Dyno Day at Brett's Automotive

Thankyou, to the SCCA and it's members for a good turnout, I hope all the turned up had an enjoyable day. The day started out with a Dyno demonstration on my 4AGE power clubman. The demonstration involved changing the length of the intake system and the affect it has on the torque curve of the engine. (dyno sheets)

Next we moved on to Greg Holden's Midget Ute, we started out by going through the process of the basics of tuning the engine. A compression test was performed before adjusting the valve clearances, at this point we also checked and corrected the TDC mark. The distributor was removed, and the advance curve was inspected and lubricated, the points and condenser were replaced and the points air gap was adjusted. Ignition leads were inspected and tested for continuity. Next was the twin SUs, they were dismantled and inspected, float levels were checked and fuel bowls cleaned, needle pistons and housings were cleaned, and needle heights checked.

At this point it was noted that the main jet seats were adjusted down a long way (rich) before being reset. SUs were reassembled and damper fluid added before finally checking the petrol flow rate and pressure. The car fired up and ran smoothly after a bit of a fiddle with the mixtures, the ignition timing was checked and adjusted. Then using a Uni -Syn carburettor balancer, the SUs were adjusted and balanced at idle and part throttle.

After a general check over of the car and

drivetrain the car was driven on to the dyno. We did not get far with the dyno testing on the day. The car put off a lot of R.F interference that played havoc with the dyno sensors and control unit, I later tracked this down to some bad electrical connections including the alternator power connector and earths. It also had some very lean mid range fuel mixtures, and the limited selection of needle we had on the day didn't supply enough fuel.

This is where the day ended, I hope that all that came learnt something, or were at least entertained for a few hours. Later in the week and after a better inspection of the main iets, it was found that the supply lines were very restricted (pull back the protective springs. Picture) Although not restricted enough to cause our lean mixtures, they were replaced with new items. A selection of different size needles were sourced and tested, before settling on a LS1 size needle. Some testing of the ignition was preformed and the ignition timing optimised. During this latter testing we had a range of intermittent and time consuming faults, including the fuel pump, a bad earth between the points base plate and distributor housing as well as the before mentioned poor alternator power connector. But in the end we got it all sorted, and runs well with a whooping 45HP @ 4622rpm.





Continuations re Brett's Auto Tuning – Technical Inspection Day

Held at Brett's super clean workshop at Sefton on 29 July 2017 and was attended by some 2 dozen interested club members including James Elphick (driver of the beaut Gazelle Ford 10 OIV at historic meetings throughout the eastern states) and Joe Armour (owner of the red/white 1960s works Le Mans Sprite coupe). Thanks must go to the enthusiastic Paul Barbara for organising this event for the club and to our president for offering the yellow 1275cc ute, "Arthur", as a guinea pig for the second dyno run.

The first exhibition was of Brett's MNR English built 'Vortex' clubman in Gulf racing colours and a consistent (make that very quick) performer in our super sprints. It has a fuel injected 20 valve Toyota Corolla engine which Brett said was getting a bit tired and is waiting for an S2000 Honda engine with 6 speed sequential gear box as a logical (?) replacement for forthcoming competition events.

Anyway, the chassis dyno and Vortex drive train performed beautifully for the maestro's car. Dyno sheets are attached to this report and effectively show the horsepower and torque differences under different intake arrangements. It started off with the airbox and the fuel injection ram tubes being removed; next, the engine ran with short ram tubes; next, they were replaced with the long ram tubes; and then it ran with the replaced airbox and contain-

ing the long ram tubes. For the record, the Toyota engine gave the impressive figures of 168 bhp at 8000 rpm and big mid- range torque of 217 ft.lb at 5800rpm.

Greg, the president, wrote an article published in the Sprite Torque of September 2017 that generally covered the work that Brett carried out prior to the dyno run. Unfortunately on the day for "Arthur" the dyno would not read horsepower or torque. Eventually Brett changed enough engine bits on the 1275cc Marina motor with 2 x

 $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " SU carbs to record 45.1 bhp at 4,622 rpm and 96 ft.lb. of torque at 3,187 rpm. The air / fuel ratio came out at 12.9 in the rev range from a bit over 2000rpm all the way to maximum revs.

Brett produced a ¾ page report on the experiences with the engine of "Arthur" which is self- explanatory, very descriptive and useful for anyone starting out with a n unknown Sprite / Midget, whether you intend to have it chassis dynoed or not. The whole exercise was an eye opener to me and as such learned more about the mechanical vagaries of sports car and competition engines. Further to that, Brett impressed me with his demeanour in checking out all the variables that exist for our fun and trials.

Electronic Regulator in a Bugeye

A couple of months ago in Sprite Torque, a reader asked if anyone had ever replaced their voltage regulator with a solid state regulator. Well, I have so here is the story.

When I built my bugeye, I decided it had to have an alternator partly because I had one and I didn't have the original generator and partly because alternators are just all round better devices. That's why all modern cars have an alternator and not a generator.

The problem is, alternators are not original for bugeyes and that started to bother me. So, slowly I collected all the parts needed and after a few years had all the parts I needed to convert the car back to the original generator. That was a larger job than it sounds because the generator I bought needed a major overhaul. I also had to source the mechanical tacho and the reduction drive.

When it came to the regulator - actually, let's call it the "control box" because it does more than just regulate – I had three old and well used ones. I only had one control box that was correct for the bugeye – the one with screw terminals and as fate would have it, it wasn't working correctly. I tested it and it just didn't get the voltage up to where it should have been. So, what to do...

I did the usual internet searches, the results of which cast enough doubt on the quality of the available "made who knows where" aftermarket replacements to convince me I didn't want one of those. So I was left with repairing an original Lucas one or doing something different.

At this point I must say that I have no doubt the original ones can be repaired and probably will carry on working just fine but I had grown to like the idea of a modern electronic unit. To my mind, there are very good reasons why modern cars use electronics for these devices and have done for many years and that is simply because electronics beats mechanical in this case.

A few more searches and I found "Dynamo Regulators" (http://dynamoregulators.com/), a small company in the UK, specialising in replacement electronic regulators for original Lucas generators (or dynamos). Bingo! Just what I needed. I finally decided on a DVR3 model, negative earth (my car has been converted) and current limited to 16Amps. The unit was easy to order and duly turned up in the post a couple of weeks later, with instructions.

Mounting it was not hard. The instructions say that the units don't make a lot of heat but they still talk about a heat sink, so I made a simple heat sink out of some aluminium sheet and then cut the old internals out of my Lucas control box. I drilled two mounting screw holes and routered out a slot for the wires to pass down. Then I needed to solder the wires onto the back of the original screw terminals, assemble it all (double checking the connections) and it was job done.

It's always a bit worrying when you come to test electrical work in case something goes POOF! but when I connected the battery and started the car, it fired up like nothing had happened. As soon as the engine started, the ignition light went out and it was all fine. No problems at all.

Only yesterday I drove the car to the Hunter for brunch, a round trip of 250 km and the first real test of the generator conversion. Everything went really well. The ignition light didn't come on, we didn't run out of electricity and even the mechanical tacho worked beautifully! So, I'm very pleased to have done it and like looking under the bonnet to see the original generator there in place of the previous alternator. You don't even know that the control box is not quite 'right' because it looks exactly the same from the outside.

Electronic Regulator in a Bugeye

In his answer to that question in Sprite Torque, Colin asked: "What advantage would you expect to gain from a solid state regulator?" It's a good question and I can't satisfactorily answer it. Converting to an electronic control box is not cheaper and offers just two small benefits:

The control box will never need to be calibrat ed or adjusted. Actually, it's not possible to adjust it.

The ignition light does not come on when the engine is running – well not that I have noticed so far. I haven't run it on a rainy night in traffic, so possibly it would struggle then but so far when the engine is running the light is off. Even idling well under 1000 rpm, the

light stays off and from my distant memory of the original regulators, they couldn't claim that.

They are not large advantages and as I said, it was just an interesting exercise for me.

The obvious disadvantage is that if it fails, it can't be fixed and will need to be replaced.

So, it IS possible to run an original C39 generator, with the mechanical tacho and an electronic control box and so far, so good. Feel free to have a look or ask me about it if you would like to know more.

The event is about to commence finally with cars heading on to the circuit and it's only 9.30am.

Out there in the fresh air and predicted 30c heat we had just enough flaggies led by Tom Devitt. Jacqui Millhouse after helping with the lunches spent the day on a flag point.

Thank you to Tom Devitt, Jacqui Millhouse, Ann Smith, Steve Dive, Rod Pringle, Graham Wells, Dave Lawrence, Blake Hotz, Andrew Herden, Lukas Kairaitis, Paul Unicomb, Ray Fahey, Rob Howes and Ric Forster who spent the day with no relief trackside.

Please **contact Rob** to book & pay for your swap meet space as there are only a limited number of 30 spaces available.



One thing I have to note is the fact that we has a change of officials at the very last minute due to Leah our Clerk of Course being sick with the Flu & one of our Stewards, Greg Ryan recovering from an operation. Fortunately I had arranged for John Finch of MGCC Newcastle to stand in as a Steward & he was able to step up to Clerk of Course on the day, ably assisted by David Healy as Steward, Ian Jensen as Chief Scrutineer & Tom Devitt as Chief Flag Marshall.

The event ran to time and we got underway at 9:00am with a field of 7 open wheelers & clubmans including our very own Stephen Hooker in the Jedi & Brett Lansley in his MNR Vortex. Clearly Brett's Clubman enjoyed playing with the open wheelers, so much so that it shed one of its front fenders while out on the circuit, all part of a weight loss program no doubt. The first run of the day is very much a shake down with people re familiarising themselves with the twisty Amaroo circuit, whose 1.8km length, suits our small cars so well.

Next up was a field of Lotuses (Loti?) who I had deliberately grouped together as this is a circuit where it is best to match similar cars together and then grid them fast to slow. Then followed a groups of small fast cars, including SCCA Member Tammielee Hotz in her Black MX5 setting a blistering pace. The next couple of groups had bigger heavier cars in them including a brand new black Nissan GTR R35 with only 300km on the clock. Then it was back to smaller cars & the MX5's of Craig Barney & Andrew McLaughlin battling it out at the front of the grid with late but very welcome entry David Hunt filling a slot near the middle of the group. Further back in the same group we saw the beautiful Sebring Sprite replica of Peter Smith ever so gracefully bringing up the rear of the group.

The next group saw SCCA member Lukas Kairaitis circulating quickly in his Silver Porsche 911, having snubbed the Porsche club event being run on the North circuit on the same day, well that's what I like to think anyway.

Next up was a group of 12 Sprites & Midgets – I wonder who organised that ?? All variants were in this group ranging from Colin Dodds in Verona the black & gold race car, Bob Rowntree in his race bugeye, Denis – sideways is Best in his Lenham Lemans, Ashley Smith in the Sebring Sprite – driv-Hunt in the yellow Honda powered Sprite & everything in between. Not only did this make for great fun on the track, it was also a great spectacle for the spectators & a number of people commented to me after the event how good it was to see so many Sprites together going hard. Denis – sideways is Best, managed a couple of half spins, my brakes weren't working very well as I was locking the fronts but not slowing down, Warren Lawlor was a bit smokey and Bob Rowntree had no clutch, so we were having a few teething issues.

In the following rounds, the excellent dummy grid work by Bruce Pearce & Greg Prunster, saw cars shuffled to their optimum position to ensure a clear fast run. By now I had turned into full competitor mode and the worries of event organiser were well behind me. A quick correction of wayward tyre pressures and remembering to move my foot well to the left when braking to ensure I did not press the accelerator as well (was I really doing that earlier!) had me eager to go out for a second run where I passed John Millhouse & chased after Paul Orton who was in turn chasing after Colin Dodds. By the time the third run came around, Colin, Paul and I were circulating in close formation, with our cars all similar in pace but no one quick enough to pull away or for a safe pass to be made. Great fun.

Elsewhere, Brett Lansley had broken his gear linkage in the desperate attempt to do a sub 1 minute run, something that Stephen Hooker had managed comfortably by then. Tammielee Hotz had set a personal best in her turbocharged MX5 which incidentally made her the fastest MX5 on the day. Craig Barney had got the better of Andrew McLaughlin (again) in the battle of the normally aspirated MX5's Andrew complaining (again) of a loose rear end despite near new rubber.

David Hunt was fastest Sprite in the shiny red Mk111, followed by Colin & Ashley.



Positions Vacant

How can you help make the Sprite Car Club valued by its members?

The administration of the Sprite Car Club is maintained by a volunteer committee of members. Committee membership is decided by the members at the Annual General Meeting (AGM). Without a functioning committee the Club cannot operate effectively so it is essential that these positions are filled.

PRESIDENT- Easily the most prominent position, the President chairs Club meetings, co-ordinates the work of the Committee as a whole and acts in a statesman capacity from time to time.

VICE PRESIDENT- May be called upon to chair the meetings should the President not be available.

TREASURER - Looks after the Club's finances and ensures that any Club expenditure does not exceed its income.

SECRETARY- Performs the majority of the Club's administrative work, taking care of incoming and outgoing correspondence, preparing minutes of our club meetings etc.., The Secretary usually acts as the Public Officer.

MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY - Maintains records of our Club's members and membership. As this position is usually the first point of contact for new members, you get to meet and speak to a lot of interesting people.

SOCIAL SECRETARY - Co-ordinates the club's social events. The Social Secretary often relies on members to suggest suitable outings and assist with their organisation.

MAGAZINE EDITOR – A very important position. The Editor/s produces the Club magazine 11 times a year. This is the committee's main means of contact with the members.

LIBRARIAN (appointed by committee)-Maintains the club's collection of books and magazines which contain vast amounts of fascinating information. The Librarian also administers a book loan scheme.

REGISTRAR & **CLUB PLATES** (appointed by committee) - Maintains historical records about the Club members cars. The Club Registrar also administers Historic Conditional Registration scheme for the Club.

Sprite & Midget Nationals 2018:


The latest Nationals notice was received from Victoria and printed in Sprite Torque.
