Dunmore Lions Club is making plans for our Magic Show to be held this year at the Dunmore Elementary Center during the month of December.




IPDG Dave Barrett presented a John R Crone Fellowship to PDG Karen Cokely, at the October Sight/Hearing meeting in Archbald.
