# **Pastor Travis' Thoughts:**

Beautiful People,

This Sunday, November 2nd, is our Annual Congregational Meeting. This is our time to celebrate all we have accomplished this past year in our congregational life, as well as do the business of the church. We will approve our budget for next year and approve our 2015 Church Board and new Trustees. It doesn't seem like much, but it is a significant time for our congregation. For the last month or more, our Stewardship and Finance Team has been meeting with our various church committees to prepare budget numbers for next year. Our Board has searched for new leaders from among you. Sunday will be our time to affirm all the work they have done, and set the course for our next year of life together. Congregational governance is central to who we are as Disciples. We make our own decisions on how we will live together, how we will lead one another and how we will use our resources to further God's ministry in Norwalk. No one does this for us--we do it for ourselves. We, together, are the church. We do the ministry. We lead the worship. We compile the budgets. We give of our money. We chose our leaders. And, as such, we have obligations to one another. We must be active in supporting and praying for the leaders we have chosen. We must do our part to fund the budget we have approved. And if we have concerns, we must not give into gossip and hearsay. We must go directly to the leaders we have chosen and address those concerns.

One of the things we will introduce at the meeting will be a document called "Ethical Guidelines for Congregational Conduct". Over the last year, our board has been working on this document, with the Upper Midwest Region as a resource, in hopes that it will one day become a covenant for our life together. We will not vote on these guidelines at this meeting, but will begin the process of introducing it for congregational study. The sharing of this document in no way suggests that there is conflict or improper behavior. In fact, the opposite is true! We are discussing this now because our congregational life is healthy, and we want to ensure that it always remains this way. We are prayerful that this will be a growing experience for our church, as we become more intentional in how we live together.

After our congregational meeting, we will eat together, and our church knows how to do potluck well. What a better way to end our time this Sunday than in a meal!

We are so blessed to share life with you! This congregation is so lifegiving, a place of safety and a home for so many people. Norwalk needs this church. I am thankful for all God is doing in our life together, and I look forward to what God has in store for us next.

Prayer: Dear Lord, we live in a world of sorrow and craziness. Thank you for music that lifts our soul and quiets our mind. Amen.


