

NUS GEOGRAPHY CHALLENGE 2021 PRELIMINARY ROUND 27 FEBRUARY 2021



Dear Sir / Madam,

Overview

The Preliminary Round encourages secondary school students to understand Geography beyond textbook contents and seeks to inspire further pursuit of geographical interest. The Preliminary Round will comprise 2 components:

- Individual Component (1 hr 45 min)
- Team Component (2 hr 15 min)

This year, due to the circumstances brought about by COVID-19, the Preliminary Round will be held **online**. Participants can access the Preliminary Round materials from their homes, and submissions will be done via the NUS GC website. More details will be provided in the "Event Details" section and in the appended Annex.

Individual Component

The Individual Component for GC 2021 comprises two **open-book** sections:

- Section A: Multiple Choice Questions (40 questions in total)
- Section B: Structured Questions (3 questions in total)

These questions are based on Geography topics, adhering to both the iGeo (International Geography Olympiad) and GCE O Level Geography syllabi while placing particular focus on the United Nations' (UN) Sustainable Development Goals. Please note that questions <u>WILL NOT</u> be solely based on this year's theme of sustainability and will come from a variety of geographical spheres. Except for the GC Organizing Committee, teams are <u>strictly prohibited</u> from communicating with anyone else during the Individual Component, including their fellow team members. This is to ensure the integrity of the results we derive from this Component, which will be used for individual awards later.

Team Component

A four-part, open-ended Application Question must be tackled by each school team. The Application Question will be centred on the synthesis of physical and human geographical concepts and will draw links to the sustainability theme of the competition. Team members will need to work closely if they are to do well in this component. Each team should ideally have a team leader, as that member will be tasked with submitting the group's Team Component response to the website.

This year's Team Component is different from past iterations. As students are permitted to access online resources for this year's Preliminary Round, we have decided to increase the Team Component's difficulty to allow for a richer engagement with the theme at hand. This difficulty increase is reflected in the increase in the time given to **2 hours 15 minutes**, which is substantially longer than past Team Components.

In light of the major structural changes to the Team Component, we would like to establish some dos and don'ts for participating teams.

- **Do** plan your time over the course of the Team Component. As long as there is no communication with non-participants, you are permitted to take breaks or have some food.
 - Note that the time is yours to manage; there will be no extensions granted for any breaks you choose to take.
- Do appoint a team leader. For the Team Component, each team is to submit their response only
 once to prevent duplicates. Hence, it would be good to have a representative submit the team's
 response to the GC Website alone.
 - Note that if we receive duplicate responses from the same team, we will consider the most recently sent version as the final version.
- Do use online resources to the fullest. Certain sections of the Team Component call for greater depth in explanation, which may be derived from research online. Similarly, no extra time will be allotted for research, and make sure to consider the credibility of the source before implementing it into your response. On a related note...
- Don't plagiarize from your research sources. If you wish to quote someone's statement in full,
 make sure to cite your sources appropriately and append a reference list to the back of your
 response. Plagiarism will not be tolerated and will result in immediate disqualification.

Don't communicate with non-participants during the Component. Communication of any kind,
be it in person or online, can only be conducted amongst team members. Failure to adhere to
this rule will also result in immediate disqualification. The rule does not apply in emergency
situations, or if the team wishes to clarify something with the GC Organizing Committee.

On Plagiarism and Unauthorized Communication

We would like to reiterate that GC2021 is committed to ensuring a fair competition for all. To that end, plagiarism or any other form of cheating found will result in immediate disqualification.

Results

The breakdown of scores for the Preliminary Round is as follows:

- Individual Component 40% of total Preliminary Round score
- Team Component –60% of total Preliminary Round score

The Top **25** schools will qualify for the Semi-Finals (i.e. Creative Component and Geo-Trail) based on the total scores calculated from both components of the Preliminary Round. We expect that Preliminary Round results will be released by **1st March 2021**, **12.00 pm**. Please refer to the NUS GC website for updates on release of results.

*Note: Schools that do not qualify as the Top 25 semi-finalists will have an opportunity to enter the Semi-Finals via the Creative Component. The Top 5 schools from the Creative Component will join the top 25 schools as semi-finalists, therefore bringing the total number of semi-finalists to 30 schools.

Prize Categories

^{*} Top performing and eligible students will be shortlisted from the Individual Component and invited to join the Ministry of Education's Geography Talent Development Programme (TDP) the following year. The TDP is an enrichment programme that seeks to nurture students' passion for Geography and enhance their knowledge in the subject. Students in TDP can expect to be exposed to seminars with university lecturers and workshops to deepen skills and knowledge. Students in the Geography TDP may be selected to represent Singapore in the iGeo (International Geography Olympiad).

- A program that can facilitate some form of design, as needed by the team in the Team Component (e.g. Adobe Photoshop, Paint, Canva, Microsoft Powerpoint)
- Communication devices, as necessary, for communication with the NUS GC Organizing
 Committee and team members (for Team Component) (e.g. mobile phones)
- (Optional) Individual Telegram account to allow for quick communication with NUS GC

 entertained.




Submission of Responses

Step 2: Submit your script on the same Preliminary Round live page, clicking on the correct button as shown below. (This is done to prevent overloading on our end.) The buttons will only activate half an hour before the Component end time as a security measure.




