CAROLINA VS. CLEMSON: This is the 116th meeting between these two Palmetto State schools in a series that dates back to 1896. The teams have met every year since 1909, making the Carolina-Clemson series the second-longest running consecutively played series in college football at 110-straight meetings, behind only Minnesota – Wisconsin. The Tigers hold a 69-42-4 lead in the all-time series, including an 18-10-1 mark in Clemson and a 51-32-3 advantage in Columbia. However, the Gamecocks have won five of the last nine and the teams have split the last 12 meetings.

THE PALMETTO SERIES: The winner of this week's game will earn that school another point in the Certified SC

Grown Palmetto Series between South Carolina and Clemson. Additionally, another point will be awarded today to



the winner of the month-long Food Drive. The Gamecocks are a perfect 3-0 since the Palmetto Series begin in 2015-16. Carolina currently leads this year's competition by a 4-3 margin.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: Kelly Bryant threw two touchdown passes to Hunter Renfrow as No. 4/3 Clemson posted a 34-10 win over South Carolina on Nov. 25, 2017 in Columbia. Clemson never trailed in the contest, as they got on the board early with a 12-yard interception return for a score from Ryan Carter. The Tigers rolled up 469 yards of offense while limiting the Gamecocks to just 207.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET IN CLEMSON:

Behind the passing of Deshaun Watson, No. 4/3 Clemson claimed a 56-7 victory over South Carolina on Nov. 26, 2016, in Clemson. The Tigers bolted out to a 21-0 lead in the first period and cruised to the victory. The Gamecocks were held to just 218 yards of offense, while the Tigers rolled up 622 yards in the win.

THE LAST GAMECOCK WIN: No. 10/9 South Carolina forced a half-dozen Clemson turnovers, turning three of them into touchdowns, as the Gamecocks won for the fifth-straight time over the No. 6/4 Tigers, 31-17 in Columbia on Nov. 30, 2013. The game was deadlocked at 17 heading into the final period, but Mike Davis scored on a two-yard run to cap a drive that took over six minutes off the clock, then Brandon Wilds scored on a 26-yard pass from Pharoh Cooper to seal the win. Connor Shaw posted 246 yards of total offense, including 94 on the ground, while

A South Carolina win over Clemson would...

- ullet Be the second-best win in school history, according to the Associated Press rankings, behind only the 2010 victory over No. 1 Alabama. It would mark the best road win in school history.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks their first win over a ranked opponent since the Tennessee win in 2016.
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks their 31st win in their last 37 contests against non-conference opponents.

YOU ARE LOOKING LIVE: The University of South Carolina Gamecocks (6-4, 4-4 SEC) travel to Clemson, S.C. to renew their Palmetto State rivalry with the homestanding and second-ranked Clemson Tigers (11-0, 8-0 ACC) on Saturday, Nov. 24. Game time is set for 7 pm from Memorial Stadium (81,500). ESPN has the national telecast for this week's game. Steve Levy will handle the play-by-play with Brian Griese serving as the analyst. Todd McShay will work the sidelines.

A HISTORY LESSON: 2018 marks the 125th season of intercollegiate football at South Carolina. It is the 112th-consecutive year in which Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 607-577-44.

BLACK JACK: Will Muschamp has tied Steve Spurrier's record for most wins in his first three seasons as the Carolina head coach with 21. Coach Spurrier posted a 21-16 record in his first three seasons (2005-07), guiding the Gamecocks to records of 7-5, 8-5, and 6-6, while Coach Muschamp is currently 21-15 (6-7, 9-4, 6-4) with three games left on the slate. With a sixth win last week, Muschamp becomes the first coach in school history to take the team to bowl games in each of his first three seasons. Coach Spurrier's third squad was bowl-eligible, but was not selected to play in a bowl game. Joe Morrison is the only coach to record 20 or more wins in his first three seasons at Carolina Morrison logged a 20-14 mark from 1983-85, going 5-6, 10-2, and 5-6.

COMBINED WINS: Carolina (6-4) and Clemson (11-0) enter this year's contest with a combined 17 victories. The record for most combined wins in the series at the time the game was played is 19, set in 2012 and matched in 2013. The teams also combined for 18 wins in 2011 and 2017. Prior to this decade, the high was 16 combined wins.

CAROLINA VS. THE ACC: South Carolina is 10-5 in its last 15 games against teams from the Atlantic Coast Conference since the start of the 2009 season. Since that time they have faced Clemson (5-4), North Carolina (2-0), NC State (2-0), Miami (Fla.) (1-0), and Florida State (0-1). South Carolina was a member of the ACC from 1953-1970.

LOOKING FOR A SIGNATURE WIN: The Gamecocks will be playing their fifth ranked opponent of the season when they take on No. 2/2 Clemson. Carolina will be looking to knock off a ranked opponent for the first time since a 24-21 win over No. 18 Tennessee on Oct. 29, 2016. Since that time, the Gamecocks have dropped nine-straight games to ranked opponents, including four contests (No. 3 Georgia, No. 17 Kentucky, No. 22 Texas A&M and No. 19 Florida) in 2018.

BEATING THE BEST: Clemson enters the game as the nation's second-ranked team, according to the Associated Press. A win over the Tigers would be considered the second-best victory and the top road win in Carolina history, based on the AP rankings. Five of Carolina's top seven wins based on the AP rankings have come since 2009, including a win over top-ranked Alabama in 2010. Here are the top-10 wins in school history:

PLAYING THE BEST: South Carolina has played a top-5 ranked team in 12 of the past 13 seasons. That stretch is likely to continue into 2019, as the Gamecocks have Alabama, Georgia and Clemson on the schedule.

NOT SEC WORTHY: The Gamecocks are 30-6 in their last 36 non-conference games. Carolina had its school-record 18-game non-conference winning streak snapped in the 2015 regular-season finale at Clemson. The Gamecocks are 2-0 against non-conference opponents this season.

FIRST TIME IN A LONG TIME: Due to Hurricane Florence which cancelled South Carolina's Sept. 15 contest with Marshall, the Gamecocks have added Akron to their regular-season schedule, with the Zips visiting Williams-Brice Stadium next Saturday for a noon kick. It's the first time since 1990 that Carolina's final regular season game is not against the Clemson. After playing eight-consecutive SEC contests, the Gamecocks will end the 2018 regular season with threestraight non-conference tilts for the first time since joining the league prior to the 1992 season.

THE LAST TIME OUT: The Gamecocks rolled up an easy 49-9 rout of FCS Chattanooga last Saturday night in Columbia, their largest margin of victory under Coach Muschamp. Carolina posted several Will Muschamp Era leading superlatives on the offensive side of the ball:

EVERYONE HAVE FUN TONIGHT:

- Jake Bentley had one of his best days as a Gamecock, completing 25-of-29 passes for 339 yards with four touchdowns and no interceptions. The four TD passes matched his career high.
- Deshaun Fenwick, a true freshman running back, made his collegiate debut in the second half against the Mocs and responded with 112 yards on 17 carries with a touchdown. He averaged 6.6 yards per carry with a long of 37 yards.
- Deebo Samuel hauled in five passes for 112 yards, including a 61-yard touchdown reception. It was his second-straight game with over 100 yards receiving.
- A.J. Turner carried eight times for 65 yards and a touchdown and caught three passes for 34 yards and two scores. It marked the first time that a Gamecock had scored three TDs in a game since Deebo Samuel accomplished the feat in the 2017 season opener against NC State.

IT'S RARELY EASY: Prior to the blowout win over Chattanooga, the Gamecocks previous five contests were decided by a total of 16 points with Carolina coming out on top in three of those five contests. The Gamecocks are 5-1 in games decided by three points or less under Will Muschamp, 12-5 in games decided by seven points or less and 14-6 in games decided by 10 points or less under Coach Muschamp.

FAST STARTS: After struggling in the first quarter early in the season, the Gamecocks have hit a groove of late. Carolina put up 17 first-quarter points at Ole Miss, the most points they have scored in the first quarter of a road game since 2009 when they had 17 on the board after the first period at Georgia. They followed that up with 14 first-quarter points at Florida, scoring touchdowns on each of their first two possessions, and added 14 more first-quarter points against Chattanooga last week. That's 45 first-quarter points in the last three games (15.0 per game) after scoring just 44 first-quarter points in the season's first seven contests (6.3 per game).

CHICKS DIG THE LONG BALL: Jake Bentley has connected on a bomb in each of the last four games with six completions of 50 or more yards in that stretch after having just two passes cover 50plus yards in the first six contests. In the win over Tennessee, junior wide receiver Bryan Edwards was on the receiving end of a 73-yard completion from Bentley. At the time, it was the longest pass play for either player during their careers at Carolina and was the longest pass play for the Gamecocks since Perry Orth and Pharoh Cooper hooked up on a 78-yard completion against Vanderbilt in 2015. That lasted just one game however, as the duo teamed up again at Ole Miss with a 75-yard touchdown strike. Bentley went deep again at Florida, hooking up with Deebo Samuel on an 89-yard catch-and-run. It was the seventh-longest pass play in Carolina history and the longest that did not go for a touchdown. Last week against Chattanooga, Bentley had touchdown strikes of 53 yards to Shi Smith and 61 yards to Samuel. The Gamecocks have tied a season record for most passes of 70 yards or more, also throwing three of 70-plus yards in 1975 with Jeff Grantz at quarterback, in 2003 with Dondrial Pinkins at QB, and most recently in 2014 with **Dylan Thompson** as the signal-caller.

WIN THE TURNOVERS, WIN THE GAME:

Carolina is 4-0 when winning the turnover margin this season and 2-3 when losing the turnover battle. For the season, the Gamecocks are minus-3 in turnovers, losing 14 while gaining 11. The -0.30 turnover margin per game ranks 10th in the SEC and 91st in the country. Last season, South Carolina was plus-11 in turnovers, gaining 28 while losing 17. Their 0.85 turnover margin ranked second in the SEC and 13th in the nation.

OUR QB IS A BENTLEY: Junior quarterback Jake Bentley has started nine games this season, missing the Missouri contest with a knee injury, which snapped a streak of 24-consecutive starts. The 6-4, 224-pounder from Opelika, Ala., owns an 18-11 record as a starting signal-caller. For the season, he is 177-of-272 (65.1 percent) for 2,244 yards with 19 TDs and nine INTs. He ranks fourth in the SEC in passing yards per game at 249.3 and fifth in total offense at 263.1. His 19 touchdown passes this season ranks seventh on the school's all-time single-season list, 10 shy of Steve Taneyhill's record of 29. On the Carolina career charts, he ranks second in completion percentage, fourth in pass completions, fourth in passing yards, fifth in passing touchdowns, fifth in pass attempts, and fifth in total offense.

ANOTHER MILESTONE: Jake Bentley became just the fourth quarterback in school history to eclipse the 6,000-yard passing mark for his career. With 6,458 passing yards, he trails only **Todd Ellis** (9,953), **Steve Taneyhill** (8,782) and **Stephen Garcia** (7,597) on Carolina's all-time list.

BETTER OF LATE: Jake Bentley has been on fire over the last three games, tossing eight TD passes with just one INT while completing 73 percent of his attempts. A SCAR IS BORN: Fifth-year senior Michael Scarnecchia made the first start of his career against Missouri in place of an injured Bentley, and made it a memorable one. The 6-3, 216-pounder from Fleming Island, Fla., completed 20-of-35 passes for 249 yards and three touchdowns with no turnovers in the 37-35 win. He connected on touchdown passes of 5, 17 and 8 yards, and led the Gamecocks on a 9-play, 53-yard drive in just over a minute, setting up the gamewinning field goal with just two seconds remaining in the contest.

BE LIKE MIKE: Prior to his heroics against Missouri, Michael Scarnecchia had seen limited duty in his career. He entered the season having appeared in just three games, completing his only pass attempt, a 9-yarder, back in 2015. He was 7-of-12 for 89 yards and a touchdown this season heading into the Missouri game. Scarnecchia, who earned a finance degree in May, was recognized as the 2017 Dr. Harris Pastides Outstanding Student-Athlete. He is on record naming Andrew Carnegie, John D. RUSHING BY COMMITTEE: The Gamecocks feature a stable of four junior running backs, each of whom has led the team in rushing at various times this season. Carolina is averaging 4.6 yards per carry after averaging just 3.9 yards a year ago. The Gamecocks are 19-4 when rushing for 100 yards or more under Will Muschamp, including a 14-1 mark when eclipsing the 150-yard barrier. They have gone over the 200-yard mark twice this season, rushing for 224 against Tennessee, the second-highest mark against a Power-5 foe, and 238 against Chattanooga, the fourth-highest single-game mark under Coach Muschamp.

• Rico Dowdle has started six games this season, but has been limited to just three carries over the last three games after suffering an ankle injury early in the Ole Miss contest. He is the squad's leading rusher this season with 498 yards and is tied

for the team lead with four rushing touchdowns. He has gone over the 100-yard barrier three times this season (105 vs. Coastal, 112 at Vandy and 140 vs. Tennessee) and six times in his career, all Carolina wins. He has 1,513 career yards, ranking 27th in school history.

- Ty'Son Williams started back-to-back games against Tennessee and Ole Miss, but has not played in the last two games after breaking a bone in his hand against the Rebels. Williams, who spent one year at North Carolina, had his best game of the season in the opener against Coastal, rushing 11 times for 82 yards and a touchdown. He is second on the squad in rushing with 319 yards, averages 4.8 yards per carry, and is tied for the team lead with 4 rushing TDs.
- **A.J. Turner** had picked up the slack in Dowdle and Williams absence over the last two games, rushing a dozen times for 81 yards at Florida, then collecting 65 yards on the ground and scoring three times (one rushing, two receiving) against UTC. He ranks 30th on Carolina's all-time rushing list with 1,322 yards. He is averaging 6.4 yards per carry this season and is also one of the squad's top special teams performers.
- Mon Denson was slowed early in the season by a hamstring injury, but has seen more action of late. He exploded at Ole Miss, carrying 12 times for a career-high 102 yards, including a 69-yard burst that set up the winning score, earning his first career start at Florida. Prior to the breakout game at Ole Miss, he had just 66 yards this season and 218 in his career.

SAMUEL IS KING: One of the most electrifying players in college football is 6-0, 210-pound senior **Deebo Samuel**. Samuel earned numerous preseason All-America and All-SEC accolades as a wide receiver, kick returner and all-purpose performer. In 2016, Samuel had 1,320 all-purpose yards and became one of just six Power 5 players in the past five years to record a passing, rushing, receiving and kickoff-return touchdown in the same season. He scored six TDs in three games a year ago before suffering a season-ending leg injury. He has scored 22 career touchdowns (11 receiving, 7 rushing and 4 kickoff returns). He needs two more touchdowns to move into the school's all-time top-10 list.

DEEBO IN 2018: Deebo Samuel has been the Gamecocks' top receiver this season, catching 48 passes for 639 yards with six touchdowns. He also has rushed eight times for 26 yards and has 20 kick returns for 505 yards. He has put together

back-to-back 100-yard receiving games, going for 120 yards including an 89-yarder at Florida, then logging 112 receiving yards including a 61-yard scoring strike against Chattanooga. His 4.8 receptions per game ranks sixth in the SEC, his 63.9 receiving yards per game ranks 10th, his 117.0 all-purpose yards ranks third, while his 25.2-yard kickoff return average ranks fourth.

NO SECOND FIDDLE: While Samuel received much of the preseason accolades, and rightly so, junior Bryan Edwards has better career numbers. Just a junior, Edwards already ranks among the top wide receivers in school history. He has two 100-yard receiving games this season (111 vs. Georgia and 109 at Ole Miss) and four in his career. He is tied for the team lead with six TDs and has caught a pass in every game in which he has appeared, third on the all-time list. He ranks ninth the SEC with 65.9 receiving yards and 10th with 4.2 receptions per game. He also owns a 7.4-yard punt return average, ranking eighth.

TWO GRAND: Bryan Edwards eclipsed the 2,000-yard receiving mark for his career in the win over UTC. He became the 10th player in school history to accomplish that feat.

Crosby** and **Jacob August**, and juniors **Kyle Markway** and **Kiel Pollard** all play extensively. O-LINE EXPERIENCE: The Gamecocks front line boasts a wealth of experience with 121 combined starts. Senior left guard **Zack Bailey** owns the most starts on the team with 36 and has been

given some preseason All-SEC recognition. Fifthyear junior **Donell Stanley** moved to center this season where he is a Rimington Award candidate. He has made 23 career starts. Senior left tackle **Dennis Daley**, a former junior college transfer, moved into the starting lineup early in the 2017 season and made 18-straight starts until that streak was snapped at Ole Miss due to an ankle injury. Highly-regarded redshirt sophomore right guard **Sadarius Hutcherson** has made 14 starts, True freshman **Dylan Wonnum** has started each of the last four games at right tackle, replacing **Blake Camper**, who has made 10 starts. Senior **Malik Young**, who replaced Daley at left tackle at Ole Miss, has made 14 career starts.

CLAP FOR THE WOLF, MAN: Offensive line coach **Eric Wolford** was nominated for the Frank Broyles Assistant Coach of the Year honors. Wolford's front line has been the Gamecocks' most consistent group all season.

THE YOUNGER WONNUM: True freshman Dylan Wonnum made his first career start against Tennessee and was recognized as the SEC Freshman of the Week. Wonnum became the first true freshman to start on the offensive line since Mike Matulis in 2011. With Dylan starting at right tackle and D.J. Wonnum starting at Buck, they became the first set of brothers to start for Carolina since the 2014 season when Gerald Dixon and Gerald Dixon Jr. were starters along the defensive line.

YOU WONNUM, WE GOT 'EM: Junior Buck D.J. Wonnum was selected a team captain a year ago as a sophomore, and is the leader up front. Wonnum was voted the Gamecocks' Most Productive Defensive Player in 2017 after logging 13.0 tackles for loss, including 6.0 sacks. He had three tackles, including a tackle for loss, in the season opener before leaving with a foot injury. The injury has kept him off the field until he returned to the lineup against Tennessee. He responded in that contest with three tackles including a pair of sacks, one of which sealed the victory in the waning minutes of the game, earning SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week accolades for the third time in his career.

THE BROTHERS WONNUM: When junior defensive end **D.J. Wonnum** was named the SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week and younger brother **Dylan Wonnum** was the SEC's Freshman of the Week against Tennessee, it marked the first time in SEC history that brothers garnered Player-of-the-Week recognition in the same week.

THE LONG ARM OF KINLAW: Junior defensive tackle Javon Kinlaw is a force in the middle of the line. Down to around 305 pounds after coming in a year ago at about 340, Kinlaw has been credited with 33 tackles, He leads the team with two forced fumbles, is second with 3.5 sacks, and third with 9.0 tackles for loss. He was the SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week for his outstanding performance in the win at Vanderbilt.

BRUNSON BRINGS IT: Junior linebacker T.J. Brunson is the Gamecocks' top tackler. He leads the team with 83 tackles on the season, ranking ninth in the SEC, including 48 solo stops. He has filled the stat line lately, collecting 14 tackles vs. Tennessee, logging 15 tackles with 3.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks at Ole Miss, then matching his career high with a season-best 16 stops at Florida including 3.0 tackles for loss with a pair of sacks. Brunson, who was the first player that Coach Muschamp recruited upon his hire, was second on the squad with 88 tackles a year ago. He earned a spot on the AP's All-Bowl team following his 13-tackle, two-sack performance in the Outback Bowl win over Michigan.

YOUNG SECONDARY: The Gamecocks have been battered with injuries in the secondary. Seniors J.T. Ibe and Nick Harvey have not played for several weeks, while Jamyest Williams and Javon Charleston were injured in the Ole Miss game and are out for the season. Jaylin Dickerson, who missed all of last season with an injury, suffered a hamstring injury at Florida and did not play last week. Three true freshman, Jaycee Horn, R.J. Roderick and Israel Mukuamu, are now seeing significant playing time, although Horn left the UTC game after one play with an ankle injury. Redshirt senior walk-on Jason Senn made his Gamecock debut on Senior Day against the Mocs, playing extensively at safety.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: True freshman defensive back Jaycee Horn became just the seventh true freshman to start for the Gamecocks in the season opener since the 2009 season joining Stephon Gilmore (2009), Marcus Lattimore (2010), Jadeveon Clowney (2011), Bryson Allen-Williams (2014), Al Harris Jr. (2014) and Bryan Edwards (2016).

DON'T MESS WITH THE BULL: Jaycee Horn was recognized on the 247Sports midseason true freshman All-America team. Horn, the son of former NFL standout wide receiver Joe Horn, has 39 tackles with a team-high eight pass breakups. He was named the SEC Freshman of the Week for his efforts in the win over Mizzou when he was credited with four pass breakups. He also logged

three tackles, including a key diving trip, forcing Damari Crockett to step out of bounds on the 11-yard line instead of taking it in for a touchdown. The Tigers ended up not scoring on that drive, which was a key turning point in the game.

SAFETY FIRST: True freshman safety R.J. Roderick stepped up in the Ole Miss win after injuries sidelined Jamyest Williams and Javon Charleston. He responded with 13 tackles after having just 11 through the first seven games. It was the most tackles for a freshman at South Carolina since James Seawright logged 17 in 1981 against Kentucky. He earned his first start at Florida and collected nine more tackles.

FENTON ISLAND: Senior cornerback Rashad Fenton has half of the team's six interceptions this season, giving him five in his career, the most among active players. He had interceptions in three consecutive games, picking off Georgia's Jake Fromm, Vanderbilt's Kyle Shurmur and Kentucky's Terry Wilson. He is tied for third in the SEC with his three picks. KICKING IT WITH PARKER: Redshirt sophomore Parker White has been successful on 49-of-52 attempts this season, going 13-for-15 on field goal attempts (including a career-high tying 3-for-3 at Vanderbilt and vs. Missouri) and 36-for-37 on extra points. For his career, he is 27-of-40 (67.5 percent) on field goal attempts, including 21-of-23 (91.3 percent) from inside 40 yards, and 62-for-63 on extra points.

SEC RECOGNITION: Parker White earned co-SEC Special Teams Player of the Week accolades for his performance in the win over Missouri. The sophomore hit on all three of his field goal attempts, connecting from a season-long 42 yards on two occasions, and a 33-yard game-winner with just two seconds remaining. All three of his field goals came in the second half when the field conditions were soggy due to a rainstorm, and gave Carolina the lead (24-23, 34-32 and 37-35).

ICE ICE BABY: Parker White has three fourthquarter game-winning field goals in his career, including two this season. He hit from 33-yards out in the final seconds to defeat Missouri and connected from 25 yards for the difference-maker with about six minutes remaining in the win over Tennessee. Last season, he connected from 31-yards out in the final seconds against Louisiana Tech to lift Carolina to victory.



COLUMBIA, S.C. — Kelly Bryant threw two touchdowns to Hunter Renfrow and No. 4 Clemson kept on track for a third straight trip to the College Football Playoff with a 34-10 victory over rival South Carolina on Saturday night.

The Tigers (11-1, No. 3 College Football Playoff) won their fourth straight game in the Palmetto State's most cared-about sporting event, tying their second-longest run of dominance in the series.

The win was the 100th in Clemson coach Dabo Swinney's career. And



The Tigers entered wary of a rejuvenated South Carolina (8-4, No. 24 CFP), which finished second in the Southeastern Conference East and had its most victories in a season in four years. But Clemson's defense bottled up the Gamecocks and quarterback Jake Bentley for a second consecutive season.

Fittingly, cornerback Ryan Carter opened Clemson's scoring with a 12-yard pick-six on quarterback Jake Bentley's bad throw near his goal line.

South Carolina managed just 99 yards in the first half and 207 for the game, its lowest total this season.

Renfrow, whose 2-yard TD catch with a second left gave Clemson a 35-31 win over Alabama in the national title game in January, scored on passes of 4 and 61 yards to put things out of reach. Renfrow had his third career two-TD game, the other two coming in Clemson's national championship appearances against Alabama the previous two years.

Bryant completed 23 of 34 passes for 272 yards, his most since throwing for 316 yards against Louisville on Sept. 16.

Bentley finished 16 of 29 for 126 yards, two interceptions and a 38-yard TD pass to Bryan Edwards late in the fourth quarter. Bentley passed for just 41 yards against the Tigers in a 56-7 loss in 2016.

GAME CHANGER

Clemson scored its first touchdown on a 12-yard interception return from Ryan Carter with 6:50 left in the first quarter. That occurred after the South Carolina defense held the Tigers' offense on their first possession. Clemson never trailed while putting up 469 yards of offense.

KEY STAT

35:26 — Clemson's ground game combined with its defense held the ball for 35:26 on the night. Clemson converted on seven of its 16 third-down conversions and were 3-for-3 scored in the red zone.

Will Muschamp is in his third season directing the Gamecocks' football fortunes in 2018. Muschamp was introduced as the University of South Carolina's 34th head football coach on December 7, 2015.

In his first season in Columbia, Muschamp guided the Gamecocks to a 6-7 mark and a spot in the Birmingham Bowl. The Gamecocks doubled their win total from the previous season while increasing their SEC wins from one to three. The Gamecocks started as many true freshman (7) as any school in the country, and were the only Division I school to have true freshmen lead the team in both passing (Jake Bentley) and rushing (Rico Dowdle). Seventy-six of the Gamecocks' 113-man Birmingham Bowl roster (67.3 percent) were either freshmen or sophomores in Muschamp's first campaign.

His second season brought more success, as the team won nine games for just the seventh time in school history, was the only Power 5 school to have a multiple win total increase in each of the last two seasons, finished second in the SEC East and earned a second-straight bowl appearance. The season culminated with an Outback Bowl victory over Michigan on New Year's Day.

Regarded as an outstanding defensive mind, Muschamp is a 23-year coaching veteran, including 15 years in the Southeastern Conference. In six seasons as a head coach, all in the SEC, Muschamp owns a 43-32 record, a .573 winning percentage. With a 15-11 mark at South Carolina, he matched Joe Morrison and Steve Spurrier for the most wins in their first two seasons at the helm. His previous head coaching experience came at the University of Florida where he posted a 28-21 record from 2011-14. He led the Gators to three bowl games in his four seasons in



Gainesville and was recognized as the SEC Coach of the Year in 2012 after guiding Florida to an 11-2 record and a Top-10 finish.

As an assistant coach, the Rome, Ga., native has worked in two national championship games (2003 and 2009), winning with LSU in 2003, and coached in a pair of BCS bowl games following the 2008 and 2012 seasons. He has coached in and won three conference championship games, twice in the SEC and once in the Big 12. He was a finalist for the 2007 Broyles Award, presented to the nation's top assistant coach.

Prior to his arrival in Columbia, Muschamp most recently served as the defensive coordinator at Auburn University in 2015, his third stint as an SEC defensive coordinator. He also held that title with Auburn from 2006-07 and at LSU from 2002-04. In his six seasons as an SEC defensive coordinator, Muschamp's units ranked among the nation's Top-10 in total defense and in scoring defense five times.

Muschamp's first full-time coaching experience in the SEC came at LSU. He was the Tigers' linebacker coach for one season before being elevated to defensive coordinator from 2002-04. His 2003 defense helped the Tigers to the national championship by leading the nation both in scoring defense (11.0 ppg) and total defense (252.0 ypg), while finishing second nationally in pass efficiency defense (89.8) and third in rushing defense (67.0 ypg).

Prior to taking the reins at Florida, Muschamp served as the defensive coordinator at Texas from 2008-10. Under his guidance, the Longhorn defense ranked No. 1 in the nation with 119 sacks and ranked in the Top-10 nationally allowing 2.9 yards per rushing attempt (third), 96.7 rushing yards per game (fourth) and 297.4 yards per

game (seventh), all Big 12 bests during that span. In 2009, Texas played in the BCS National Championship game. Under Muschamp's tutelage, Brian Orakpo won the 2008 Rotary Lombardi, Bronko Nagurski and Ted Hendricks awards. In the 2009 and 2010 NFL Drafts, Muschamp had a combined eight players drafted, seven in the first four rounds, including first-rounders Brian Orakpo and Earl Thomas.

In four of his nine seasons as an FBS defensive coordinator, his teams have allowed less than 100 rushing yards per game and twice led the nation in rushing defense. His 2003 LSU defense led the country by allowing 67 yards per game on the ground, the best mark by an SEC team in the 2000s, while Texas gave up just 73.1 yards on the ground in 2009 to pace the nation.

A 1994 Georgia graduate, Muschamp moved immediately into coaching, working as a GA at Auburn from 1995-96, while earning his master's degree. He served as a secondary coach at West Georgia (1998) and Eastern Kentucky (1999) before moving into his first defensive coordinator position at Valdosta State for the 2000 season, where he helped the Blazers to a 10-2 record and the Gulf South title.

Muschamp also logged a stint in the NFL, working as the Miami Dolphins Assistant Head Coach for Defense in 2005 under Nick Saban.

During his playing career at Georgia, Muschamp earned his way from walk-on to scholarship player by the spring of his redshirt freshman season and eventually was named co-captain as a senior. A safety on the gridiron, he earned a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 1993.

Born August 3, 1971, Muschamp and his wife, the former Carol Davis, have two sons, Jackson and Whit.

Jake Bentley threw for four touchdowns, Rico Dowdle scored twice and South Carolina beat Coastal Carolina 49-15 Saturday in a season opener for each team.

The Gamecocks didn't show any sign of their historical pattern of letting smaller opponents hang around. South Carolina scored in the first three minutes, twice in the first 10 and put the game away on its third touchdown with 6:03 to go before halftime.



"I think we were very efficient offensively, obviously, when you're able to stay balanced like that," South Carolina coach Will Muschamp said. "Defensively, we didn't give up anything big, except for some silly penalties we need to get cleaned up."

South Carolina rolled up 557 yards of offense and six different players scored. Receiver Deebo Samuel, recovered from a broken leg that ended his season after just three games last year, made a one-handed grab in the corner of the end zone.

Dowdle broke 100 yards for the fourth time in his career while Ty'Son Williams rushed 11 times for 82 yards. Samuel caught seven balls and Shi Smith led the Gamecocks with 61 yards receiving.

Coastal Carolina was held to 238 yards.

"I think we played hard against what I think is one of the better teams in the country. I think it took us a while to get used to their speed on both sides of the ball," Coastal coach Joe Moglia said. "They were able to control the line of scrimmage, especially when their offense was on the field."

Top South Carolina defensive lineman D.J. Wonnum injured his left ankle in the third quarter and was taken to the locker room. Muschamp said that it was a sprained ankle and from what he knew Saturday, Wonnum will be fine for the next game.

South Carolina defensive back Nick Harvey was ejected for targeting and will miss the first half of the next game.

GAME CHANGER

South Carolina scored on each of its first three possessions and six of its first seven drives, taking a 42-6 lead after three quarters of play. Rico Dowdle had a pair of touchdowns, one on the ground and one in the air. The Gamecocks had 32 first downs on the day and had 557 yards overall.

557 — South Carolina had 263 yards on the ground and 294 in the air in the victory over Coastal Carolina. Rico Dowdle had 105 rushing yards while quarterback Jake Bentley was 22-for-29 for 250 yards and four TDs. COLUMBIA, S.C. (**AP**) — Jake Fromm threw for 194 yards and a touchdown, all three of Georgia's latest running combo scored touchdowns and the third-ranked Bulldogs came away with a 41-17 victory over No. 24 South Carolina on Saturday.

Fromm was 15-of-18 passing, including a 34-yard TD pass to Mecole Hardman. D'Andre Swift, Elijah Holyfield and Brian Herrien looked every bit as effective as NFL runners Nick Chubb and Sony Mi-



chel did a year ago in leading Georgia to the College Football Playoff. Holyfield led the way with 76 yards and a 5-yard score. Swift had a 17-yard TD run, and Herrien piled on with a 15-yard scoring burst in the third quarter as Georgia went up by 31 points. That's when many in the crowd of 83,140 began to file out in disappointment - a familiar ritual against the Bulldogs.

Cornerback Deandre Baker set the tone on defense early with an interception off a tipped ball in the opening minute that led to a quick, if unconventional touchdown. Baker let the ball loose before crossing the goal line, but teammate Juwan Taylor fell on it in the endzone for a touchdown.

From there, Georgia's defense and run game took over. The Bulldogs outrushed South Carolina 271 yards to 54.

When South Carolina had a chance to tie it after Rashad Fenton's interception deep in Georgia territory, the Bulldogs allowed just a yard on the next four plays. They took over on downs after Bentley's fourth-down incompletion.

Georgia rarely let up. South Carolina drove 70 yards to the Bulldogs' 5 in the fourth quarter before safety J.R. Reed's end-zone interception.

South Carolina quarterback Jake Bentley threw for 269 yards with one touchdowns and two interceptions.

GAME CHANGER

Georgia scored on its final offensive possession of the first half on a 44-yard field goal by Rodrigo Blankenship, giving the Bulldogs a 20-10 halftime lead. Georgia got the ball to start the second half and scored on six plays, capped by a Mecole Hardman 34-yard touchdown reception from Jake Fromm as Georgia scored 21 straight points in the third quarter.

South Carolina 37 Vanderbilt 14





NASHVILLE, TENN. (AP) —

Jake Bentley threw for 261 yards and a touchdown, and the South Carolina Gamecocks bounced back from their hurricane-forced break, routing Vanderbilt 37-14 Saturday.

South Carolina (2-1, 1-1 South-eastern Conference) had its game against Marshall canceled by Hurricane Florence, leaving the Gamecocks looking for a 12th game this season. The Gamecocks hadn't played since being routed 41-17 by now-No. 2 Georgia on Sept. 8.



They showed no rust as South Carolina won its 10th straight and 17th in the last 19 years against Vanderbilt.

The Gamecocks scored the game's first 10 points and then reeled off 20 straight after Vanderbilt got within 17-14 late in the first half. South Carolina could have had a bigger margin of victory but lost two fumbles inside the Vandy 30 in the fourth quarter after a 39-minute lightning and rain delay.

Rico Dowdle ran for a TD and 112 yards, and Mon Denson and Ty'Son Williams each ran for touchdowns. Parker White kicked three field goals for South Carolina.

Vanderbilt (2-2, 0-1) felt pretty confident coming into its SEC opener after coming up just short in a 22-17 loss at No. 8 Notre Dame last week . The Commodores couldn't match Bentley and the Gamecocks who outgained them 149-32 in the first quarter and finished 534-284 in total offense.

Ke'Shawn Vaughn scored on a 2-yard TD run after an interception. Kyle Shurmur added a 2-yard TD pass for Vanderbilt. The Commodores struggled with snapping the ball and even switched right guard Bruno Reagan over to center late. It didn't help with a bad snap on third down and Vanderbilt trying to chip away at the Gamecocks' lead late.

GAME CHANGER

South Carolina led Vanderbilt, 20-14, going into halftime. The Gamecock defense forced Vanderbilt into a punt on the Commodores first possession of the second half, then used a 10-play, 61-yard drive to take a nine-point lead after a 36-yard field goal by Parker White. Carolina added a third-quarter touchdown from Mon Denson and a late touchdown by Ty'Son Williams for the final scores of the contest.



LEXINGTON, KY. (AP) —

Benny Snell Jr. ran for 99 yards and one of Kentucky's three consecutive first-half touchdowns before the No. 17 Wildcats held on for a 24-10 victory over South Carolina on Saturday night.

Kentucky (5-0, 3-0 Southeastern Conference) quashed initial concerns about a letdown following their first Top 25 ranking since November 2007 by scoring on four straight drives to lead 24-3 at half-time. The Wildcats ended up need-



ing that cushion to offset a scoreless second half and Jake Bentley's 58-yard, third quarter TD pass that kept the Gamecocks (2-2, 1-2) within striking distance.

Mike Edwards' interception with 3:47 remaining snuffed one chance by the Gamecocks before they turned the ball over on downs in the final minute. That sealed Kentucky's fifth consecutive series win and continued its best SEC start since 1977.

Snell's rushing yardage on 28 carries also made him the third Wildcat to break 3,000 career. His 4-yard score with 4:53 remaining in the second quarter extended his TD record to 40. Quarterback Terry Wilson and A.J. Rose ran for TDs from 1 and 24 yards as Kentucky edged South Carolina 327-321 in yardage. The Wildcats also registered four takeaways, scoring 10 points off a fumble and interception.

GAME CHANGER

Kentucky scored three rushing touchdowns in the second quarter as Benny Snell, Terry Wilson and Asim Rose each found paydirt to give the Wildcats a 24-3 halftime lead. Kentucky ended the contest with 195 rushing yards, 99 coming from Snell.

JBackup quarterback Michael Scarnecchia threw for three touchdowns in his first college start and Parker White hit the game-winning 33-yard field goal with two seconds left in South Carolina's 37-35 victory over Missouri on Saturday.

The Tigers (3-2, 0-2 Southeastern Conference) had gone ahead 35-34 on Tucker McCann's careerlong 57-yard field goal with 1:18 remaining. But the Gamecocks,



behind Scarnecchia, drove to the Missouri 16 where White nailed his third go-ahead field goal of the game.

The Gamecocks (3-2, 2-2) rallied from 23-14 at halftime to win their third straight over Missouri in a game that last more than five hours due to rain and lightning delays.

When White's kick sailed through, only a few thousand soggy fans remained from the announced crowd of 73,393.

Scarnecchia, a senior, started when Jake Bentley was kept out due to a knee injury suffered last week against Kentucky.

And Scarnecchia did not flinch, connecting on touchdown passes of 5 and 17 yards to Bryan Edwards in the first half and 8 yards to Deebo Samuel in the third quarter.

White had a 42-yard field goal to put South Carolina in front 24-23 and linebacker Sharrod Greene stepped in front of Drew Lock's floater for a 12-yard pick-6 to increase the lead.

Missouri was not done as McCann's 44-yard field goal after a botched South Carolina punt put the Tigers up 32-31. White answered next time drive with a second 42-yarder to retake the lead 34-32.

Scarnecchia completed 20 of 35 passes for 249 yards.

Missouri's Lock, the SEC leader at 320 yards passing a game coming in, was held to his lowest total of the season at 204.

GAME CHANGER

Parker White hit his second career game-winning field goal with two seconds remaining to give the Gamecocks the 37-35 win. White was 3-for-3 on field goals in the game, hitting on a pair of 42-yarders in the second half.

Kellen Mond threw for 353 yards and freshman Seth Small had four field goals, including the go-ahead kick in the fourth quarter, to lift No. 22 Texas A&M to a 26-23 victory over South Carolina.

The Aggies (5-2, 3-1 SEC) moved to 5-0 against the Gamecocks (3-3, 2-3) since joining the league in 2012.

Mond also had a 4-yard touchdown pass to Jace Sternberger in the second quarter and, when



Small hit a 32-yard field goal on the Aggies' first drive of the second half to go up 16-0, it looked like more than enough to put away the Gamecocks, who managed just 102 yards of offense the first 30 minutes.

That's when Jake Bentley, returning after missing last week's win over Missouri with a knee injury, led a pair of third-quarter TD drives - and the two-point conversions both times.

Bentley had a 22-yard scoring pass to Shi Smith to start the comeback, then hit Chavis Dawkins for a 33-yard touchdown throw off a flea flicker.

Texas A&M responded with the winning drive, moving 45 yards to set Small up for a 39-yard field goal with 9:16 left. The Aggies sealed things with Trayveon Williams' 3-yard score with 1:36 left.

South Carolina got a final TD pass from Bentley to Samuel with 48 seconds to go, but could not execute an onside kick attempt.

Mond got the Aggies going when he found his big tight end Sternberger. The 6-foot-4, 250-pound junior had a 53-yard reception where he dragged safety Steven Montac (some 65 pounds lighter) about 25 yards inside the South Carolina 10.

Small opened Texas A&M's scoring with a 52-yard field goal, the freshman tying his career long kick.

South Carolina struggled with Bentley back behind center in the opening half. The junior was 6 of 17 passing the first 30 minutes for 46 yards. He had an awful interception in the end zone to kill off the Gamecocks best scoring chance of the half.

Mond was 25 of 37 passing. His 353 yards was the second most of his career.

GAME CHANGER

Carolina scored touchdowns and was successful on two straight two-point conversions, but A&M answered those drives to take a lead it would never relinquish on Small's 39-yard field goal with 9:16 left.

Jake Bentley threw for 152 yards and a touchdown and South Carolina's defense stopped Tennessee on downs twice in the final quarter as the Gamecocks rallied from 12-points down for a 27-24 victory Saturday night.

Parker White's 25-yard field goal with 5:52 remaining proved the difference, the second time in South Carolina's past three game he's gotten the game winning kick.

D.J. Wonnum, back after missing five games with an ankle injury, sacked Vols quarterback Jarrett Guarantano on fourth down with 1:08 to go to seal the win.

The Vols (3-5, 1-4 Southeastern Conference) looked like they had gained control when they went up 21-9 on Carlin Fils-aime's 14-yard TD run early in the third quarter.

But with the previous six meetings in the series decided by 20 points, there was little chance this one wouldn't tighten up.

The Gamecocks (4-3, 3-3) began the comeback on Rico Dowdle's 1-yard touchdown run. Then, after a Vols field goal, South Carolina responded again.

Bentley connected with Bryan Edwards on a 73-yard pass to the Tennessee 2 and two plays later Ty'Son Willams bulled in for a 1-yard touchdown run.

Bentley ran past three defenders for a two-point conversion and a 24-all tie.

After Javon Kinlaw knocked down Guarantano's fourth-down pass with 9:47 to go, Bentley led the Gamecocks to the Vols 8 to set Parker up for the go-ahead kick.

Tennessee drove to midfield the final time it had the ball before Wonnum wrapped up Guarantano on fourth-and-10.

Tennessee finally got off to a quick start.

Guarantano helped the Vols convert four third downs on a 71-yard TD drive that ended with a 6-yard pass to Jauan Jennings, to put the Vols up 14-3.

Carolina came right back. Bentley was 4-of-6 passing for 34 yards on the next series, the last completion a 3-yard heave to the end zone that Deebo Samuel tracked down when it looked like it might sail out of the end zone to head into the break behind 14-9.

GAME CHANGER

The Gamecock defense stopped Tennessee on fourth and 7 with 5:18 remaining in the game. South Carolina then went on a nineplay, 57-yard drive that ended with a 25-yard field goal from Parker White, giving the Gamecocks a 27-24 lead with 3:55 left. Carolina stopped the Vols on their next drive, solidifying the win.



South Carolina 48 Ole Miss 44






OXFORD, MISS. (AP) —

Jake Bentley passed for two touchdowns and scored the game-winning touchdown on a 4-yard run with 5:50 left to lift South Carolina to a 48-44 comeback win over Mississippi on Saturday.

South Carolina (5-3, 4-3) erased a 44-34 deficit in the fourth quarter to win consecutive games for the first time this season. The Gamecocks covered 47 and 73 yards in fourth-quarter scoring drives, capped by a 3-yard run from A.J.



Turner and Bentley's decisive score, respectively.

Bentley finished 22-of-32 passing for 363 yards as the Gamecocks had 510 total yards. The South Carolina defense, after giving up eight scores in 10 possessions, closed with four consecutive scoreless series to preserve the win.

Ole Miss (5-4, 1-4) rallied from an early 17-3 deficit for a 27-27 tie at halftime and moved out to a 44-34 fourth-quarter lead. Jordan Ta'amu was 31-of-46 passing for 379 yards as the Rebels had 616 yards of total offense, including 141 rushing yards on 21 carries from Scottie Phillips.

The first-half shootout opened on a 90-yard kickoff return touchdown by Deebo Samuel as the Gamecocks raced to an early 14-point lead. By halftime, Parker White had field goals of 20 and 23 yards, Ty'Son Williams scored on a 2-yard run and Bryan Edwards pulled in a 75-yard touchdown pass from Bentley for South Carolina.

Ole Miss countered with a 24-point outburst in the second period, highlighted by touchdown runs of 1 and 9 yards by Phillips. Luke Logan added field goals of 25 and 26 yards, while Ta'amu scored on a 17-yard run.

The Rebels got second-half touchdown runs from Phillips and Isaiah Woullard on 2 and 1 yards, respectively. Josh Vann had a 5-yard scoring pass from Bentley late in the third quarter before South Carolina rallied in the final 12 minutes.

South Carolina's defense stopped Ole Miss on the Rebels' last four drives as the Gamecocks came back from a 10-point deficit to win, 48-44. That set up the game-winning score as Jake Bentley ran in from four yards out after a 69-yard rush by Mon Denson.

Feleipe Franks silenced the home crowd twice after touchdown runs, seemingly sending a message after getting benched last week and booed earlier in the game, and No. 19 Florida rallied to beat South Carolina 35-31 Saturday and end a two-game losing streak.

Franks dived across the goal line on a fourth-down play from inside the 1-yard line with 4:09 to play, putting the Gators (7-3, 5-3 Southeastern Conference, No.



15 CFP) ahead for the first time and for good. Florida overcame a 17-point deficit in the second half.

C.J. Henderson ended the Gamecocks' comeback attempt by picking off Jake Bentley.

But Franks was the player of the game, even if he thrived in a villain role. The sophomore put his fingers to his lips while celebrating with teammates, the kind of gesture usually seen from visitors.

Franks completed 15 of 21 passes for 161 yards and a touchdown. He also ran for two scores a week after getting pulled for the third time in two seasons.

Coach Dan Mullen opened up the quarterback competition, but backup Kyle Trask broke a foot in practice Wednesday and is out for the season. That left Franks as Mullen's only viable option.

Fans expressed their displeasure after consecutive plays on the first series in which Franks fumbled and badly overthrew a receiver.

South Carolina (5-4, 4-4) scored touchdowns on its first two possessions and looked like it would roll in the Swamp.

But Franks and the Gators woke up and rallied, preventing former coach Will Muschamp from getting a victory in his second trip back to Florida Field since getting fired.

Jordan Scarlett ran for 159 yards. Lamical Perine added 107 yards and two scores on the ground.

Trailing by 17 points, Florida rattled off 21 unanswered, beginning with a Kadarius Toney 18-yard touchdown pass from Feleipe Franks with 56 seconds left in the third quarter. Carolina had just 23 yards in the fourth quarter as a pair of Gator touchdowns in the frame gave Florida the four-point victory.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) —

Quarterback Jake Bentley threw for 339 yards and tied his career best with four touchdowns as the Gamecocks became bowl eligible with a 49-9 victory over Chattanooga on Saturday night.

A.J. Turner, a junior with eight career touchdowns coming in, accounted for three TDs for the Gamecocks (6-4) against the Mocs (6-5) of the Football Championship Subdivision.



The win was an important one

for the Gamecocks (6-4), whose time was running out at trying to make the postseason.

The Gamecocks, who fell to FCS opponent The Citadel here three years ago, didn't want to mess around with Chattanooga. Bentley and Turner made sure they started fast with touchdowns on their first three possessions.

Bentley was 5-of-6 passing on South Carolina's opening possession, including a 16-yard TD throw to Turner.

He was at it again the next time he got the ball with a 12-play drive that ended with a 6-yard TD throw to Turner.

Turner was front and center on the next drive, too, finishing the series with an 11-yard scoring run.

Turner had only one touchdown in eight games this season before breaking out big against Chattanooga in the opening half.

Bentley, who was 25 of 29 passing, didn't stop after the break in adding scoring throws of 53 yards to Shi Smith and 61 yards to Samuel.

Samuel finished with five catches for 112 yards, his second straight game with over 100 yards receiving.

Chattanooga was overmatched from the start. The Mocs had a field goal and an extra point blocked. They were just one of eight on third-down tries in the opening half.

Chattanooga's lone TD came when receiver Bryce Nunnelly threw a 2-yard scoring pass to a wide open quarterback Nick Tiano with less than five minutes left in the game.

GAME CHANGER

A.J. Turner was on the receiving end of two touchdown passes from Jake Bentley in the first quarter of the win over Chattanooga. Turner caught three passes for 34 yards and rushed for 65 yards and a touchdown as the Gamecocks never trailed in the 40-point win.

602 — The Carolina offense had 602 yards in the win over the Mocs as Jake Bentley went 25-for-29 for 339 yards while Deshaun Fenwick, who played in his first career game as a Gamecock, eclipsed the 100-yard barrier, rushing for 112 yards on 17 carries.
