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Materials You'll Need
Wood 2 by 6 by 8 ft ..... 17
Wood 2 by 4 by 8 ft ..... 2
Wood 5/4 by 6 by 8 ft ..... 4
Rust Resistant Hex Head Bolts ( $5 / 16$ " by 4") ..... 20
Rust Resistant Flat Washers (5/16") ..... 40
Rust Resistant Lock Washers (5/16" ) ..... 20
Rust Resistant Nuts (5/16") ..... 20
Rust Resistant Wood Screws (No. 9 by 2") ..... About 320
Rust Resistant Wood Screws (No. 9 by 2 1/2") ..... About 30

# Octagon Picnic Table <br> Parts Drawings - Top Octagons 

Page 1

All Octagon Segments are made from 5 1/2" Wide by 1 1/2" Thick wood.
The Top Trim segments are also made from 1 1/2" Thick wood.
The finished dimensions of the Top Trim segments are $235 / 8$ " long, 1 " wide, and 1 1/2" high.

All angles for the Octagon Segments and Trim Segments are 67.5 degrees. (You'll need to set your saw or miter gusage at 22.5 degrees.)

You'll need eight each of the parts on this page.


# Octagon Picnic Table 

Parts Drawings - Top Gussets
Page 2

All Gussets are made from 1 1/2" Thick wood.

You'll need:
Four 23 1/8" Wide Gussets
Four 27 1/4" Narrow Gussets

Note: To get the 67.5 degree angle, you'll probably need to set your miter guage to 22.5 degrees.


# Octagon Picnic Table 

Parts Drawing - Legs
Page 3

Legs are made from 1 1/2" Thick wood.

First cut four Legs 30 " long by $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide with 70 degree angles on each end as shown below.

You'll need to set your miter guage to 20 degrees to get the 70 degree angles.


## Outer Seat Board

Next, cut off two corners from each Leg as shown below.


The finished legs should look like this.

You'll need:
Four 41" Connector Rails
Two 85 1/2" Connector Rail
Two Connector Rail Gussets
Eight Rail-Seat Gussets

Connector Rails are made from 1 " thick wood.

Connector Rail Gussets and Rail-Seat Gussets are made from 1 1/2" thick wood.

Page 5

All Seat parts are made from 1 1/2" Thick wood. You may need to set your miter guage or saw to 22.5 degrees for the $671 / 2$ degree cuts.

You'll need:
Eight Outer Seat Boards Eight Inner Seat Boards Eight Seat Posts
Eight End Seat Gussets Eight Corner Seat Gussets
Four Middle Seat Gussets
Four Seat Bases
Eight Base Extensions


Cut Bevel 22 1/2 degree bevel along the edges of the Seat Posts .

Hole Layout - Pocket Holes
Page 6

Set your pocket hole jig for 1 1/2" thick material.
Drill the pocket holes in each of the four largest Top octagon Segments as shown in the drawings below.


Drill the pocket holes in each of the smallest Top Octagon Segments and the seat parts in the drawings below.

There are four Left Base Extensions and four Right Base Extensions. The drawings below indicate the pocket hole positions for each.

## Drill eightteen $3 / 16$ holes through each Wide Gusset

 as shown in the drawing below.

Drill twenty $3 / 16$ holes through each Narrow Gusset as shown in the drawing below.


Drill two $5 / 16$ holes through the side of each
Narrow Gusset as shown in the drawing below.


# Octagon Picnic Table <br> Hole Layout - Small Gussets <br> Page 8 

## Connector Rail Gussets

Drill two $5 / 16$ " holes through the 2" wide surface of each Connector Gusset as shown in the left drawing below.


Drill two $3 / 16$ " holes through the $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ wide surface of each Connector Gusset as shown in the right drawing below.


## Middle Seat Gussets

Drill eight $3 / 16$ holes through each Seat Gusset as shown in the drawings below.

To ensure the screws don't cause the wood to split, orient the wood grain as shown below.


End Seat Gussets

Drill four 3/16 holes through each End Seat and Rail-Seat Gusset. Holes are centered side to side.

Hole Layout - Legs, Connector Rails, \& Seat Bases
Page 9

Drill two 5/16" holes $12^{\prime \prime}$ from each end and $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from each edge of the $851 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Connector Rail as shown in the drawing to the right.

Drill four $5 / 16$ " holes through each 41"
Connector Rail as shown in the drawing below.


Drill four $3 / 16^{\prime \prime}$ holes through each 85 1/2" Connector Rail as shown in the drawing to the right. ( A total of four 3/16" holes in each 85 1/2" Rail.) (These holes are for securing the umbrella spacer blocks.)

## Assembly Instructions - Top Octagons

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You need to make five octagons for the top. The steps below show you how to assemble the octagons.


Step 1:
Apply glue to mating surfaces and place two of the same size segments together as shown above. clamp both pieces securely, and secure the joint with 2" pocket hole screws. This creates a one quarter section of an octagon. Create the remaining 3 quarter sections in the same way.


Step 2:
Place two of the same size quarter sections together as shown above. Secure the joint with 2 " pocket hole screws as in Step 1. This creates a one half section of the octagon. Assemble the remaining two quarter sections in the same way.


Step 3:
Place the two half sections together as shown above. Secure the two joints with 2" pocket hole screws as shown above. This completes one of the five octagons.

Assemble the remaining four octagons in the same manner.

## Octagon Picnic Table



Apply glue to mating surfaces and assemble the Top Octagons and Narrow Gussets as shown above. Ensure the octagon segments are equally spaced from each other and the gussets are centered over the octagon joints and also centered side to side. Secure the gussets to the octagons with $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rust resistant screws


Apply glue to mating surfaces and attach the Wide Gussets to the octagons with $21 / \mathbf{2}^{\prime \prime}$ rust resistant screws as shown above. The Wide Gussets should be positioned against the Narrow Gussets where the Narrow Gussets come together in the center of the Top.

Attach the legs to the Narrow Gussets with 4" bolts, two flat washers, one lock washer, and nut as shown in the drawings.

Do not completely tighten the nuts until the Picnin Table is completely assembled.

## Assembly Instructions - Connector Rails



Apply glue to mating surfaces and attach a Connector Rail Gusset to each Long Connector Rail with two $21 / 2$ " wood screws as shown in the drawings above and right.

The Connector Rail Gussets must be centered from end to end of the Connector rails.

The connector rails are attached with 4 " by $5 / 16$ " hex head bolts. Use flat washers with both the bolt head and nut. A lock washer goes between the
 nut and flat washer.

Attach the Long Connector Rails to the Legs as indicated by the red arrows below.

Next, attach one end of the Short Connector Rails to the Legs as indicated by the blue arrows below.
Finally, attach the other end of the Short Connector Rails to the gussets as indicated by the green arrows below.


Attach the Rail-Seat Gussets to the Connector Rails with 2" screws through the $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ thickness of the Rail-Seat Gussets as indicated by the orange arrows. The bottom of the Rail-Seat Gussets must be flush with the bottom of the Connector rails.

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Don't use glue on the Top Trim Pieces as you may need to remove the Legs at some time in the future.


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## Octagon Picnic Table

Assembly Instructions - Seats A

Apply glue to mating surfaces and attach the seat boards with 2 " screws through the pocket holes as shown below.


Position the seat boards so there is a $3 / 8$ " gap between them. Apply glue to mating surfaces and attach the end and center seat gussets with $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ screws as shown below.


Assemble the Seat Bases and Base Extensions with pocket hole screws as shown below.


# Octagon Picnic Table Assembly Instructions - Seats B 

Page 19
Position the Seat Posts as shown below. The edge of the post should be 2" from the end of the gusset as shown in the close up view. Attach the Seat Posts to the assembled seat boards with pocket hole screws as indicated by the red arrows below. Choose screws of a length that will not protude past the seat surface on the opposite side.

Next, determine the location for the screw holes and drill two $3 / 16$ " holes through the Base Extensions as as indicated by the blue arrows. The screw holes should be centered over the ends of the posts. Attach the assembled Seat Bases to the bottom ends of the Seat Posts with 3" screws.


Attach the Corner Gussets to the assembled seat boards and and Seat Posts with 2" screws as shown below. The edge of the gusset should be close to the gap between the seat boards but not covering it as shown in the close up view.


# Octagon Picnic Table Assembly Instructions - Attach Seats 

Page 20

Position the assembled seat so the Seat Base is centered over the Leg as indicated by the red arrow and the Middle Seat Gusset sits inside the opening between the Connector Rails as indicated by the blue arrow in the drawing below.


Secure the Seats to the Rail-Seat Gussets with 3 " screws as indicated by the blue arrows in the drawing above and in the close up to the right.

Ensure that the screws do not protrude past the surface of the seats.
