Meet the New Director of Bands



Northwest is proud to announce that **Dr. Doug Overmier** is the new Director of Bands at Northwest Missouri State University. Most recently from the University of West Georgia, ensembles under his direction have appeared at the International Society of Music Educators in Bologna, Italy, national

gatherings for the Music Educators National Conference, appearances in regional television commercials, state convention performances in Texas, Tennessee, Georgia, and Hawaii, pro sporting events, recordings, "Made-for-TV" movies, tours of Mexico, the Bahamas, Antigua, numerous convention appearances, and performances on National Public Radio.

In addition, his ensembles were selected for the Kennedy Center, appearances at the Monterey Jazz Festival in California and the Guinness Jazz festival in Cork, Ireland.

As a performer, Dr. Overmier has appeared with nationally renowned artists including Wynton Marsalis, Alan Jackson, David Friedman, Mary Wilson, Steve Houghton, and Dizzy Gillespie. His is a published composer of band, jazz, and percussion works and has authored numerous articles in the Chronicle of Higher Education, and the Instrumentalist magazines. His most recent book, "Pedagogical Approaches to Percussion Performance," is expected out this summer.

Dr. Overmier inherits a strong band program left by Carl Kling, who resigned in June, 2010, to take a teaching position in Kentucky. We thank Carl for his six years of service to the university, highlighted by a Wind Symphony invited performance at the Nebraska Music Educators Association convention, performances by the Northwest Bands in London, England, and performances at five Division II National Championship football games.
