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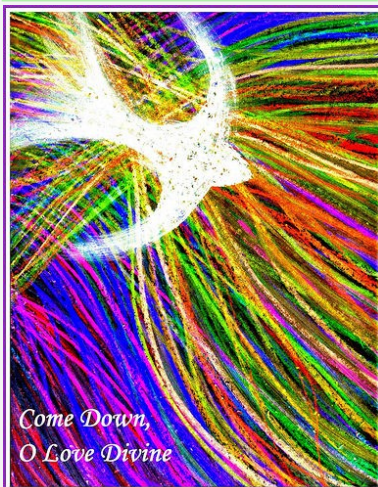

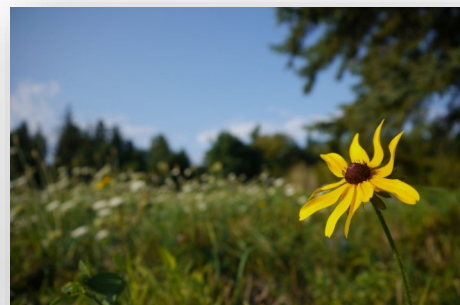

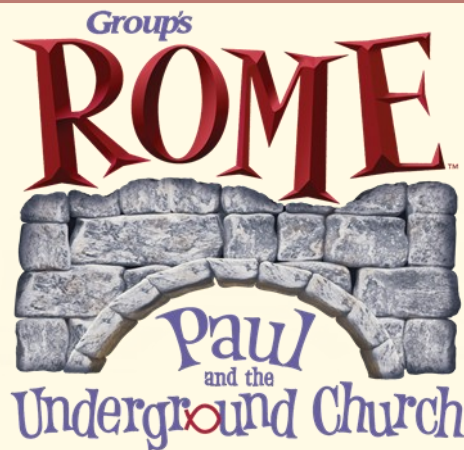

NOTES FROM COUNCIL

Items of note from the June 21 Council Meeting:



El Salvador Relationship - In considering the challenges and concerns Hosanna faces in maintaining our re-

lationship with our sister congregation, Divine Redeemer Lutheran Church in San Miguel, El Salvador, Council decided that we would pay out all the funds that are currently in our special funds designated for El Salvador Scholarships and Parish Support after which time we would discontinue further financial support. We have committed to topping up the Parish Support fund to fulfil our pledge through to the end of 2017. There are sufficient funds in the Scholarships fund to continue our quarterly installments through to at least April 1, 2018 with a probable partial installment for July 1, 2018. We are hoping to be in communication with Divine Redeemer via a Skype video call before the end of June to inform them of our decision and to discuss our relationship going forward. Companion synods in the ELCA whose global mission territory includes El Salvador have been contacted and we are hopeful that a congregation or group of congregations within those companion synods may take up Hosanna's financial pledge to Divine Redeemer. Please keep Divine Redeemer in your prayers.

Hosanna received a very generous bequest - Hosanna has received the very generous bequest of \$400,000 from the estate of our sister in Christ, Bev Boren.

Hosanna is one of several Lutheran church related bodies to benefit from Bev's generosity. After the estate has been fully settled (taxes and settlement expenses paid) there will probably be an additional smaller contribution coming to Hosanna. It is now Hosanna's challenge to use these funds wisely and in a manner that would honour her memory and her love for her church. Council created an ad hoc committee comprised of Ursula Buller, Lorelei Campbell, Colleen Jahns, Tom or Dianne Kieren, Greg Springate and pastor James to help develop guidelines on how to use funds from large contributions or bequests like this. It is our hope that these funds be used in a manner similar to which they were given – namely a form of generous outpouring of Hosanna's ministry.



Financial Status

- As we approach the summer months Council is always mindful of

Hosanna's financial status with a concern that we have sufficient funds in our general account to meet our expenses over the normally slower giving period of the year. With the advent of PAR (Pre-Authorized Remittance) our giving has significantly, but not entirely, evened out over the year. That being said, through to the end of May our expenses have outpaced our income by \$15,400, approximately \$1,800 more than last year at this time. Fortunately we started the year with a surplus of \$23,125, so we still have a positive bank balance. We have met all of our major one-time payments which, unfortunately or fortu-

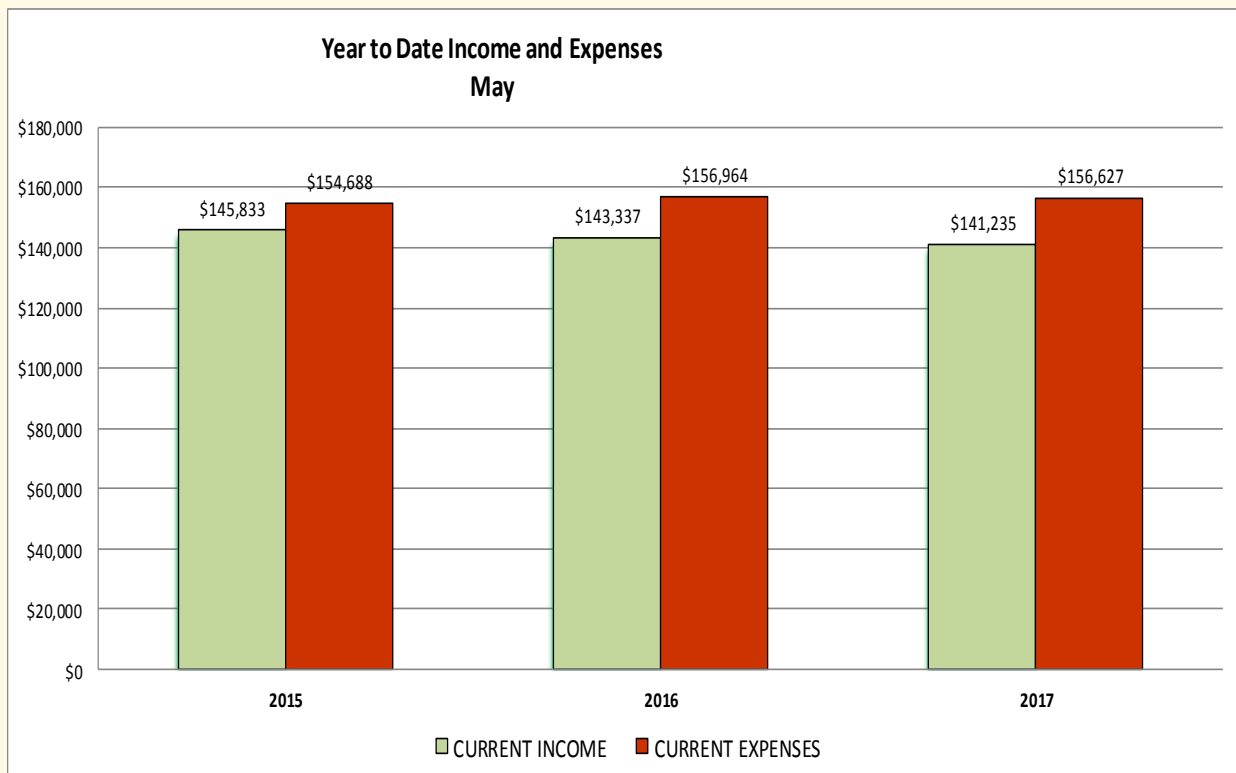
nately depending on your perspective, are at the beginning of the year; unfortunately at the beginning of the year when giving for the first quarter is always the lowest of the year so we live the remainder of the year worrying about our debt or fortunately because we have fewer surprises as we approach year end and we know what it takes to meet our needs. Our current financial status at this point of the year is no surprise. We have been faced with this challenge for years. Regardless of your perspective it is no less of a concern; however we do know that we, as a congregation, have the capabilities to meet these challenges. We can end the year with a balanced budget. Church Council will continue to take a responsible attitude in looking for ways to trim/curb spending to match the income but we ask for your con-

tinued generosity in supporting Hosanna's ministry.

Over the summer when you are on holidays we ask that you continue to support Hosanna with your gifts and offerings. If you are not on PAR and will be away for an extended time, consider placing post-dated cheques in the offering. Thank you and keep Hosanna in your prayers. Thank you to the congregation for your continued prayers and support for Hosanna's ministry.

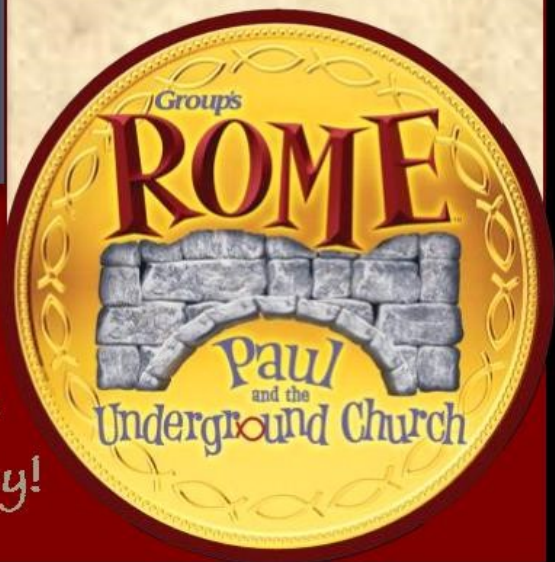

Refugee Support Group Celebrates!

We have had such good news in the past month.

Saruro Mohamed Ali, mother of Deka (whose family arrived in Edmonton last October) and Khalif (who has lived in Edmonton for over a decade and worked so hard to prepare for his sister Deka's arrival with her family), has been given the green light by CLWR for our sponsorship. Don Sjoberg and Khalif have started to fill out all the necessary forms (and there are many!).

With her son and daughters now living in Edmonton, Saruro is alone in Nairobi and they are eager for family reunification. We don't have a timeline for Saruro's arrival, but can only hope and pray that it will be soon.

Meanwhile, after 24 years, **Annie** Neufville has found her mother! With Annie's permission I can share how this happened. Last November, Annie joined Facebook and by December through diligent search-

ing had found one of her brothers in Texas. He was suspicious at first, but was soon convinced that this was his sister. This brother has been in touch with their mother and other brother in Liberia, so eventually was able to make contact in order to connect Annie and her mother by phone in

January. After all the tears, Annie and her mother have talked several times since.

On 27 June, Annie celebrates one year working for Capital-Care Grandview; on

12 August, she and Angel celebrate two years in Canada. We continue to be amazed at how much they have accomplished in those two years.

Angel won a Citizenship Award at the Jasper Place High School awards ceremony on 8 June. Annie and Cindy Schriener were pleased and proud to be in the audience. Angel returns to Jasper Place HS in September for another school year. She's looking for a summer job, if you have any leads!
