WORLD-CLASS RESEARCH

Your postgraduate studies in nursing and midwifery will be supported by internationally-renowned researchers. Our well above world-class research in Nursing and Midwifery' focuses on outcomes relevant to the clinical translation of national health priorities, where we can demonstrate improved health outcomes, consumer satisfaction and economic savings.

We are home to the Rosemary Bryant AO Research Centre, a partnership between the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation's South Australian branch (ANMFSA) and the University of South Australia. The Centre aims to strengthen the role of the nursing and midwifery professions across the health system through the development of a research-driven, evidence-based platform of health care. To achieve this, the Centre is focused on advancing the disciplines of nursing and midwifery, and patient care, in the domains of population and public health, workforce reform, safety and quality, clinical practice, patient outcomes, and integration into education.

We're also home to the Mental Health and Suicide Prevention Research Group, established in partnership with government and non-government agencies. Our mental health researchers are recognised for undertaking research to improve mental health service delivery, inform policy and improve health outcomes. The research outcomes of the Group showcase what can be achieved when consumers, clinicians, policy makers and academic faculty work in partnership. Staff within the Group contribute directly to the teaching of our postgraduate programs, equipping students and health professionals with the skills and knowledge required to effectively help people experiencing mental illness and at risk of suicide.

ALLERGY NURSING

Offered with the Australasian Society of Clinical Immunology and Allergy Incorporated, you will gain an understanding of the role of the allergy nurse, the allergic process and allergic disease, and the varying manifestations in children and adults.

PALLIATIVE CARE NURSING

Designed for registered nurses working in any health care setting who may be involved in the provision of palliative care to adult clients and their families. You will develop advanced theoretical and practical knowledge to provide competent, evidence-informed, holistic palliative care.

NURSING

Build your understanding of leadership, management and health care governance with our Graduate Certificate in Nursing. Designed to further your career as a Registered Nurse, this qualification will equip you with advanced knowledge of the Australian health care system and progress your understanding of the social, political and economic factors that affect nursing and health services. You will also develop sought after skills in policy analysis, and change and resource management.

NURSING (RE-ENTRY)

Re-enter the workforce with our Graduate Certificate in Nursing (Re-Entry), designed for nurses previously registered in Australia who wish to re-enter the workforce. You will learn in our clinician-led, authentic, simulated hospital and health service, and undertake clinical placement, preparing you for a rewarding career in one of the most important sectors of health care.

CARDIOVASCULAR NURSING

Progress your career in the specialty field of cardiovascular nursing with our Graduate Certificate in Nursing (Cardiovascular Nursing). This qualification will develop advanced skills in acute cardiac care, heart failure management and primary and secondary prevention of cardiovascular health. You will need to have current experience with, or access to, clients with cardiovascular health problems.

CRITICAL CARE NURSING

Develop expertise in nursing critically ill patients to further your career in a critical or intensive care unit which you will be employed in during your studies. The Graduate Certificate in Nursing (Critical Care Nursing) will progress your knowledge in the advanced clinical competencies for critical care nursing, including management of clients experiencing acute health crises. You will have the opportunity to learn in our clinician-led, authentic, simulated hospital and health service during an on-campus workshop.

HEALTH AND AGEING

Advance your skills in the expanding aged care sector with our Graduate Certificate in Nursing (Health and Ageing). The needs of Australia's ageing population are at the forefront of the health care agenda, with graduates well placed to secure employment in a variety of aged care settings. This qualification focuses on multidisciplinary and transdisciplinary care, rehabilitative care, communication and counselling, and the support of consumer directed care.

NURSE EDUCATION

Broaden your career prospects and learn to teach others in the field of nursing with our Graduate Certificate in Nursing (Nurse Education). You will gain specialist skills in health professional education, with a focus on the concepts and theories surrounding education and learning approaches, teaching strategies for use in clinical and tertiary settings, and educational assessment.

MENTAL HEALTH NURSING

Specialise in the progressive field of mental health nursing to develop the knowledge and practical skills needed to asses and deliver care to people experiencing mental health problems and mental illness. You will explore the psychosocial and behavioural sciences, the legal and ethical aspects of practice and gain valuable practical experience with an industry placement, preparing you to provide mental health care in a variety of health care settings.



When Beata decided to specialise in mental health, she used the Graduate Diploma in Mental Health Nursing to pursue a career in the field, first gaining employment in a hospital setting, before moving into a care coordinator role with Eastern Community Mental Health.

"The Graduate Diploma has given me the skills to be a proficient mental health practitioner in a range of settings." Beata says.

"I found the group work to be particularly beneficial, as it's important to have the ability to communicate within a multidisciplinary team."

For Beata, the decision to pursue mental health nursing has been immensely satisfying.

"I enjoy talking to people," she says. "I like that in mental health we consider the person as a whole — including their psychological health."

NURSING

Expand your career opportunities and pursue senior leadership and governance roles in clinical practice, policy, research, education or management with the Master of Nursing. Designed to develop your ability to expertly inform and improve health care practice, knowledge and research, you will develop advanced research skills, and become conversant in the global issues, trends and practices that impact the effective delivery of nursing and health services.

NURSING (NURSE PRACTITIONER)

Extend your nursing qualifications to the advanced level required for endorsement as a nurse practitioner with the Master of Nursing (Nurse Practitioner). You will examine the role in the delivery of health care, including the legal, ethical and professional issues relating to autonomous and multi-disciplinary practice. Gain advanced knowledge and skills in health assessment, diagnosis, investigative procedures, and prescribing and evaluating treatments and medications, and also build competencies in designing research relevant to the role, context and client populations.

MIDWIFERY

Gain an advanced qualification in perinatal mental health to advance your career in midwifery practice, policy, leadership, research or education. The Master of Midwifery will give you the knowledge and skills essential to undertake assessment and screening of pregnant women, and identify and refer mental health issues, such as postnatal depression. This qualification will also equip you with the ability to complete independent research, and identify and investigate issues or problems to inform practice and research.

MEANINGFUL PARTNERSHIPS WITH INDUSTRY & EMPLOYERS

We are committed to practical engagement with industry and the professions, partnering regularly with employers to deliver high quality, relevant postgraduate qualifications for their staff that suit their workplace needs.
