

From Our Pastor, Fr. Fausto ...

My dear friends, how stressful is this time of pandemic for all of us. For some, like me for example, with a long list of breathing problems (like ones with COPD), the mask can be suffocating or it may make breathing laborious and bothersome.

And I, who must stand 6' away, miss hugging, smiling and high fiving the kids! Let's carry our crosses then for the sake of our neighbors' health. According to medical professionals, the common masks, not the professional and medical ones, are not truly capable to protect us from viruses, but only block many viruses from infecting others. It is an act of charity towards our neighbors. If all wear masks, conceivably there should be less infections.

One more challenge of this COVID plague has been our inability to communicate the importance of the Catholic Faith Appeal as we have done in previous years. Our parish has achieved only 52% of our goal and we have just three months remaining to collect an additional \$181,900. I humbly ask you, if you can afford it, to support the Catholic Faith Appeal. Please write CFA on the memo line or your check and place it in the collection basket at mass or mail it to the parish office.

As a closing to this pandemic note, I love to let you meditate on these words of St. Paul (Eph. 4:29-31):

"No foul language should come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for needed edification, that it may impart grace to thous who hear. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were sealed for the day of redemption. All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice. Be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ."

Congratulations, my dear parishioners, the great family of St. Martha Parish is 93 years old! Let us all praise and thank God the Almighty for having nurtured the little budding parish, and prospered its growth to our great parish of today, more than 1,800 registered families strong! Let us also ask St. Martha to join hers to our prayers, so that God will bless us all and our families, continuing our loving witnessing to Jesus here on earth before joining Him for all eternity in the glory of Paradise.

Let us offer our Masses, Communions, Rosaries and other devotions for two purposes - first in thanksgiving for all God's protection these past 93 years and, secondly, for the greatest gift of all: the gift of charity among us for the poor and needy.

October is Respect Life month. The last century was the bloodiest century ever when we count wars, exterminations of civilian people, rampant murders and, above all, abortion. We are horrified, and rightly so, at the millions killed in the Nazi concentration camps or in the killing fields of Cambodia. But do we realize that since 1973 we have killed, in our good ole' U.S.A., over 54 million babies? Let us meditate on the Gospel and on those murderous tenant farmers: "let us kill..." and make a solemn pledge to God that we will be the defenders of life, the greatest gift given to us by God.

We will then defend the defenseless babies, the mentally ill, the poor and the handicapped, the sick and feeble, the elderly, the famished, persecuted and oppressed sisters and brothers, because we are all children of God, Father of all! Otherwise, dulled by a false sense of security because of our national wealth, we will be facing God who will bring us to a bad end!

This Sunday, October 4, has been designated as Respect Life Sunday. The Catholic Church remains at the forefront in speaking out on the issue of the sanctity of life, from conception to natural death, regardless of age or condition.

This year's theme, 'Live the Gospel of Life,' was inspired by the commemoration of the 25th anniversary of Pope John Paul II's encyclical, The Gospel of Life. Pope John Paul's masterfully articulated defense of the right to life for children in their mothers' wombs, the elderly, persons with disabilities, and the marginalized is more relevant today than ever before.

Using a document of our late Holy Father, Saint John Paul II, I would like to say a special word to women who have had an abortion. "The Church is aware of the many factors which may have influenced your decision, and She does not doubt that in many cases it was a painful and even a shattering decision. The wound in your heart may not yet have healed. Certainly what happened was - and remains terribly wrong. But do not give in to discouragement, and do not lose hope. Try rather to understand what happened and face it honestly. If you have not already done so, give yourselves over with humility and trust to repentance. The Father of mercies is ready to give you his forgiveness and his peace in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

You will come to understand that nothing is definitively lost, and you will also be able to ask forgiveness from your child, who is now living in the Lord. With the friendly and expert help and advice of other people, and as a result of your own painful experience, you can be among the most eloquent defenders of everyone's right to life. Through your commitment to life, whether by accepting the birth of other children, or by welcoming and caring for those most in need of someone to be close to them, you will become promoters of a new way of looking at human life." (The Gospel of Life, 99)

Today's Gospel continues last Sunday's theme of the rejection of Jesus by the ruling class of Israel; the Sadducees, the Sicarii, the Herodians and a group of Scribes. How unreal is the vineyard workers' dream to own the vineyard after killing the owner's son. The father is still alive and he will exact swift vengeance. How tragic is this prophetic parable when we know that 40 years after this parable the entire ruling class of Israel was destroyed by the Pagan Romans, carrying to death and slavery the entire Jewish populace. Few Jews escaped this tragedy, among whom were all the "Jews of the Way." The followers of Jesus who left Israel at the beginning of the Jewish revolt against Rome, prompted by an incipient persecution by the Sicarii. We can understand this Gospel then in the light of the history of Israel's lack of faith in God's old covenant, culminating with the lack of faith in Jesus' messianic figure. We can also apply this parable to us, Israel's successors, who have to keep our faith shining until the second coming of Jesus, reminding ourselves of His exhortation: "Be on guard, then, because you know not the time" of His final judgment.

October is also the Month of the Rosary, the loving chain of angelic salutations which binds us to Jesus' life and to His and our Blessed Mother. Through Our Lady's


Rosary, our St. Martha Rosary Makers has just recently sent 1,338 to mission priests all over the world!

October 7 is the Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary, established by Pope St. Paul V after the victory of the combined Christian fleet on October 7, 1591 over the Muslim Turkish fleet at Lepanto. A great memorial chapel was built in the Basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore in Rome, with artistic basreliefs celebrating such victory, which stopped Muslims naval expansion as the victory in Vienna by the Christian Army stopped the land conquest of Europe the following century.
