WHAT GOD HAS JOINED: SCOTT HAHN REFLECTS ON THE TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In today's Gospel, the Pharisees try to trap Jesus with a trick question.

The "lawfulness" of divorce in Israel was never an issue. Moses had long ago allowed it (see Deuteronomy 24:1-4). But Jesus points His enemies back before Moses, to "the beginning," interpreting the text we hear in today's First Reading.

Divorce violates the order of creation, He says. Moses permitted it only as a concession to the people's "hardness of heart"—their inability to live by God's covenant Law. But Jesus comes to fulfill the Law, to reveal its true meaning and purpose, and to give people the grace to keep God's commands.

Marriage, He reveals, is a sacrament, a divine, life-giving sign. Through the union of husband and wife, God intended to bestow His blessings on the human family—making it fruitful, multiplying it until it filled the earth (see Genesis 1:28).

That's why today's Gospel moves so easily from a debate about marriage to Jesus' blessing of children. Children are blessings the Father bestows on couples who walk in His ways, as we sing in today's Psalm.

Marriage also is a sign of God's new covenant. As today's

Epistle hints, Jesus is the new Adam—made a little lower than the angels, born of a human family (see Romans 5:14; Psalm 8:5-7). The Church is the new Eve, the "woman" born of Christ's pierced side as He hung in the sleep of death on the Cross (see John 19:34; Revelation 12:1-17).

Through the union of Christ and the Church as "one flesh," God's plan for the world is fulfilled (see Ephesians 5:21-32). Eve was "mother of all the living" (see Genesis 3:20). And in Baptism, we are made sons and daughters of the Church, children of the Father, heirs of the eternal glory He intended for the human family in the beginning.

The challenge for us is to live as children of the kingdom, growing up ever more faithful in our love and devotion to the ways of Christ and the teachings of His Church.

LETTER FROM FR. TIM

BLACK HILLS PAHA SAPA CELEBRATION

Dear Parishioners,

Thank you for your commitment and effort over the last year in preparation for the Black Hills Paha Sapa Celebration with William Graham. It was truly an adventure. We didn't know exactly what we were getting ourselves into, but you trusted me as I trusted in the guidance of the Holy Spirit. The adventure took us into new places, encountering new people, and made new demands on our time, our creativity, and our energies. We were invited into many new and challenging circumstances. And, with God's prompting and grace, we went!

So many of our active disciples, at Blessed Sacrament, Cathedral, St Therese, St Rose of Lima and other parishes across the Black Hills, served on the Welcome Team and as Counselors at the Celebration. Many of our parishioners participated in the evening events, the Kidzfest, and Youth Night. I saw Catholics everywhere bearing the joy of the Gospel!

Now — I didn't see the results that I had expected to flow from our magnanimous efforts. Here at Blessed Sacrament we prepared for a hundred converts and "reverts" returning to our parish family. We put the word out over and over again. We recruited, promoted, and we didn't reap the harvest we were hoping for. However, I am convicted that our efforts were not in vain. God has worked His grace in us and throughout our parish community (and in the Catholic community throughout the Black Hills). We have learned, developed, and tested our skills and our desire for evangelization. We have a new mindset for evangelization and we have gained new confidence in our faith and our ability to share our relationship with Jesus Christ.

We have also grown closer in understanding and trust with separated brothers and sisters in Christ, those of other denominations. They know us, we know them, and new relationships of trust have developed. I am confident that our Lord saw this and He planned this from the beginning. He set this foundation for our future efforts and for the continued up-building of His kingdom.

Our work of evangelization has only just begun so

don't be discouraged. Through our participation in the William Graham Celebration, God has done a good work in us and He has used us for His purposes. Going forward, let us continue to promote, encourage, and invite all and everyone to RCIA, already in progress, and Alpha which begins on October 6th.

The Catholic Diocese of Rapid City is firmly committed to creating and maintaining the safest possible environment for our children and young people. The phone has caller ID and messaging features. All information will be treated confidentially. Alleged victims are advised of their right to report alleged abuse to civil authorities. The diocesan sexual misconduct policy and code of conduct are on the diocesan website at rapidcitydiocese.org/safe-environment/policy-documents.

In accordance with diocesan policy, all allegations of sexual misconduct involving children or young people and priests, deacons, lay employees, or volunteers serving the Diocese of Rapid City will be investigated. ST. VINCENT DE PAUL



St. Vincent de Paul (1581–1660) was born in France to a peasant farming family. As a child he grew up herding sheep, and showed such an aptitude for his studies that his father sold the family oxen to fund his seminary education. After his ordination in 1600, St. Vincent worked

in Toulouse as a tutor to pay for his doctorate. In 1605, while traveling by sea, he was captured by Turkish pirates. He was taken to Tunis in Africa and sold into slavery four times before escaping in 1607 along with his master, whom he had converted to the faith. St. Vincent then continued his studies in Rome, and afterwards returned to France. He served as a parish priest and ministered to the nobility; however, two life-changing encounters with destitute people inspired him to begin work among the poor and marginalized. He gathered the wealthy women of his parish to collect funds for missionary projects. From this group came the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul. He also founded an Order of priests, the Vincentians, who, during a time of general laxity and ignorance among the clergy, devoted themselves to the Evangelical Councils while serving in small towns and villages. He committed himself to the education of priests and conducted many retreats for their spiritual formation. He also ministered to convicts suffering deplorable conditions in prison and won many to the faith in addition to building them a hospital. St. Vincent renewed the faith of France during a time of spiritual crisis. For this he was named the patron of charitable works. He is also the patron of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, an organization dedicated to the service of the poor, now working in 132 countries. His feast day is September 27th.

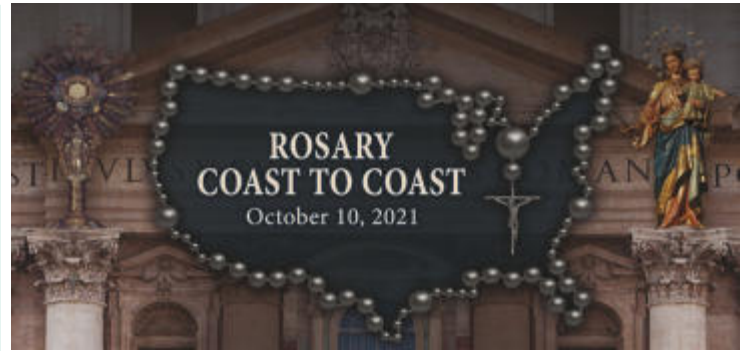

U. S. HOUSE VOTES TO IMPOSE RADICAL “ABORTION ON DEMAND UNTIL BIRTH”

On September 24, the House of Representatives voted to pass the Women’s Health Protection Act, H.R. 3755. This bill would impose abortion on demand nationwide at any stage of pregnancy through federal statute and would eliminate pro-life laws at every level of government - including parental notification for minor girls, informed consent, and health or safety protections specific to abortion facilities. H.R. 3755 also would compel all Americans to support abortions here and abroad with their tax dollars and would also likely force health care providers and professionals to perform, assist in, and/or refer for abortion against their deeply-held beliefs, as well as force employers and insurers to cover or pay for abortion.

Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of Kansas City in Kansas, chairman of the U.S.C.C.B. Committee on Pro-Life Activities issued the following statement:

“This deceptively-named bill is the most extreme pro-abortion bill our nation has ever seen. H.R. 3755 is not about the health of women, but only about eliminating any and all protections for unborn children - including baby girls. It would lead to the deliberate destruction of millions of unborn lives, leaving countless women with physical, emotional, and spiritual scars.

“This bill assumes that abortion can be the only, or best, solution to a crisis pregnancy. H.R. 3755 is built on a false and despairing narrative that utterly fails women. In treating abortion as the moral equivalent to the removal of an appendix, this proposal is radically out of step with the American public. As a nation built on the recognition that every human being is endowed by its Creator with the unalienable rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, this bill is a complete injustice. 

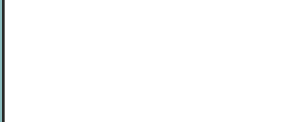
