#### Letter from the Governor – Billy McGarry

Hello again from the Hill!

In my letter this month, I'd like to first thank the many, many volunteers that have done everything from running the Kid's Carnival, to doing landscaping, to doing repairs, to running events and raffles, to volunteering their time, effort, ideas and yes, even their money to help us reach our goals in the past, and going forward. This Lodge would not be where we are today without all of your efforts.

This was top of mind with me as I sat down to write this as I had just returned from the MA/RI convention where Regional manager Scotty Fiske gave a report on some of the speeches which were presented at the International Convention in Nashville. With all of the work we have done over the last couple of years, building the Lodge up financially, and literally (in terms of repairs and improvements), one of the areas that we have devoted too little focus on perhaps, is fundraising for Mooseheart and Moosehaven. The WOTM have done a great job at meeting their financial obligations, and we have met ours as well, but we can always do better. More of our events will have the proceeds earmarked for Mooseheart and Moosehaven, as well as the New England Home and Gimme 5 going forward. It's important to remember that the Moose exists with the primary goal of providing the necessary resources for the continued support and maintenance of the Mooseheart Child City & School and the Moosehaven retirement community. This is something that we as a board, and you as members, should keep in mind.

In the spirit of keeping us moving forward, I also wanted to encourage you to take an active part in something that interests you at the Lodge. I think it's the events and programs that we offer that make this Lodge special. I often think to myself, "why would anyone want to pay membership dues to an organization that offers nothing more than cheap drinks?" I don't think they would, and I know that is not why you continue to remain members. We, as a Lodge, need to provide fraternalism, a comfortable, friendly environment, and activities that our members would not be able to get anywhere but here.
