

**Introduction**... Dr. Jeff Bearden, Superintendent of Forsyth County Schools, and the American Heart Association have challenged every school in the county to aid in the mission of saving lives! While the participation of these activities is voluntary, there are many character building and community relations benefits in addition to supporting a worthy cause. When we choose to participate in Jump Rope for Heart, we not only aid the AHA in their mission to end heart disease and stroke but we also stimulate healthy eating habits and instill the importance of physical fitness early in a child's life. With childhood obesity on the rise, schools are viewed as a critical link to improving children's health. A number of studies reveal increased physical activity is linked to better school performance and we all know when you feel well, you do well.

Coal Mountain Elementary School has participated in JRFH for over 30 years and our students have raised more than \$210,000 in the past to support AHA. In addition to supporting the AHA with dollars that are critical to the development of lifesaving research, students will also have fun while learning new fun jump rope skills, the importance of physical activity, how their heart works and the importance of community service. If you need one more reason to support the AHA, here it is - Depending on the amount of contributions collected, gift certificates to purchase physical education equipment are raised for our physical education program. I call that a win/win situation!

**Prior to the event**...Students received a collection envelope at the kick-off celebration last week. Collection of donations is optional, but appreciated, as every child will participate in the JRFH program and centers in PE class the week of November 12 - 16.

**How students can help...**Students who feel led to join the fight against heart disease and stroke are encouraged to collect donations (either online, check or cash) from people that they know (family, friends, church friends, neighbors, ball park friends, parent co-workers, local businesses, etc.). Since all donations are tax deductible, we encourage students to collect online, cash or by a check made payable to the American Heart Association or A.H.A. Many large companies and corporations are glad to make large donations and many have matching programs. All you need to do is ask!

**Online Fundraising...** Online fundraising is easy, fun, and leads to more donations and saves time. Here are the EASY DIRECTIONS:

Step 1 – Register Online and earn the FREE GLOW Wristband \* Go to **heartorg/KidsHeartChallenge**, search for your school. The rest is easy! Or download **the Kids Heart Challenge** mobile app. Step 2 – Send EMAILS, ECARDS or TEXTS to friends and family to ask for donations. **King and Queen...** The girl and boy in each grade level who collect the most donations will be named King and Queen of the event. The King and Queen will be recognized on the Miner Morning news, receive a crown and have their picture taken for the school website.

**Prize Distribution...** In addition to the Heart Hero Crew that students were introduced to at the kick off assembly, Prizes can be earned based on the amount of contributions collected by each student. The prizes are described on the collection envelope and will be distributed approximately four weeks after the event, just before winter break.

**The week of November 12 - 16** ... All students will participate in a Jump Rope unit the week of November 12 - 16 regardless of whether or not they have collected donations for the AHA. Students will learn new jump rope tricks, see cool jump rope teams, listen to popular music and be recognized for their accomplishments!

The Coal Mountain Elementary Counseling department believes in the personal potential of each and every student. We are pleased to offer several (optional) small group counseling opportunities throughout the year to assist students to reach their full personal and academic potential.

We are currently forming a session of small groups for Kindergarten, First and Second Grades. These groups will begin ASAP and will meet between 4 and 6 sessions. If your child has participated in a small group at CME previously, it is typically not helpful to participate in the same small group again unless there are extenuating circumstances. We will make the following small groups available:

<u>Peer Relations and Social Skills, New Comers, Self Esteem, Anger</u> <u>Management, and Changing Families/Divorce</u>

> (Each group requires a minimum of 4 students) Please see a brief description of the groups listed below.

\* <u>The Peer Relations and Social Skills</u> groups will focus on assisting students that are struggling with making (and keeping friends) and the potential resulting consequences. Adequate social skills are critical for students to achieve personal success and help each student to reach his/her highest level of learning. Some of the concepts that will be discussed include:

1. The importance of healthy self-concept in relation to others

2. Skills necessary to interact well with others (respecting personal space,

Recognizing/responding to verbal and nonverbal cues etc...)

3. How to respect self and others

4. Practicing reciprocal dialogue (learning not to monopolize discussions)

\*New Comers group for newly enrolled first and second graders will focus on helping our new members of the Coal Mountain Elementary family to get settled and feel connected to our school community. We will have an opportunity to meet other new students as well as explore/learn about the school in a nurturing, low stress and encouraging environment. \* <u>The Self Esteem</u> group will focus on assisting students that are struggling with healthy selfconcept. We believe that students that lack personal self-reliance and confidence are less likely to perform to potential personally, academically, and socially. Some of the concepts that will be discussed include:

1. We all have strengths and growth areas (Individuality)

- 2. How to use communication skills to ask for help when needed
- Accepting mistakes as essential components to the learning process
   How to articulate feelings of competence and confidence
- 5. Identifying attitudes and behaviors leading to successful learning

\* <u>The Anger Management</u> group will focus on assisting students that are struggling with frustration tolerance and expressing feelings of anger. Students that struggle with anger expression may have a tendency to allow anger to "get out of control" which can negatively impact academic, personal, and social functioning. Some of the concepts that will be discussed include:

Everyone gets angry
 Anger versus fear
 Recognizing personal signs of anger

4. Stop/Think/Act technique as well as Relaxation techniques

5. How to ask for help

\* <u>The Changing Families/Divorce Support</u> group is designed to assist students in family transition. It has been our experience that children seem to cope better with changing families (including separation and divorce, parent remarrying, parent moving out of state, big brother/sister moving out etc...) when they have a chance to share their feelings with others going through similar experiences. Some of the concepts that will be discussed include:

1. Acknowledgement of various family structures.

- 2. The expression of feelings regarding family transition.
- 3. The child is not to blame for transition (including Divorce).
  - 4. All feelings are acceptable and need to be expressed.
- 5. Healthy ways to release/express uncomfortable emotions.


