Assistant of the Year: (April 1) These are for both boys and girls and both public and private schools. Nominate your managers, scorebook keepers and student trainers.

3 Point and Free Throw Winners: (April 1) Team and Individual 3 Point and Free Throw nominations will be done on the TABC web site this year. Go to the TABC web site at www.tabchoops.org and scroll down to TABC Awards and then click on 3Point – FT.

Scholarships: (April 1) TABC awards 16 scholarships annually. Be sure to check the boxes for all scholarships for which the player is eligible.

TABC Clinic Pre-Registration: (May 1) You can avoid long lines at check in and save \$10 by pre-registering for the TABC Clinic. Registration forms and complete payment must be received by the TABC office by May 1.

Landon Condiff, a 6'1 guard for Callisburg (10-3A) boys, had a monster start to the season. He averaged 40 points per game for the month of November for Coach Shad Reed. After their 4-0 start in November the Wildcats haven't let up as they are now 17-0, 5-0 in district. Landon hasn't let up either as he is still averaging 35 ppg, 8 rpg, and 4 apg as Callisburg is moving up in the rankings.

Emily Bunger of Rankin (10-1A) girls has 44 treys as of this writing and will continue to add to her total as she is averaging 23 points per game for the Red Devils of coach Eric Simmonds. Emily was the league MVP last year and leads the Rankin squad, which is currently 14-0 and ranked # 5.

K.J. Lewis of El Paso Chapin (1-5A) is ranked by ESPN as the # 21 sophomore in the nation. He leads the top 15 state ranked Huskies (10-0) of Coach Rodney Lewis and is averaging 28 points per game.

Jeremy Mills moved from 5A Grapevine to 1A McMullen County (32-1A) and South Texas seems to suit the former Houston area coach. The Cowboys are currently 14-1 with their only setback to 3A Jourdanton. They are ranked #6 in class 1A boys.

Crosby boys (21-5A) are currently a top 20 state ranked team due to the leadership of Sean "PJ" Haggerty, a 6'2 junior. He is one of the leading scorers in the state at 34.8 point per game. The Cougars are coached by Edwin Egans.

Christopher Flores had a career game earlier in the season for Rocksprings (31-1A). He had 29 points, 24 rebounds, 10 assists, 16 steals against 3A Ingram Tom Moore. While that helped add to his 24 ppg average he is not the team leader. Christian Montoya averages 30 ppg and has already made 55 treys for Coach Eddie Walker. The Rockcrushers are 10-2 and top 10 state ranked in 1A.

Grant Rein, a sophomore at Grapevine Faith Academy (TAPPS 1-5A) is one of the state leaders with 56 three point field goals so far. The Lions of Coach Matt Sayman are a top ranked TAPPS team (10-6).

Kaiya Wynn of Foster girls (24-5A) is one of the reasons the Lady Falcons are moving up in the rankings and now are # 12. The Tennessee commit is averaging 29.6 points per game and is a state leader with 114 made free throws. Coach Savitria Williams-Smith is the coach and Foster is 12-2, 7-0 in district.

Longtime TABC member and past president Ron Vick wants to let all his TABC friends know that he is retiring after 37 years. He has served TABC in many capacities and still does radio play by play broadcasts in the Panhandle. The Texas Tech graduate coached and taught in Lubbock ISD his entire career most of which was at Lubbock High School.

M.J. Thomas is leading the Calvert (29-1A) boys to a 9-1 start and # 3 ranking by averaging 21.6 points per game. The Trojans coach is his father, Michael Thomas, who played for his father Henry Thomas at Calvert on a state finalist team in 1995. Henry had successful stops at Calvert, Denton, Lewisville and Flower Mound and now coaches at Lone Star North in Gainseville (TAPPS 2-3A). Henry also has 2 daughters that are head coaches, Jennisha Thomas-Murray (Houston Wisdom) and A'Travia Thomas (Denton). The Thomases make basketball and TABC a family affair and we appreciate them all.

Yorktown junior point guard Seely Metting led the Kitty Kats to a 24-10 area championship last year and was TABC all-region. Early this year she scored her 1,000th career point and Yorktown has picked up where they left off with a 12-0 start and a top 10 state ranking. Coach Val Acree has all five starters back and plans to go even farther in 2021. Seely's action shot is below.

The state rankings will be updated on the TABC web site every Monday through the end of the regular season and are also sent to media outlets via the Associated Press. TABC ranks the top 25 teams in each UIL class and the top 10 teams in each private school class. That is a total of 440 boys and girls teams that are recognized in the rankings each week. The rankings are based on the information we have gathered from coaches around the state. Our goal with the UIL schools is to have the four teams that will reach the state tournament ranked in the top ten and to have the sixteen teams that will make the regional tournaments ranked in the top 25. We need your help to ensure we have as much information on which to base the rankings as possible.

If your team is ranked, please send in your weekly results including opponents and scores. If your team is not ranked but you feel they deserve to be, please send in your season results to date including opponents and scores.
