The people of Ireland and Scotland began making their own versions of Jack's lantern in order to frighten Stingy Jack away.
- Turnips, potatoes and beets were originally used to make Jack O'Lanterns. It wasn't until Irish, English, and Scottish immigrants moved to the Americas that pumpkins were used.
- On October 9, 2016, Mathis Willemijns set a world record at the Giant Pumpkin European Championship with a pumpkin that weighed 2,524.6 pounds.






