4-H PROJECT REGULATIONS

- 1. Age eligibility is established as of January 1, 1978.
- 2. To be eligible for district and state awards, the 4-H member must:
 - a. Have been enrolled in 4-H for no less than one (1) year.
 - b. Be enrolled during the current year in the program in which he is competing.
- 3. District winners may be under 14 years of age.
- 4. To be declared a state winner, the 4-H member must:
 - a. Be at least 14 years old and not have passed his 19th birthday by January 1 of the current year except in Dairy Calf, Pre-Teen Canning and Early-Teen Canning.
 - b. Have completed at least one (1) year of 4-H but preferably three (3) or more years including the current year, except in the projects listed in (a) above.
- 5. A 4-H member may submit cumulative records for district and state competition in <u>not more than</u> 2 programs during the same year. A 1977 project record is required when the record is submitted in March, 1978, for district and state judging. A 1978 project record may also be included to show work done for 1978.
- 6. If a creditable project record is not submitted in a project area, no winner will be declared.
- 7. A 4-H member may be declared a state winner in only one 4-H project during the same year (demonstrations are excluded). A 4-H member declared a state cumulative record program winner is not eligible to represent the county in the district or state Fashion Revue.
- 8. A state winner cannot compete again on any level in the same project.
- 9. A previous state winner in a project which did not provide a trip to National 4-H Congress may participate and be declared a state winner in other awards programs.
- 10. A 4-H member who has been awarded a trip to National 4-H Congress may not participate in any other project awards program.
- 11. Alternates who are awarded a state award to replace the original state winner <u>may not</u> compete for the same award again. If the award was a trip to National 4-H Congress, that 4-H'er <u>may not</u> participate in any other 4-H project awards program.
- 12. A 4-H member may attend National 4-H Congress only once.
 - 13. As of December 1, 1977, some donors have not renewed their support contracts or a donor has not yet been secured for some 1978 programs; therefore, should a donor not renew or be secured, the district award will be a certificate and the state award, a \$25 Savings Bond.
 - 14. Bonds and most other state awards will be distributed in September 1978.
 - 15. A 4-H'er may decline a trip to National 4-H Congress and compete in <u>other</u> programs offering a trip in future year, <u>if</u> he notifies the State 4-H Office at least 30 days prior to the date of National 4-H Congress.

These records should be selected on the basis of quality, regardless of sex. Two (2) state winners will be named in Citizenship and Health. The decision to name 1 or 2 state winners in Achievement, Leadership, and Public Speaking is contingent upon sponsorship funds. Only one record per county may be submitted in Personal Appearance and one winner will be declared.

A 4-H'er may receive these awards only once in his/her 4-H career.

4-H DEMONSTRATION REGULATIONS*

1. Age eligibility is established as of January 1, 1978.

- 2. Any 4-H'er, ages 9-19 years, is eligible to be named a district or state winner if he is eligible to compete under the age eligibility established for the demonstration program.
- 3. 4-H members are not eligible, however, to participate in a district contest if by the date of the contest they will have completed a year of training beyond the high school level.
- 4. Members in Automotive Skill Driving must be at least 16 years of age by the time of the contest and must not have passed their 19th birthday by January 1 of the current year.
- 5. A <u>minimum</u> of 5 minutes is <u>recommended</u> and a <u>maximum</u> of 12 minutes is <u>allowed</u> for demonstrations except Public Speaking (7 minutes), and Poultry Barbecue, Pork Cookery, and Beef Char-Grill (2 hours). One point will be deducted from the participant's score for each minute the demonstration is over the time limit.
- 6. Four-H members can compete for awards in no more than 1 demonstration program during any one year. Share-the Fun in 4-H is not considered a demonstration program.
- 7. It is desirable that participants in Poultry Barbecue, Pork Cookery and Beef Char-Grill <u>not</u> participate in Share-the-Fun in 4-H. However, if they do they should first report to and complete the cooking demonstration before participating in Share-the-Fun. Someone should report early to Share-the-Fun that the 4-H'ers will participate later.
- 8. Each county is limited to a maximum of 10 minutes in the Share-the-Fun in 4-H involving no more than 3 acts.
 - 9. A blue, red, or white ribbon is given to every demonstrator. The type of ribbon awarded is based upon the quality of the demonstration. Regardless of the type of ribbon awarded, one demonstrator in each demonstration category will be designated as the district winner and will be eligible to compete on the state level. The only exception to this rule is Share-the-Fun in 4-H in which only blue ribbons are awarded and only <u>selected</u> blue ribbon winners are invited to participate in the State 4-H Talent Show.
- 10. Cash awards, either in full or in part, will not be given to district winner in lieu of the scholarship to attend North Carolina 4-H Congress.
- 11. When the winner cannot attend Congress, the award will be given to the alternate.
- 12. A 4-H'er may, in one calendar year, be awarded only 1 scholarship to North Carolina 4-H Congress.
- 13. Alternates who are awarded a trip or a state award to replace the state winner may not compete for the same award again.
- 14. Four-H members may continue to compete in a particular demonstration category until declared state winner. They are then no longer eligible to participate in the same program but may participate in others. The same demonstration can be repeated; however, the individual's personal development will be much greater if the demonstration is revised and improved.
- 15. As of December 1, 1977, some donors have not renewed their support contracts or a donor has not been secured for 1978; therefore, should a donor not renew or be secured, the district award will be a certificate and the state award, a \$25 Savings Bond for each winner.

<u>NORTH CAROLINA 4-H CONGRESS</u>: This week of education, recognition and recreation is the highlight of the state 4-H program. Held at N. C. State University, 4-H Congress is open to any boy and girl 13 years of age and above who is currently participating in the 4-H program. Some district winners and invited participants may be younger. Contact: State 4-H Office

- JUNIOR DAIRY CONFERENCE: Four-H'ers from 14 to 19 years of age may submit applications. During the three-day conference in June, participants will learn about the dairy industry and career opportunities. Applications available through Dairy Husbandry Extension, 104 Polk Hall, N. C. State University, Raleigh NC 27607. Contact: Fred Knott, Dairy
- <u>4-H ELECTRIC CONGRESS</u>: Sponsored by the four major companies servicing North Carolina. Electric Congress is held for all county winning 4-H'ers in the Electric Project. To attend, one must be at least 12 years of age. Recruiting awards are presented to the 4-H'er in each county who recruits the greatest number of new members in the Electric Project beyond the minimum requirement of eight. Contact: John Glover, Biological and Agricultural Engineering

- <u>INTERNATIONAL INTRIGUE PROJECT</u>: The International Intrigue Project is open to all 4-H'ers ages 9-19, on an individual basis. It is a very flexible project encouraging 4-H members to select any area of interest in international affairs. To be eligible for awards, the 4-H member should submit the record, 4-H R-1-8, or a story of 1,000 words or less to the County Extension Office when requested. Contact: Pauline E. Moore, 4-H
- INTERNATIONAL FOUR-H YOUTH EXCHANGE AND INTERNATIONAL YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROJECT: IFYE and YDP offer the opportunity to study and experience rural life in a foreign country. A young person may apply provided he can secure \$700 from his home county toward his expenses and is in good health, single, and willing to devote time and energy to intensive study of the language, geography, history, culture and agriculture of the country to be visited. IFYE delegates may be 19-25 years old as of the time of departure. The stay is for a period of 4 to 6 months. YDP delegates must be 20 with no upper limit with the stay lasting for a period of 12 to 15 months. Contact: Pauline E. Moore, 4-H
- DELEGATES TO OUT-OF-STATE PROGRAMS (1): The purpose of delegates to out-of-state events is to provide for other 4-H'ers the opportunity to visit another state's annual meeting for cultural exchange and fellowship. Each county may nominate four individuals, preferably two boys and two girls, (16-19 years of age) to be considered for delegates to the state events in Georgia, Tennessee, Pennsylvania and Virginia. Each delegate chosen is responsible for his own transportation to and from the host state and the host state provides meals and lodging for the week. - DANFORTH LEADERSHIP TRAINING SCHOLARSHIPS (1): Each county may nominate four individuals, preferably two boys and two girls (17-19 years of age) who are outstanding in areas of athletics, scholastics, leadership in 4-H and character for consideration to attend the American Youth Foundation Leadership Training Camp in Western Michigan. Two individuals will represent North Carolina 4-H'ers at the Camp. Expenses while in camp will be assumed by the Danforth Foundation. - NORTH CAROLINA PARTNER-in-4-H AWARD: This award is designed to recognize individuals, groups, business organizations, foundations, associations, governmental bodies, and other institutions who have worked closely with the N.
