58) Steve has three piles of sand and Mike has four piles of sand. All together, how many do they have? Answer: When they put them all together, there will be one pile.
59) In which sport are the shoes made entirely of metal? Answer: Horse racing.
60) If the Vice-President of the United States should die, who would be President? Answer: The President.
61) How can you throw a golf ball with all your might and -- without hitting a wall or any other obstruction -- have the ball stop and come right back to you? Answer: Throw the ball straight up.
62) Which is the only state in the USA to touch two oceans? Answer: Alaska. The Arctic Ocean covers the Earth's polar region, and the Pacific Ocean laps the balmy southern coasts of the largest U.S. state
63) What are the official languages of Canada? Answer: English and French.
64) Where and what is the tallest mountain in the world? Answer: Mt. Everest, which is $29,035 \mathrm{ft}(8850 \mathrm{~m}$ ) high and borders Nepal and Tibet.
65) Where and what is the lowest surface point in the world? Answer: Dead Sea, Israel -409 meters (below sea level)
66) What is the largest country in the world? Answer: Russia, which is $17,075,400$ sq. km.

## Open Air Without Money

1) Preach against the sin that is prevalent in the area you are preaching.
