• UTILITIES: Call for availability of funds; if funds are available, staff/volunteer will complete an application questionnaire to determine eligibility. When seeking assistance for an electric, gas or water bill an account number must be provided to the person completing the form. Telephone bills are NOT covered. We are required to verify the amount owed by this household and are limited to assisting with a one (1) month bill which cannot include deposit or penalty fee. The bill must be in the name of the adult that resides in the household.

RENT: Call for availability of funds. A letter from the landlord (business letterhead if possible) stating how much rent is owed, breaking down the bill if it includes a deposit or penalties, and state the amount of one month's rent, his/her name, address and telephone number. We will call to verify information.
MORTGAGE: Call for availability of funds. At this time staff/volunteer will complete an application questionnaire.

(EHEAP) Emergency Home Energy Assistance Program for the Elderly : (Community Action Team) 321-633-1951 Utilities / Other

If you are living in a household with at least one resident who is age 60 or older, you may be eligible for energy bill payment assistance. Utility categories eligible for heating/cooling bill assistance include electricity, natural gas, wood, and propane. For questions call the number above. The LIHEAP program in your community determines if your household income qualifies for the program. You must fall into one of these categories:

- •Elderly must be at least sixty (60) years old.
- •**Disabled** must be receiving disability benefits from either social security or employer/insurance disability benefits.
- •Households with children under the age of five (5) must provide birth certificates for children five (5) years old or younger.

Your LIHEAP program may be able to offer you one or more of the following types of assistance:

- •Home Energy Assistance an annual credit based on your income and household size.
- •Crisis Energy Assistance provides assistance for deposits and/or final notice.

This program NOW OPEN and accepting new applications.



Brevard County has received State and Federal funding to assist low-income homeowners with repairs. If your household income is at or below the Annual Income Limit for your family size, we may be able to assist you with repairs to your home.

All applicants for this Program must comply with Federal, State and County regulation. This includes repayment of all or part of the assistance provided by this Program to repair your home if you sell or transfer title of your home within the lien period.

Brevard County does not discriminate on the basis of race, creed, color, religion, age, sex, familial status, national origin, or handicap.

You may be eligible if:

• You are a resident of Brevard County outside the city limits of (These cities have their own repair programs):

- Palm Bay 321-952-3429
- Melbourne 321-674-5734
- Cocoa 321-433-8520
- Titusville 321- 567-3784
- You own your home.

• The total income of everyone in your household is at or below the income on the chart for your family size. Under State of Florida regulations, manufactured units may be eligible for repairs. Manufactured units in trailer parks cannot be assisted through this program.

Cares Act Grants Still Available For Businesses & Nonprofits

Brevard County Cares Act Grants Still Available for Small Businesses/Nonprofits Impacted by COVID-19

Updated: Tuesday, October 27, 2020 6:47 AM

BREVARD COUNTY, FL. – Grants of up to \$10,000 are still available through Brevard County Government for small businesses and nonprofit organizations that were financially impacted by the COVID-19 public health emergency. <u>These are grants, not loans, and do not have to be paid back</u>.

To be eligible through the Small Business and Nonprofit Economic Relief Program, the small business:

- · Must be physically located in Brevard County
- Must have had 50 or fewer employees
- Must have been negatively impacted financially by the COVID-19 public health emergency
- Must be enrolled in the U.S. Department of Homeland Security E-Verify program
- Applicant's revenue losses or expenses utilized to establish program eligibility and grant amount must not have been reimbursed through the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL), Small Business Administration (SBA) Debt Relief Program or other similar federal and state programs. Having received those funds or loans, however, does not disqualify you from receiving grant funds to offset other losses.

Nonprofits that are eligible must be a 501(c)(3), 501(c)(6) or a 501(c)(19) as designated by Internal Revenue Code.

EMPLOYEE RIGHTS

PAID SICK LEAVE AND EXPANDED FAMILY AND MEDICAL LEAVE UNDER THE FAMILIES FIRST CORONAVIRUS RESPONSE ACT

The Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA or Act) requires certain employers to provide their employees with paid sick leave and expanded family and medical leave for specified reasons related to COVID-19. These provisions will apply from April 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020.

▶ PAID LEAVE ENTITLEMENTS Generally, employers covered under the Act must provide employees: Up to two weeks (80 hours, or a part-time employee's two-week equivalent) of paid sick leave based on the higher of their regular rate of pay, or the applicable state or Federal minimum wage, paid at: • 100% for qualifying reasons #1-3 below, up to \$511 daily and \$5,110 total; • 2/3 for qualifying reasons #4 and 6 below, up to \$200 daily and \$2,000 total; and • Up to 12 weeks of paid sick leave and expanded family and medical leave paid at 2/3 for qualifying reason #5 below for up to \$200 daily and \$12,000 total. A part-time employee is eligible for leave for the number of hours that the employee is normally scheduled to work over that period.

► ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES In general, employees of private sector employers with fewer than 500 employees, and certain public sector employers, are eligible for up to two weeks of fully or partially paid sick leave for COVID-19 related reasons (see below). Employees who have been employed for at least 30 days prior to their leave request may be eligible for up to an additional 10 weeks of partially paid expanded family and medical leave for reason #5 below.

► QUALIFYING REASONS FOR LEAVE RELATED TO COVID-19

An employee is entitled to take leave related to COVID-19 if the employee is unable to work, including unable to

telework, because the employee:

Extended Benefits:

Due to the increase in the Florida unemployment rate in early 2020, Extended Benefits was triggered for the first time since 2009. Extended Benefits is a federal program implemented by the state. Extended Benefits authorizes up to an additional six weeks of benefits to eligible individuals who have exhausted Reemployment Assistance benefits during periods of high unemployment.

EXTENDED BENEFITS UPDATES:

• The Department has been notified by the U.S. Department of Labor that due to a 13 week average decrease in new individuals continuing to claim Reemployment Assistance benefits in Florida, **Extended Benefits will end on November 7**. This means that only individuals who have exhausted their Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation benefits between June 7, 2020, and November 7, 2020, may be eligible for the six weeks of Extended Benefits when the application is available in the CONNECT system.

• Individuals who have exhausted their Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation benefits after November 7, 2020, will not be eligible for Extended Benefits. They will however receive the opportunity to apply for Pandemic Unemployment Assistance. Individuals should review the application for Pandemic Unemployment Assistance and may apply to determine if they are eligible.

• The Department is working diligently to stand up the Extended Benefits program as quickly as possible. The Department anticipates having the Extended Benefits application completed and ready for Floridians in December.

• In the meantime, Floridians who have exhausted their Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation benefits and may be eligible for Extended Benefits will receive the opportunity to apply for Pandemic Unemployment Assistance. Individuals should review the application for Pandemic Unemployment Assistance and may apply to determine if they are eligible.

• Once Extended Benefits is available in the CONNECT system, the Department will do continued outreach to those individuals to ensure they receive benefits from the appropriate program.

PANDEMIC EMERGENCY UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION: (PEUC)

The Federal Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC) program, offered through the federal CARES Act and administered by DEO, provides up to 13 weeks of benefits to a claimant who has exhausted their Reemployment Assistance benefits. Floridians will need to apply for PEUC benefits once the balance of their current claim is exhausted. Floridians who have already exhausted their benefits or have a Reemployment Assistance claim that expired after July 1, 2019, will also be able to apply.

Through PEUC, Floridians may be eligible for up to \$275 in weekly benefits beginning March 29, 2020 through the week ending December 26, 2020. Floridians will also receive an additional \$600, FPUC payments, that ONLY applies to the following weeks of unemployment: Beginning March 29, 2020 and ending July 25, 2020.

PANDEMIC UNEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE: (PUA)

The Federal Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) program provides up to 39 weeks of Reemployment Assistance benefits to individuals who are self-employed, independent contractors, certain non-profit employees and gig economy workers, as well as to individuals working part-time, or who otherwise would not qualify for regular state Reemployment Assistance benefits under state or federal law or PEUC. Floridians may be eligible for up to \$275 in weekly benefits beginning February 2, 2020 through the week ending December 26, 2020.

Individuals who have been impacted by COVID-19 and believe they may be eligible for Pandemic Unemployment Assistance, can visit <u>www.FloridaJobs.org</u> and select "File a Claim" to apply and be considered for PUA.

Similar to other types of urgent care, some individuals may choose to use our urgent care as their ongoing provider for medication management and therapy which are both provided on a walk-in (or log-in for telehealth basis).
