
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Porgy & Bess—an American masterpiece, a global phenomenon.

Porgy and Bess first stretched its legs seventy-six years ago in Boston with the largest all-black cast seen on an American stage. After its premiere at the Colonial Theatre on September 30, 1935, George Gershwin received a fifteen-minute ovation.

When the first national tour launched in production that 1936, the show ignited social change. After touring the country the opera was scheduled to finish at Washington, D.C.'s National Theatre. Todd Duncan (Porgy) knew that the Theatre had long refused entry to non-white patrons. Anne Brown (Bess) recalled, "As expected we were told that the National Theatre would be a segregated house. Todd and I refused to perform and we were threatened by the Theatre Guild. We cared less. We were adamant." After much heated discussion Duncan and Brown remained steadfast and theatre management conceded. Whites and blacks sat side by side for the first time in the theatre's history.

In March of 1943, at the height of World War II, the Danish Royal Opera premiered the work in Copenhagen. Despite its enthusiastic audiences, the Nazis tried to close the production. The show became a symbol of resistance to the Nazi occupation of Denmark. When the Nazis threatened to bomb the theatre, managers ended the run. Later, amidst a jungle of Cold War hostility, a production of *Porgy and Bess* travelled to the Soviet Union in 1955. Audiences in Moscow adored the production, the first show performed by Americans since the Bolshevik Revolution.

In 1976, the Houston Grand Opera assembled the first production using Gershwin's original score. However, with the show running more than three hours, directors John

DeMain and Jack O'Brien snipped away reprises and short lines and finished with a production that ran two hours and fifty-eight

minutes. The show, the only opera to receive a Tony Award, was hailed in the *New York Daily News* as "the most musical, moving, and profoundly beautiful production playing in New York."

Since then, *Porgy and Bess* has been featured by almost every major opera company and, as a concert, symphony orchestra in the world. Many operatic productions have taken experimental approaches to the story, including setting it in Apartheid South Africa, and South Central Los Angeles, and hurricane Katrina-ravaged New Orleans.

Its current incarnation coming to the Detroit Opera House in March has taken a more faithful approach to the original intent of the story, yet has adapted it for the conventions of contemporary musical theatre. "Every so often a project comes along that is so astonishing that one has to drop everything and just say I'm going to do it. That's what I felt when I was asked to do The Gershwins' Porgy and Bess," said Tony Award-winning director Diane Paulus. "The epic sweep of the story, the immense history of the musical itself and the unforgettable Gershwin score, highlighted by 'Summertime,' 'I Got Plenty of Nothing' and 'It Ain't Necessarily So' make this unquestionably one of the greatest American masterpieces."

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

BJÖRN ULVAEUS (Music & Lyrics) was born in 1945 in Gothenberg on the west coast of Sweden. After a successful local career in Sweden with a folk group in the mid '60s, he started his collaboration with Benny Andersson. They then went on to form ABBA with Agnetha Faltskog and Anni-Frid Lyngstad. Even during the ABBA years, the idea of writing a musical seemed appealing, and in 1981, Björn and Benny met Tim Rice and cowrote Chess with him, which opened in the West End in 1986. In 1995 Björn and Benny opened a new musical in Sweden called Kristina Från Duvemåla, which played for three years in Sweden. In February 2002, the Swedish version of Chess opened in Stockholm.

ar Horse, the astounding theatrical ex- Albert sets out to rescue Joey after he has perience coming to the Fisher Theatre December 17, 2013–January 5, 2014 exerts its pull from the moment the title character, Joey, first trots on stage as a foal, petted by his owner and best friend, 15-year-old Albert. The audience gasps, aware that Joey is a puppet, not a real horse, but captivated by the way he shudders and whinnies at Albert's loving touch. Joey's lifelike eyes, shining and reflective, draw us into the soul of his journey; as the evening progresses, and

been sold to the English cavalry, we find ourselves carried along and hoping for Joey to make it home.

It's that kind of emotional power that has made War Horse an international phenomenon, sweeping up audiences and awards on both sides of the Atlantic and even inspiring an Oscar-nominated film directed by Steven Spielberg. War Horse won five 2011 Tony Awards (including Best Play) for its New York premiere plus a Special Tony Award for

Set during the First World War, War Horse combines a powerful story with thrilling stagecraft and music. In addition, it showcases what may be the most inventive use of puppetry ever seen on stage. Soon after meeting him as a young horse, we watch in amazement as an adult Joev, seven feet tall. materializes before our eyes. Two puppet masters working inside Joey's frame (built of light, malleable cane) raise and lower his torso, letting out

forceful breaths, while a third manipulates his ears, lifting and pulling them back to register tender shades of emotion. Spielberg's film version of War Horse employed real horses, but these onstage creations fully personalize equine ideals of courage, strength and loyalty in ways that reinforce the themes of the story.


"Spielberg made a terrific film," enthuses Michael Morpurgo, upon whose beloved novel War Horse is based, "but cinema has its limitations. It isn't live, and that's the difference. What's amazing about the stage show is that, whether it's the music, design, or lighting, the puppets, the quality of acting or direction, it's ingenious and unique. It's a theatrical event."

During World War I, more than one million horses were conscripted by the British military alone; of these, only 62,000 returned. As Joey is forced into battle, serving in both the British and German armies, we are moved by his bravery and the trust he places in those who exploit his strength. His innocence makes him seem above the fighting: in War Horse, animals behave with a dignity that humans do not always achieve. Still, Joey is unprepared for the true brutality of 20th century warfare. In a brilliant scene that defines the excitement of Act Two, he faces a new kind of foe: a massive tank rolling his way, prepared to flatten everything in its path. The scenic design is so visceral that we are rushed into battle alongside Joey. enveloped in the sound and smell of combat. Joey rears on his hind legs as the tank pitches toward him and the stage goes black.

"The First World War is emblematic," suggests Mervyn Millar, War Horse's puppetry director, "in the way the possibilities of destruction changed. You see Joey standing, looking at the tank, which advances without logic, without thought. Joev tries to work out what it means, what it wants, and it doesn't want or mean anything. It just destroys."

Joey's plight resonates with anyone who has ever loved an animal or taken a pet into the family. As Albert continues his search, we are reminded of the ways in which animals remain with us through many stages of our lives, giving much and asking for little.

"People emotionally invest in animals," Millar believes. "I think everyone can empathize with Joey."



Determined to save his friend, Albert runs away from home with the hope of getting close to the front. But in trying to rescue one family member, he hurts another, leaving behind a mother anxious with worry. War Horse's relevance comes from our awareness that, nearly a century after the start of the First World War, families are still being separated by armed conflict.

"We talk a lot about the history of the war," remarks Chris Harper, producer for the National Theatre of Great Britain (which first staged War Horse in London), "but at the heart of the show it's just a family, struggling to deal with life. The thing that's exciting about War Horse is that it appeals to lots of generations. We see grandparents bringing their kids, wanting to explain the history from their own personal journeys with World War II or more recent conflicts. It's a production that brings the family together."

Will Albert find Joev in time? As War *Horse* reaches its beautiful climax, the hopes of parents, children, and beloved friends both onstage and off-merge into a shared experience, as tissues are drawn from pockets and eves glisten with tears.

"We get people coming back again and again," Harper explains, "and they always have the same reaction. It awakens something in you. War Horse makes grown people cry."

ot since The Who's *Tommy* back in 1993 has there been a Broadway show with the pedigree of *American Idiot*, the punk-popera staging of Green Day's epic concept album that will play at the Detroit Opera House January 31–February 2, 2014.

Michael Mayer, American Idiot's director and co-writer (with Billie Joe Armstrong and the rest of Green Day), won a 2008 Tony for Spring Awakening. Though his previous tuners have included Thoroughly Modern Millie and Triumph of Love, the director is sufficiently au courant that Green Day's album bowled him over. Part of it was timing; American Idiot came out just months before Bush's 2004 reelection, turning its defiant howl against the "redneck agenda" (as one lyric goes) into a prophetic yawp.

"I thought, my God," Mayer recalls, "these punks from Oakland are talking about what it's like to live in Bush's America right now. And the rage and the love in equal measure throughout the album I just found incredibly complicated and dazzling—and tuneful."But theatrical? Armstrong's earnest, anguished lyrics loosely sketched the emotional journey of an aimless antihero ("Jesus of Suburbia") through a dystopian cityscape ("Boulevard of Broken Dreams"), where he falls under the thrall of a charismatic drug dealer ("St. Jimmy") and a fiery, idealistic girlfriend ("She's a Rebel," "Extraordinary Girl"), then loses them both and returns to the comfortable oblivion of the suburbs ("Homecoming," "Whatshername").

"The project's conceit was that I would take the record and basically write story onto it and from inside it," Mayer says. "The amount of freedom I had to dream and imagine was unprecedented for me." In addition to the album's Jesus-Jimmy-Whatshername triangle, Mayer layered on another trio. Johnny

now has two suburban pals: Will, who stays home against his wishes; and Tunney, who enlists to fight in Iraq. Though Mayer added little dialogue to Armstrong's lyrics, he hopes that by sharing words among a dozen performers, he's created a kind of found-text libretto for a multipronged narrative that entwines city, suburb and battlefield.


"I had great anxiety about the liberties we were taking, dramatically as well as emotionally," Mayer recalls. "I kept thinking we would cross a line that would be intolerable, but instead Billie Joe kept urging me to go further, which was encouraging—and terrifying." He adds that he found it gratifying, yet surreal, to talk with the songwriter about characters he had originated for a wholly different medium.

What does this fable—set "in the recent past"—have to say to Obama's America? "I wish the state of our union didn't still feel as resonant as it does with the show," says Mayer with a shudder. "I think it's really good at this moment not to forget how our country got this way and to maintain a healthy amount of anger about it."

It's not Green Day's style, though, to sulk; its bleakest tunes often chime brightly in major keys. That puts *American Idiot* in lofty company, Mayer says. "Even the most tragic opera you go to see at the Met is stirring and rousing, and the music is gorgeous to sing," he asserts. "It inspires the performers to great heights of expression, and to the joy of performing. And I think all that's in here."


