OBJECTIVES:

- To provide an anthology of praise and worship from the Old Testament to the New Testament
- To emphasize the dynamics of the “Latter Rain” on the New Testament Church
- To introduce the pioneers of Davidic Praise and Worship

- To foster a love of being in the Presence of the Most High God

Curriculum Description

Our curriculum is Christo-centered and focuses on the theology of Davidic Praise and Worship; the extravagant, expressive worship that occurred during the days of David. This type of worship includes singing, playing musical instruments, dancing, clapping, the lifting of hands, bowing, kneeling, lying prostrate, and other forms of praise and worship which pays homage and reverence unto our Almighty God and the Lord Jesus Christ, our Redeemer!

The syllabus is divided into four sessions consisting of eight weeks. Worship Theology is taught on Mondays, 6:00 – 7:00 p.m. Dance is taught on Tuesdays, 6:00 – 7:00 p.m. The dance class will include foundational, and biblical teaching for dance. In addition, Dance theory, techniques, and body shaping will be taught.

Delivery System of Instruction

Research reveals that theologians utilize technology when they teach the millennial student. Adult learners are similar to children. John Dewey, the renowned educational philosopher, fosters the premise that “students learn by doing”. Therefore, all classes will be presented using virtual and interactive digital platforms. They include Quizlet Flashcards, Google Classroom, Edmodo, Survey Monkey, etc. Virtual field trips will be facilitated to enhance instruction.

List of Textbooks

- First Eight Weeks

1. The Rebirth of Music and Workbook by Lamar Boschman

This book describes the origin, meaning and purpose of worship. The study guide workbook is a companion to The Rebirth of Music and is an extensive study of music in the kingdom of God. Topics include Music and Healing, Music and Angels, Music and Satan, Music and God's Presence, Music in Heaven and Which Music is correct for the Church or Christian worship.

This book has no workbook.
