
Tom, K9BTQ

John "Jackie" Jurek, KC9MJO, passed away peacefully on Sunday, September 25, 2011 at his home in Naples, Florida. A Milwaukee Memorial Service was held on October 8. Jackie joined our club as a brand new General Class ham in February 2008. He had been interested in ham radio for years but never got a license until he retired. To get started, he bought a Heathkit SB303 HF receiver and an SB-401 transmitter on Ebay. He soon found that the older gear left something to be desired so he invested in an Icom 706. With help from John, K9IAC and other club members, he put up several wire antennas and became active on the Milwaukee-Florida Net. He soon found that there were too many guys named John on that net, so he dusted off his old childhood nickname of "Jackie". He was also a member of MRAC and was active on 2-meters.

Jackie participated on Field Day with our club and his camper was used for the 75/20-meter station in 2008 and 2009. He was no stranger to electronics. He received a BSEE in 1968 from MSOE and did analog and digital design during his career. Also, in earlier days he built Heathkit and Knight audio and test equipment, and designed some HiFi amplifiers from old TV tubes.

Jackie and his wife Andrea bought a place in Naples, Florida and had plans to move there permanently. They also had a boat named Andrea Lauren.

Our sympathy goes to his wife Andrea, his daughter Sarah and son Jonathan. Jackie was 65. 5
