From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

This weekend we celebrate, The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

Jesus Christ, we know, comes as a ruler, but first and foremost he rules as a pastor over his sheep. This is an important point to remember. He rules with true love, he cares for the needy, he has man in his heart. He seeks the lost sheep, not abandoning them. He also will feed those who are hungry. And lastly, in a new style of kingship, he will give his life for his sheep. Not very common among the worldly kings or the worldly elite. He would rather sacrifice others than themselves. So, it is a different form of ruling.

This is where you and I have to really come and to meditate upon who this Christ is for us. Because at the same time he is a King who conquers. But we don't see weapons in his hands. We don't see armaments to win over people. Because he calls out to the hearts and minds of every one of us. And his rule, while he is in command, never wants to subjugate people. He wants to give them their dignity, he wants to hold them up. He not only is a king who wins over hearts and minds, because he is not into resident geographical boundaries, how extense is the kingdom geographically. We know he is a king who promotes justice, truth, mercy and love.

There are two great laws that govern His kingdom: Love of God and Love of neighbor. Jesus the Good Shepherd-King in examining the service of his subjects interestingly uses the first person singular: I thirst, I hunger, I am not welcomed, . . . And their response is when did we see you in all of these conditions? Jesus responds saying: whatever you did for the least of my brethren you did for me.

What a unique king is this. And this is a king to whom you and I offer our allegiance. The king who is really looking out for us. And the Father sent him to the kingdom that was lost by original sin so that Christ would win it back by his own passion death and resurrection. He would gather all people and present them to the father at the end of time.

When Jesus entered Jerusalem, sitting on the humble ass – the beast of burden – He came as the King of all men; He came to fulfill the will of His father and to enter upon His sorrowful and most cruel death for our salvation. At another time, when He came into this world on Christmas Night, He came too as our King – but in the stillness of the night while the world cared for other things; He came then in that meekness which ever characterized Him. At this present day, Jesus our King, comes to us in His meekness which adds to the joy of Christians, but becomes a stumbling block to unbelievers – He comes to us in Holy Communion, in such a meek manner, that were it not for our faith, we would not even recognize Him – He comes under the appearance of a small piece of bread. We admire Him and adore Him for His meekness. We pledge our allegiance to Him; we call Him our King, and we heartily follow Him.

The motive which prompts Christ to do so much for us is His love for us. As the Christian looks at His dying savior on the Cross, he remembers what Jesus had said while teaching men: “No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.” (Jn 15,13)

The rewards which Christ give to those who follow Him are everlasting happiness with Him in heaven. Christ's reward is not like the rewards of Satan which perish in time and leave the person in a more unhappy state than before. Riches, honor, pleasure, and comfort are the rewards which Satan takes his pray unto himself to treat the poor unfortunate victim as he will. “What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him,” is the substance of what St. Paul told his Christian followers.

Kneeling, then, before the crucifix, we may bring to mind these thoughts which are conveyed by it, and hearken to the invitation: “Follow Me.” Harken to that invitation especially this Advent.

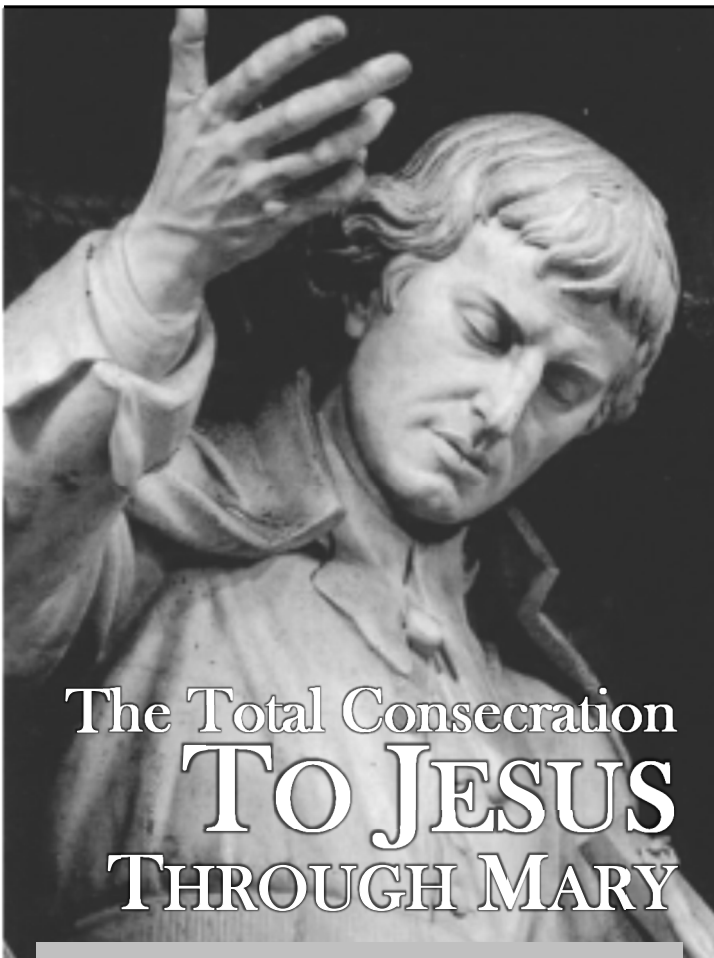

7:00am – Meet at OLOP to board the bus

7:30am – Bus leaves OLOP lot on time

9:00am – Early arrival for Mass at St. Mary’s Cathedral with Archbishop Cordileone

11:00am - Info Faire Civic Center Plaza (time to eat that bagged lunch you brought)

12:30pm - Rally for Life

1:30pm - Walk for Life route is from Civic Center Plaza, along Market Street (2 miles), towards Justin Herman Plaza/Ferry Bldg. Bus Pick Up Locations TBD.

3:00pm – Meet at Bus, prepare for return to OLOP

3:30pm – Bus leaves promptly to avoid overtime bus fees. **Do not be late!**

5:30pm –It takes awhile to leave the streets of San Francisco, but the **bus should arrive before**

5:30pm latest.

How to prepare:

You will receive route/bus instructions on the day of the walk. Just make sure you get to OLOP before the bus leaves and that you plan to return on the bus on time. *Bring comfortable walking shoes, a bagged lunch, and bottled water.* We walk rain or shine, so check weather conditions to plan accordingly. Don’t worry - even the one year it rained buckets, it was a great experience.

Rally For Life Speakers:

Patricia Sandoval--Patricia was a young girl who felt abandoned by her parents, and after three abortions and work at an abortion clinic, became a methamphetamine addict living on the streets-until a miracle occurred. Ms. Sandoval is now a renowned, full-time international pro-life and chastity speaker inspiring thousands with her harrowing and exhilarating story of redemption--through EWTN’s Cara a Cara and Women of Grace.

Walter B. Hoye II--An ordained Baptist preacher and the Founder/President of Issues4Life Foundation; the California Civil Rights Foundation; Founder of the Frederick Douglass Foundation of California; an Executive Member of the National Black Pro-Life Coalition, and a Board Member of The Morning Center, which was founded to provide free full-service maternity care for women in urban and under-served areas. Walter addresses the “Pro-Life Movement” with special emphasis on the impact of “Abortion in the Black America”, “Personhood” and the “Role of Men Meeting the Physical and Spiritual Needs of Women.”

Father Shenan Boquet--As President of Human Life International (HLI), Fr. Bouquet was ordained in 1993 and is a priest of the Houma-Thibodaux Roman Catholic Diocese in Louisiana, his home state, where he served before joining HLI in August 2011 and now spreads the Catholic Church’s teaching on Life and Family as part of HLI’s global mission to build a Culture of Life. Father has appeared on a number of local, National, and International Catholic Media (TV & Radio) outlets.
