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WHO WE ARE

Northern Human Services (NHS) provides specialized services to persons with mental health care needs, substance use disorders, developmental disabilities and acquired brain disorders. We also provide services to children from birth to age 3 who have an established medical/genetic condition, a developmental delay and/or are at risk of developing a substantial developmental delay.

NHS was established in 1979. It is a private non-profit agency governed by a volunteer Board of Directors. NHS is regulated by the NH Bureau's of Behavioral Health, Developmental Services and Drug and Alcohol Services, all of which are under the NH Department of Health and Human Services. We are funded in part by State, Federal, and grant dollars. The service area that NHS covers includes all of Coos and Carroll Counties, and northern Grafton County.

The Staff of Northern Human Services

NHS employs skilled staff who provide and manage services to approximately 4500 people a year who live throughout northern NH. The staff has diverse backgrounds and training which contribute to the strength of our multidisciplinary approach to providing services and supports. Many NHS employees have been with the agency for a long time and they have extensive experience in their respective fields.



Developmental Disability and Acquired Brain Disorders

Developmental disability is a delay that usually occurs at or near birth. It can also be caused by prenatal factors or a chromosome abnormality or can be caused by diseases and accidents in childhood. An acquired brain injury is an injury to the brain that has occurred after birth and before the age of 60. Causes can include traumatic brain injury, anoxic/hypoxic injury (e.g., cardiopulmonary arrest, carbon monoxide poisoning, airway obstruction, hemorrhage), intracranial surgery, vascular disruption, infectious diseases, intracranial neoplasms, metabolic disorder, seizure disorders and toxic exposure.

Behavioral Health

Short-term counseling for individuals who need help with issues such as stress, anxiety, depression, grief and other life challenges are available.

Mental illnesses may include major depression, bipolar disorder (manic-depression), anxiety disorders such as panic attacks and obsessive-compulsive disorder, and schizophrenia. Many forms of mental illness can be treated by psychotherapy and medication. Often one of the challenges that individuals and families face in seeking treatment is the public's attitude that mental illness is somehow shameful or frightening. In fact, most people with supportive treatment can live fairly normal lives provided they have access to the services they need.



Cost of Services

Fees are charged for all services provided by Northern Human Services. Services are generally covered by health insurance such as Blue Cross, Medicaid and Medicare. Sliding fee arrangements are available. We ask individuals to review their coverage before seeing us.

Requests for Services

Requests for Services may be made directly by an individual, guardian, or by community agencies, physicians and school systems. Requests for services are acted on promptly. Not all services are offered in all locations.

FAMILY CENTERED EARLY SUPPORTS & SERVICES

The FCESS program provides support and assistance to families of infants and young children, birth to three years old, who have an established condition, developmental delay, or are at risk of delay. Services empower families to meet their child's unique physical, health, developmental, and environmental needs. IN HOME SUPPORT SERVICES

In Home Support Services are for children birth-21 years of age with a developmental disability, significant medical or behavioral challenges and who live at home with his or her family. This service option provides families with the ability to design, manage and direct their support services using Medicaid funds. Individuals/family members may choose their own staff, help decide how much to pay them and determine their schedule. There is also the option to contract with family members, businesses, neighbors or service providers for supports, transportation and a variety of other activities.



Types of services that can be provided:

- Personal care, basic living skills such as eating, drinking, toileting, personal hygiene and dressing;
- · Mobility and physical functioning;
- Communicating, including the use of technology.
 Learning to make choices to show preferences and to have opportunities to satisfy those interests;
- Pursuing interests and enhancing competencies in leisure and avocations activities;
- Services that, based on the individual's preferences, broaden his or her life experiences through social, artistic, and spiritual expression;
- Respite and family support services that meet the needs of individuals living with their families.

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PARTICIPATED DIRECTED & MANAGED SERVICES

This service option for adults 21+ years provides individuals with a developmental disability or acquired brain disorder and/or their families the option to design, manage and direct their support services using Medicaid funds. Individuals/family members may choose their own staff, help decide how much to pay them, and determine their schedule. There is also the option to contract with family members, businesses, neighbors, or service providers for supports, transportation, tutoring and a variety of other activities. Following Medicaid guidelines, individuals and/or their family work collaboratively with NHS staff to determine when and how the authorized funds are spent.



Types of Services that can be provided:

- Personal care, employment supports, adult education, vocational and leisure activities;
- Adaptations through environmental and vehicle modifications and assistive technology;
- Services that assist the individual to acquire and maintain life skills in such areas as personal safety, meal preparation, and budgeting;
- Services that, based on the individual's preferences, broaden his or her life experiences through social, artistic, and spiritual expression;
- Respite and family support services that meet the needs of individuals living with their families.


