TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (0-1) of a brief 2-game series vs **Mike Bell's Twins** and **Game 9** (3-5) of a **9-game road trip** that included a **3-game series sweep win** at Mil's **American Family Field** and a **4-game series sweep loss** at SD's **Petco Park**...was the Reds' first sweep of the Brewers in **Milwaukee** since **August 2009** and their first ever **4-game series sweep loss** to the **Padres**...following tomorrow's day off the Redlegs return to **Great American Ball Park** for their longest homestand of the season (11g, 4g vs Atl, 1g vs Phi, 3g vs SD, 3g vs Cubs)...will be their final homestand of the season's first half...if all games are played as scheduled, the Reds will play **11 consecutive home games** for the first time since **7/4-7/13, 2014**.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are **14-14 all-time vs Min**, including **2-7** at the **Metrodome** and **4-3 in Target Field**...the Reds' **15-9 win on 4/27/2018** in their inaugural game at **Target Field** was their first victory in **Minneapolis** since the finale of the 3-game series there in **June 1999**...at the time, **Target Field** was the only existing stadium at which Cin had not played...with a 7-2 win on **9/25 of last season**, the Reds clinched their **first Postseason berth** since **2013**...in **2020**, the Reds were the **only road team** to win a series at **Target Field**, where the **Twins** finished with the best home record in the **Major Leagues** at **24-7**.

INTERLEAGUE NOTES: Beginning in **1997**, the Redlegs are **171-232 all-time vs the AL**, at **.424 the lowest interleague winning percentage** of any Major League team and including **4-4 this season** (2-1 vs Cle, 1-1 vs WSox, 1-1 at Cle, 0-1 at Min)...haven't produced a **winning record vs the American League** since **2013** (11-9)...in **8 seasons** since then are **56-92 vs AL** (.378).

BRAVES UP NEXT: On Thursday the Reds and Braves begin a 4-game series at Great American Ball Park...the Reds haven't lost a season series to the Braves since **2014** (2-5) and since then are **4-0-2 in 6 season series** and **19-15 in the 34 games**.

ARMS RACE: The Reds used **all 8 relievers** in last night's 12-inning, 7-5 loss...today are expected to reinstate from the 10-day injured list **RHP Tejay Antone** (#70)...a corresponding roster move would be made prior to the game...**Antone** missed the Reds' last 11 games on the IL with **right forearm inflammation**...his active **11-game scoreless streak** is the longest of his career by both game and inning (16.2ip, 6h, 3bb, 19k, .115oba)...**Antone** didn't allow a run in 18 of his 20 apps overall.

HISTORIC: **Joey Votto** has **1,945 career hits**, **303 HR** and **996 career RBI**...he is trying to become only the second Major League player ever to record in the same season his **2,000th hit**, **300th home run** and **1,000th RBI**...**Billy Williams** did it in **1971**...courtesy @EliasSports.

TOP OF THE ORDER: Reds batters in the top 3 spots in the starting lineup combine to lead the Major Leagues in **batting average** (.298), **on-base percentage** (.368), **hits** (265) and **extra-base hits** (102)...the trio leads the National League in **slugging percentage** (.515) and **total bases** (457)...in the Reds' **last 16 games** beginning **6/5**, **Jonathan India**, **Jesse Winker** and **Nick Castellanos** **14 times** batted first, second and third, respectively, in the lineup...the Reds went **8-6** in those 14 games.

DOT, DOT, DOT... The Reds went **10-9-4** in their **23 completed series**, including **5-4-2 at GABP** and **5-5-2 on the road**...have **4 series sweep wins** (3g vs Pit, 4g at StL, 3g vs Col, 3g at Mil) and **4 series sweep losses** (3g vs Ari, 3g at StL, 4g vs SF, 4g at SD)...are **3-24** when recording fewer hits than the opponent, their only wins an 8-7 victory on **6/6 at StL**, a 7-3 win on **6/9 vs Mil** and a 10-inning, 2-1 win on **6/15 at Mil**...are **28-21** when hitting at least 1 HR, **19-10** when hitting at least 2 HR and **7-15** when they don't homer...minor league **SS Jose Garcia** has changed his last name to **Barrero** in honor of his mother, who died in May...**Barrero** appeared in 24 games for the Reds last season.

FIRST SACKERS: The Reds have used **9 players** at **first base**, including **Joey Votto** (42g, 41gs), **Alex Blandino** (17g, 8gs), **Tyler Stephenson** (13g, 11gs), **Mike Moustakas** (9g, 7gs), **Kyle Farmer** (5g, 2gs), **Mike Freeman** (6g, 2gs), **Max Schrock** (2g), **Scott Heineman** (2g) and **Tucker Barnhart** (1g)...the Reds used as many as **9 first basemen** as recently as **2019** (**Aristides Aquino**, **Barnhart**, **Blandino**, **Curt Casali**, **Derek Dietrich**, **Farmer**, **Brian O'Grady**, **Josh VanMeter**, **Votto**).

YOUNG GUNS: The Reds have used **10 rookie players** so far this season, including **IF Jonathan India** (61g), **C Tyler Stephenson** (56g), **OF Mark Payton** (24g), **RHP Ryan Hendrix** (23g), **IF Max Schrock** (12g), **RHP José De León** (9g), **RHP Art Warren** (8g), **RHP Ashton Goudeau** (5g), **RHP Vladimir Gutierrez** (5gs) and **RHP Tony Santillan** (2gs).

BONUS BASEBALL: The Redlegs have played **11 extra-inning games** (8-3), including nine **10-inning games** plus a **12-inning, 6-5 win on 5/15 at Col** and a **12-inning, 7-5 loss on 6/21 at Min** that snapped their 6-game extra-innings winning streak...the Reds scored the runner on second base in 12 of the 15 extra innings while outscoring opponents, **23-19**...in extra innings, the Reds are hitting **.373** while posting a staff **ERA** of **7.53**.

MOUSTAKAS UPDATE: **3B Mike Moustakas** (right heel contusion) last week was returned from a rehabilitation assignment after 1 appearance at Class AAA Louisville...he went 1-for-3 on Tue at Omaha, then returned to Cincinnati with soreness in his foot...**Moustakas** last played for the Reds on **5/18 vs SF** and last started on **5/14 at Col**.

Today's Pitcher - #22 Wade Miley, LHP

RED HOTS

- This afternoon is making his fifth career appearance and fourth start vs the Twins...in his most recent appearance vs Min, in the 7-2 win here on 9/25 of last season, was on the mound in relief when the Reds clinched their first Postseason berth since 2013.
- Today is making his fifth start since a 10-day stint on the injured list with a left foot sprain (5/21-5/30)...suffered the injury running out of the batter's box in the third inning of his 4-0 loss vs SF on 5/19 vs SF...left the game with 2 outs in the top of the fifth inning...x-rays were negative and an MRI showed no damage, but 2 days later went on the 10-day injured list with a left foot sprain.
- In 4 starts since he came off the IL went 2-0, 1.80 (25ip, 5er, .215oba).
- In Thu's 6-4 loss at SD allowed just 2 hits, a solo HR to Fernando Tatis Jr. with 2 outs in the sixth inning and a solo HR to Manny Machado on his first pitch of the seventh...the Reds scored 4 runs in the top of the ninth to take a 4-2 lead, including a 2-run HR by Jonathan India that snapped the 2-2 tie, but Eric Hosmer (off Ryan Hendrix) and Victor Caratini (off Amir Garrett) each hit a 2-run HR in the bottom of the inning.
- In the 3-0 win on 5/7 at Cle threw his first career no-hitter, third career complete game and second career shutout...was the 17th no-hitter in Reds history and fourth in Major League Baseball on the 2021 season's 37th day, the second-fastest ever to 4 no-hitters in a single season (4 no-hitters in the first 25 days of the 1917 campaign)...the longest no-hit bids of his career had been 6.0 innings (7/17/15 for Bos at LAA, 7/30/16 for Sea at Cubs)...allowed 2 baserunners...Amed Rosario reached second base on a double error by 2B Nick Senzel with 1 out in the bottom of the sixth inning, and Cesar Hernandez walked 1 out later...at 34 years, 175 days old is the oldest Reds pitcher to throw a no-hitter (Tom Seaver 33 years, 211 days in 1978)...the Reds broke the scoreless tie with 3 runs in the top of the ninth inning...the start of the game was delayed 1 hour, 23 minutes by weather.
- Following his no-hitter was named National League Player of the Week, his first weekly award.
- In the 9-6 loss on 5/14 at Col, his first start after his no-hitter, allowed a season high 11 hits and 8 runs, his highest totals since he allowed 12 hits and 9 runs on 6/2/16 for Sea at SD...allowed a leadoff triple to Garrett Hampson.
- Joined Anthony DeSclafani as the only Reds pitchers since 1893, when the pitcher's mound was moved to its current distance from home plate, to begin a season with consecutive starts of at least 5.0 scoreless innings...DeSclafani did it last season (5ip/3h, 6ip/2h)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- Is his second season with the Reds...joined the club in December 2019, when he signed a 2-year contract through this year.

RED HOTS

- Last name is pronounced SAN-tee-yan.
- On Thu vs Atl will make his third Major League appearance.
- In the 6-2 win on 6/13 vs Col made his Major League debut at age 24 years, 59 days...left the game leading, 3-1, with the bases loaded and 2 outs in the fifth inning...was replaced by Ryan Hendrix, who struck out Dom Nunez to end the inning...first career strikeout was Trevor Story (4th batter).
- Was the fourth Reds player to make his Major League debut this season (2B Jonathan India, RHP Ryan Hendrix, RHP Vladimir Gutierrez) and the 10th rookie to appear in a game for the Reds (India, Hendrix, Gutierrez, IF Max Schrock, OF Mark Payton, C Tyler Stephenson, RHP José De León, RHP Art Warren, RHP Ashton Goudeau).
- The day before his Major League debut was recalled from Class AAA Louisville (6gs, 1-3, 2.51, 32.1ip, 23h, 12bb, 45k, 5hr, .193oba, 1.08whip).
- Spent the 2020 season at the alternate training site as part of the Reds' 60-player pool roster.
- Last year was a member of the 40-player Postseason roster and traveled with the team to the final road trip of the regular season, a 3-game series at Min, and to the Wild Card Series at Atl.
- Did not make an appearance on the active roster during the regular season or Postseason.
- Began the 2021 season rated by *Baseball America* the ninth-best prospect in the organization.

- Hit fifth in the lineup in 11 of his last 13 starts...prior to this season, last hit as low as fifth in the order on 8/21/08 at Wrigley Field...produced at least 1 RBI in 6 of those 11 apps batting fifth.
- On 6/8 was returned from a rehabilitation assignment and was reinstated from the 10-day injured list...in 14 apps since then is hitting .271 (13-48, 3hr, 13rbi, .386obp).

- Last night made his third start of the season as the Reds' designated hitter in their third road game vs an American League team...as the DH is hitting .167 (2-12, 1 2b).
- On 5/7 at Cle was the designated hitter in Wade Miley's no-hitter, the Reds' first interleague road game of the season.
- In Mon's 12-inning, 7-5 loss at Min went 0-for-5, snapping an 8-game hitting streak during which he hit .355 (11-31, 4 2b, 5rbi, .412obp) and a 17-game on-base streak that tied for the third-longest active streak in the Major Leagues...was only his third hitless game of the season in which he recorded at least 5 at bats.
- Beginning 6/3 at StL has hit safely in 16 of his last 18 apps (23-72, .319, 4 2b, 4hr, 14rbi, .410obp, .542slg), including a pair of 8-game hitting streaks.

- From 5/21-5/23 vs Mil became the first Reds batter with 5 HR in a 3-game series since Willie Greene did it from 9/24-9/26, 1996 vs Cubs (5hr) and the first ML player since José Abreu did it from 8/21-8/23, 2020, also vs Cubs (6hr).
- On 5/21 vs Mil became the 31st player in Reds history to produce 3 HR in a game, accomplished for the 39th time (off Adrian Houser 2, Josh Lindblom)...had another 3-homer game and a career-high 6 RBI in the 8-7 win on 6/6 vs the Cardinals that led the Reds to their first 4-game sweep in St. Louis since 1990.
- On 5/23 vs Mil hit a 456-foot HR off Freddy Peralta, the longest homer of his career and the second-longest by a Reds batter this season (Tyler Naquin, 5/21 vs Mil off Adrian Houser, 459 feet).
- In the third inning of the 7-2 loss on 5/11 at Pit became the 41st player to hit a homer that reached on the fly or bounced into the Allegheny River (61st time).
