

#### Ferdinand Alexander Porsche: A Lifetime of Design

Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche AG, Stuttgart, is mourning Professor Ferdinand Alexander Porsche. The Honorary President of the Supervisory Board died on 5 April 2012 in Salzburg, aged 76.

Ferdinand Alexander Porsche was born in Stuttgart on 11 December 1935, the oldest son of Dorothea and Ferry Porsche. Even his childhood was shaped by cars, and he spent much of his time in the engineering offices and development workshops of his grandfather Ferdinand Porsche. In 1943 the family accompanied the Porsche company's move to Austria, where he went to school in Zell am See. After returning to Stuttgart in 1950, he attended the private Waldorf School. After leaving school, he enrolled at the Ulm School of Design.

In 1958, F.A. Porsche, as he was known by his colleagues, joined the engineering office of what was then Dr. Ing. h.c. F. Porsche KG. He soon proved his great talent for design by sculpting the first model of a successor to the 356 model line out of plasticine. In 1962 he took over as head of the Porsche design studio, creating a worldwide furor one year later with the Porsche 901 (or 911). With the Porsche 911, F.A. Porsche created a sports car icon whose timeless and classical form survives to this very day in what is now the seventh 911 generation. However, in addition to passenger cars, F.A. Porsche also concerned himself with designing the sports cars of the 1960s. His best-known designs include the Type 804 Formula One racing car or the Porsche 904 Carrera GTS, now considered to be one of the most beautiful racing cars ever.

In 1972 he founded the "Porsche Design Studio" in Stuttgart. In the decades that followed, he designed numerous classic gentlemen's accessories such as watches, spectacles and writing implements that achieved global recognition under the "Porsche Design" brand. In parallel, with his team, he designed a plethora of industrial products, household appliances and consumer durables for internationally renowned clients under the brand "Design by F.A. Porsche". A strong and clear design concept typifies all product designs created in his design studio to date. The credo of his design work was: "Design must be functional and functionality has to be translated visually into aesthetics, without gags that have to be explained first." F.A. Porsche: "A coherently designed product requires no adornment; it should be enhanced by its form alone." The design's appearance should be readily comprehensible and not detract from the product and its function. His conviction was: "Good design should be honest." We were seated in the private candle lit balcony loft that overlooks the cozy main floor setting below.

Chef John made a special menu especially for us entitled... "Welcome Olympic Penninsula Porshe Club"...the extra N and the omission of the C were the ONLY flaws of the evening. (We all had a good chuckle over this NC...at no charge J). The menu gave us a choice of six starters, and four specially prepared salads that were included with any of the seven entrée selections.

Some of us started the evenings fare with something you've never eaten or maybe even heard of....what do get when you combine parmesan cheese, cream cheese, eggs, heavy cream, bacon, onion, blue cheese, Tabasco sauce and bread crumbs with a prep time of 20 minutes and a cooking time of 5 hours.

It's a starter course entitled Savory Blue Cheese Cake! A cheese cake for a starter...oh but wait a "savory" blue cheese cake served warm? But what does savory mean... "Savory", classically, means something non-sweet. All I can say is that it was delicious. Other starters included Gravlaks, Spicy Clams, and Coconut Mussels. I believe that JR and Tina being the seafarers they are... loved the Mussels and Clams.

After the specialty salads were devoured Maryann was out asking who was feeling lucky and wanted raffle tickets. With the top prizes being rocks glasses and coffee mugs I didn't think there would be many takers... but I guess that everyone must have been thinking about the consolation prize of paper money....not much buying power, but the \$30 with much hooting and hollering was graciously accepted by Tina.

Main courses arrived on an eclectic collection of plates. Brian, Brooks, myself and several others raved over the house specialty Boeuf a la' Bourguignon (Beef Burgundy). In the culinary arts, the word Bourguignon refers to a recipe that is prepared in the style of the French region of Burgundy. This a braised dish meaning: To cook by browning in fat, then simmering in a covered container.

Seldom has a definition been so inadequate. Shouldn't the definition of braise include words like "sublime," "transcendent," "gorgeous," "silky," or just plain "delicious"? Clearly dictionary writers have not eaten braised meats, or they wouldn't be so adjectively-challenged.

A braise done right is a thing of beauty and joy to devour. And to eat the Bistro's signature dish is to consume comfort and deliciousness on a plate. It's the kind of meal that assaults your senses and your memories... conjuring up the sounds of your grandmother's kitchen, or the feeling of swinging your legs under the dining room chair when you were seven, or the first time you ever had mashed potatoes.

The ingenious braising process not only yields fork-tender strands of juicy, flavorful meat, it also produces the most heavenly dark and rich sauce to pour over it. The rich sauce has subtle hints of the generous amounts of carrots, onions, mushrooms, bacon, red wine and of course, the beef chunks, that combine forces for hours over low heat. The sauce alone was good enough to lick off the back of your spoon — repeatedly and joyfully.

Pete and Amy both loved the Stuffed Chicken Breast with aged Gouda, wild mushrooms and sage. Barbara thought that the pan seared Pacific Red Rock- fish with bell peppers and ginger in a spicy curry sauce was excellent. June and Susan both enjoyed the Goat Cheese Ravioli in a roasted garlic cream sauce.

Maryann had the Grilled Wild Gulf Prawn Skewers marinated with lemon and garlic served over Orzo Pilaf. And she enjoyed Truffles for dessert. Later she told me, "They were both delicious. I felt they did a great job handling our rowdy group and I liked having our own room. I would definitely go back."

And John James summed it up best by saying, "Great food, excellent service and a fun time. I would definitely return to the Bay Street Bistro.

So maybe next year maybe we can return with enough OPR-PCA members to reserve the entire Bistro...and so it is with food and a "foodie".

Oh, going back to the special menu for the Porshe Club....I finally found out what that is:

1.) The misspelling of the word Porsche, which is a luxury sports car. 2.) The name of a person who is comparable to the car (sleek, fast, expensive, etc.) if a person is referred to as a porshe, they are top of the line... not many others compare. They are the best of the best. 3.) A term for describing something/someone that is better than the rest in terms of looks, quality, and great handling. Wow, Porshe is as porshe as that sweet Porsche. i.e. That person is as awesome as the car. Ah yes the Porsche....the car that nobody needs, but everybody wants!

# **Technology on the Road – Bill Elwell Steering in the Right Direction**

The word steer is most often used as a verb in reference to directing the path of a vehicle or guiding a course of action. Sure, some of you will point out that, used as a noun, steer is a reference to a particular type of male bovine but that is really steering us in the wrong direction! Yeah, you had to see that one coming.

Steering lends itself to many metaphors. We find steering committees that provide guidance to organizations. We can steer our lives in the right direction or we can steer clear of obstacles that life puts in our way. One of the better known steering metaphors is Plato's "ship of state". Plato compared governance of a city-state to piloting or steering a vessel. You can see "ship of state" used throughout history right up to my favorite which comes from a British TV show where it is said that, "the Ship of State is the only ship that leaks from the top". But getting back to steering, my favorite phrase is "power steering". It carries a sense of... well... power!

I think that most of us understand the idea behind power steering. We know it makes turning the steering wheel easier. Most of us know that there's a thing under the hood called a power steering pump that is the heart of the system. Some of us know that there is fluid in the power steering system and that we should check the level periodically. But I'll bet there's very few of us that can quickly find the location of the reservoir in our cars. And there's probably fewer still who can explain how power steering works. I can't help you find your power steering reservoir but I can help you understand power steering.

To tell this story we have to start with plain old steering systems. A steering system takes the rotational motion of the steering wheel as it turns and converts it into a linear side to side motion. Through the use of a series of linkages and arms, that side-to-side motion is used to change the direction of the front wheels.

The oldest steering systems are called worm and sector systems and use a screw and worm gear arrangement to convert rotary to linear motion.

Many of us have heard of recirculating ball systems which are variations of the worm and sector systems where ball bearings are used between the teeth of the worm and sector gears. This greatly reduces the friction inherent in a worm and section design.

But the most common steering system is rack and pinion. The pinion is a gear at the end of the steering shaft that engages with a linear gear called a rack.

Heavier vehicles, wider tires, and front wheel drive all contribute to making steering more difficult. Power steering systems that make steering easier date back to the late 1800's. But we really didn't see practical applications until WWII where it was used on heavy military trucks. Power steering first appeared in passenger cars in the 1950's. Today it's rare to see a car without power steering.

Most power steering systems are hydraulic. They include a reservoir to hold the hydraulic fluid, a pump to pressurize the system, a valve that senses the force being used to turn the steering wheel, and a hydraulic cylinder that applies force to some portion of the steering system.

The operation of the system is pretty simple. As you start to turn the wheel, the system senses the force you are applying to the wheel and the direction you are trying to turn. A valve is opened to allow pressure into the correct side of the hydraulic cylinder. The hydraulic cylinder pushes the steering mechanism in the correct direction thus helping you steer the car. To be clear, power steering is really power *assisted* steering. The steering wheel still operates the steering mechanism. The power assist simply lends some muscle to help you out.

The device that senses how hard you are trying to turn the wheel and regulates the pressure in the hydraulic cylinder is a clever design. In most cases a torsion bar is built into the steering column. The harder you turn the wheel the more the torsion bar twists. That twisting action is what opens and closes the valve that drives the hydraulic cylinder.

These days we are seeing changes in power steering applications that revolve around the pump. In most cases, the power steering pump is driven by the engine using an accessory belt. That arrangement leaves room for improvement. We need power steering the most when the car is moving slowly or is completely stopped. But the pump is driven by the engine and it creates more pressure when the engine is running faster. That is exactly the opposite of what we need. The result is an inefficient system that we have put up with for years.

With today's focus on efficiency we are seeing a number of new options. Variable assist power steering has a valve that reduces the hydraulic pressure as the vehicle increases speed. A better solution is one that drives the hydraulic pump with an electric motor instead of using the engine. Porsche uses this hybrid electric/hydraulic technique today. Finally, full electric power steering does away with the hydraulics entirely and

uses an electric motor to assist the steering. The Prius uses an electrically assisted steering system.

One of the very nice features of both electrically and hydraulically assisted power steering is that there is a direct mechanical linkage between the steering wheel and the steering mechanism. If the power assist system fails, you can still steer the car. OK, it's REALLY tough to steer but you can do it.

Technology marches forward and we're hearing more and more about "drive by wire" systems (often called steer by wire). In a drive by wire system there is no mechanical linkage between the steering wheel and the steering mechanism. The steering wheel performs the same function as the steering wheel on a computer game. It provides information to a computer about where the wheel is positioned and it provides some level of force feedback to the driver. An electric or hydraulic mechanism controlled by the steering computer actually steers the front wheels.

A drive by wire system can enable all kinds of cool applications. For example without a physical linkage to the steering system, you don't really need a steering wheel any more. You could use a joystick or push buttons instead of a wheel.

Drive by wire would also allow you to make changes to the behavior of the steering system that you can't make today. For example, changing the steering ratio could be as simple as changing a value in a setup menu.

While drive by wire already exists in some vehicles like forklifts, it may be a while before we see it widely deployed on the road. The obvious concern is that without a direct linkage between the steering wheel and the steering system, a steering system failure might leave you unable to control the car.

So if you haven't learned anything else from reading this, at least when someone talks about "steer by wire" you'll know they aren't talking about a cow and an electric fence.

#### At the Track – Jeff Smith

Soggy ground? Well they say there is a first time for everything. First time I've heard of a race being called off because of excessive moisture and soft ground. Only in the Great Northwest, or is it really the Great Northwet? The first race at The Ridge was scheduled for March but was cancelled for safety reasons by the track owners. After the record breaking rains in March it was determined that the runoff areas and shoulders were too soft and presented a serious danger of rollover or severe damage if a car went off course. Oh well, always seems to be a few snags getting a new race track going. As it is they have made amazing progress in such a short time. A racing school is up and running and track days are being held. Looks like the first race will now be in May.

Very good news for Pacific Raceway. King County Council approved enabling legislation for the raceway's expansion plans. It's the starting point for plans to invest \$130 million dollars. The development to include two drag strips, an oval track, upgrades to the road course and 1 million square feet of commercial and industrial space. EIS is next. Of course this is a long term project but great prospects for the area and motorsports enthusiasts.

There is a change in how PCA/PNWR manages car numbers at their Drivers Education (DE) events. When you sign up for a DE PNWR assigns you a permanent number that you use in every event. This year they are encouraging drivers who participate regularly to purchase a set of larger numbers that you apply to your car (can be either magnetic or static cling). They want 6 inches or larger and the number contrasting with the background (i.e. Black on Yellow). This is in response to turn worker feedback that the smaller white self adhesive numbers the club had been using were ok but could be easier to read. For the drivers that do not want permanent numbers there will be larger laser number sets with removable adhesive similar to last year's numbers for sale at \$5 a set.

944 Cup — With the cancelation of the first race at the The Ridge our first points race is May 19 at Pacific Raceway. We will still get a chance to race at The Ridge later on July 28-29 at the SCCA's "Inaugural Romp on the Ridge" Double Regional. About the only action for our Northwest 944 Cup drivers so far is Mark and Lyle took their 944s to PNWR Autocross in March. They deduced from Lyle's better times that taller and wider tires are not better for autocross and gearing/acceleration worked best at Bremerton that day.

Things have certainly changed in the racing world economics and by extension to our 944 Cup series. Trying times right now, but there's always hope for better days ahead. Everybody is doing what they can to keep it as affordable as possible. Back in the better days (2009) we had a great Hoosier tire contingency – full set of tires for each 944 Cup race win. But it disappeared in 2010. Goodyear has just stepped up this year as our national title sponsor and with a program of 2 tires to give a way for each of 2 races each weekend. Probably a moot point for us this year as 10 cars is required for each race. I don't see our NW Chapter qualifying with enough cars this year. But it's a start and we just need to keep working on building our numbers. There some other sponsors this year but they are mainly for prizes at the yearend Nationals.

Other miscellaneous 944 Cup related news: We welcome a new driver to our ranks this year. Tony is an experienced racer from ICSCC. Mike Adams has a new car (well, actually a new body with all the good

stuff transferred over from his totaled car) that is almost ready to go. He is trying to get it to the May 19 race. Our local chapter director, Greg Fordahl, has moved his shop and is busy with Alex Jobs Racing's new Lotus ALSM program. Many of you know of Alex Jobs numerous successes in sports car racing with Porsche and now they are fielding the ALMS newest GT competitor, Lotus Evora GT

### 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Chili Cook Off


