 Trade apprentices to get minimum monthly stipend based on qualification ranging from Rs 5000 to 9000

During the State Ministers' Conference on Skill Development in New Delhi, the Minister of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) Mahendra Nath Pandey announced the Govt's notification that minimum stipend payable to **trade apprentices** according to the Apprenticeship (Amendment) Rules, 2019 will be ranging from **Rs 5000-9000** per month based on qualification.

• Ten-day Mysuru Dasara festival inaugurated in Karnataka

Kannada novelist Dr. S L Bhyrappa inaugurated the ten-day **MysuruDasara** festival in presence of Karnataka Chief Minister B S Yediyurappa and other dignitaries. This festival will comprise of cultural programmes, sports events inaugurated by Indian Badminton player PV Sindhu, wrestling competitions and would culminate(conclude) with a grand elephant procession on Vijayadashmi.

• A 2-day national workshop 'Arogya Manthan' held in New Delhi

Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare **Dr Harsh Vardhan** inaugurated a 2-day national workshop 'Arogya Manthan' in New Delhi which was held on September 30-October 1, 2019. It was organised by the National Health Authority (NHA) to mark the first anniversary of Ayushman Bharat- Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY), which was launched on September 23, 2018 at Ranchi, Jharkhand by the Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

• India achieves one-crore LED street light mark installed under the Street Light National Programme

India has achieved **one-crore LED** (Light Emitting Diode) street light mark with the 1 croreth LED street light switched on by Union Power Minister **Raj Kumar Singh** by a

remote switch. The lightings are installed under Street Light National Programme (SLNP) implemented by state-owned Energy Efficiency Services Ltd (EESL) and are to achieve 1.34 crore LED street lights installation by March 2020. Earlier the target was set for March 2019.

• 3 railway stations in Rajasthan emerged as top clean stations: Railway cleanliness survey 2019

Three railway stations of Rajasthan, **Jaipur**, **Jodhpur**, and **Durgapura** have topped the **Railway Cleanliness Survey 2019**, conducted at 720 railway stations by the Ministry of Railways.

• Rajasthan becomes the third state to ban certain categories of pan masala

Rajasthan became the third state in India to ban certain categories of pan masala containing magnesium carbonate, nicotine, tobacco, mineral oil and flavoured 'supari' under the **Food Safety Act** after **Maharashtra** and **Bihar**. Even the production, storage, distribution and sale of these products is banned.

• President of India, Shri Ram NathKovind presented 2019 Swachchta Ambassador award to Sachin Tendulkar in New Delhi at the 5th India Today Safaigiri Summit

on the occasion of 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, the president of India Shri Ram Nath Kovind presented 2019 **Swachchta Ambassador** award to former Indian cricketer Shri **Sachin Tendulkar** during the 5th edition of India Today Safaigiri Summit held in New Delhi.

• In a first of its kind, IRCTC will pay compensation to passengers on delay

For the 1st time in India, Indian Railway Catering and Tourism Corporation (IRCTC) will compensate for passengers of the Tejas Express (India's first private train running on the Lucknow-New Delhi route) if the train is late.

Keypoints:

- i. Compensation: If Tejas Express runs one hour later than its scheduled time, passengers will be paid Rs 100 and if this train was delayed more than two hours, Rs 250 will be given to the passengers.
- **ii. Insurance Cover:** Apart from compensation, an insurance cover of Rs 25 lakh will also be provided free of cost to passengers, including insurance of Rs 1 lakh for theft or robbery during the journey.

TejasExpress:

It is the India's first semi-high speed fully air-conditioned train introduced by Indian Railways. The Express will be flagged off on October 4, 2019 by Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath. This train will run six days a week.



• 4th edition of KAZIND-2019, a joint military exercise between India & Kazakhstan begins at Pithoragarh, Uttarakhand.

It aims to carry out counter- terrorism operations in hilly areas.s

• Telangana Peddapalli district tops in 2019 rural Swachhta survey

Peddapalli district of **Telangana** became first in the **2019 rural Swachhta survey** (sanitation survey) to become the cleanest district in India. The most improved district in the list was Haryana's Faridabad, which moved to second place in 2019 from its previous rank of 71 in 2018. Haryana's Rewari district ranks 3rd in the list.

• Amit Shah flagged off second Vande Bharat Express Train between Delhi and Katra.



• Rajasthan becomes first Indian state to launch policy on Pneumoconiosis

Chief Minister of Rajasthan Mr Ashok Gehlot launched 'Policy on Pneumoconiosis Detection, Prevention, Control and Rehabilitation'. With this, Rajasthan became the first state in India to launch such a policy and in January 2015, it had became the first Indian state to notify Pneumoconiosis as an epidemic. Pneumoconiosis is a disease of the lungs due to inhalation of dust, characterized by inflammation, coughing, and fibrosis.

- NHSRC re-designated as the WHO Collaborating Centre for Priority Medical Devices and Health Technology Policy
- Railways renamed the Lohian Khas-New Delhi Intercity Express as 'Sarbat da Bhala Express'

It was previously called **Lohian Khas-New Delhi Intercity Express or New Delhi-Ludhiana Intercity Express** and was renamed as a tribute to Guru Nanak Dev on the occasion of the 550th birth anniversary celebrations (November 12, 2019).

• Andhra Pradesh Government launches India's first Village secretariat system

Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy of Yuvajana Sramika Rythu Congress Party (YSRCP) launched the first of its kind Village Secretariat system at Karapa village near Kakinada, Andhra Pradesh. It has set up village and ward secretariats which act as a bridge between the government and the people by rendering over 500 types of services at their doorstep.

• NHA and Google partners together to strengthen Ayushman Bharat scheme

The National Health Authority(NHA) and the Amercian multinational company, Google partnered together for strengthening the implementation of the national health protection scheme, Ayushman Bharat—Pratan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PM-JAY). They have signed the Statement of Intent (SoI) in this regard.

• 14th Indo – Mongolian joint military training exercise, the 2019 Nomadic Elephant-XIV begun in Himachal Pradesh The aim of the exercise is to train both the armies in counter terrorism and counter insurgency (counter revolt) operations thus enhancing defence cooperation.



- Defence minister Rajnath Singh hiked monetary assistance for battle casualties from Rs2 to Rs 4 lakhs
- NITI Aayog's AIM and UNDP India jointly launched Youth Co:Lab for youth entrepreneurship & innovation

The Atal Innovation Mission(AIM) of NITI Aayog (National Institute for Transforming India) and United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) India of United Nations Sustainable Development Framework (UNSDF) launched a youth lab programme, Youth Co:Lab by signing a Letter of Intent(LoI) in-order to empower innovation and social entrepreneurship to the youths of India in New Delhi. By this initiative entrepreneurs and innovators will connect with govt, mentors, incubators and other investors to gain entrepreneurial skills.

• PMJAY in first year funded 90,000 cancer claims; Tamil Nadu tops the list

The Union Health Ministry's data showed that in its first year of the launch of the **Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana** (PMJAY), the treatment of 90,000 cancer patients was funded through 1.8 lakh hospital admissions. **Tamil Nadu** emerged as the top state where the most cancer patients availed treatment under PMJAY with 40,056 cases.

About-PMJAY:

Ayushman Bharat (AB) Yojana or Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY) or National Health Protection Scheme (NHPS) is a centrally sponsored scheme launched on 23 September 2018, under the Ayushman Bharat Mission of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) in India. The scheme aims at making interventions in primary, secondary

and tertiary care systems, covering both preventive and promotive health, to address healthcare holistically.

• 5th World Parliament of science, religion and philosophy 2019 held in Pune, Maharashtra

A 3-day event of 5th World Parliament of Science, Religion and Philosophy 2019 with the theme of 'Role of Science, Religion and Philosophy for World Peace and well-being of Mankind' organised by MIT (Maharashtra Institute of Technology).

• Global Summit on 'Spirituality for Unity, Peace and Prosperity' held in Mount Abu, Rajasthan

The Vice President of India, Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu inaugurated the Global Conference-cum- expo on 'Spirituality for Unity, Peace and Prosperity' organized by Prajapita Brahma Kumaris Ishwariya Vishwa Vidyalaya at the Shantivan Campus in Mount Abu, Rajasthan. It was held from September 28 to October 1, 2019.

• India's first e-waste clinic to be set up in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh

The first e-waste clinic of India will be set up in **Bhopal**, **Madhya Pradesh**. Bhopal Municipal Corporation (BMC) and the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) have tied up to set up the clinic.

• India's 1st plant to produce diesel from plastic waste opened in Mathura, Uttar Pradesh

India's 1st plant to produce diesel from plastic waste in Mathura district of Uttar Pradesh has been soft-launched by Mathura MP (Member of Parliament) Hema Malini with the aim to fulfill Prime Minister(PM) Narendra Modi's dream of a Swachh Bharat Mission.

About Swachh Bharat Mission:

It was launched on 2nd October 2014 by Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi to achieve universal sanitation coverage and to put the focus on sanitation. It consists of two

sub-missions Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin)-(SBM-G) and Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban).

50th IFFI for 2019 to be held in Goa

Information and Broadcasting Minister Mr. Prakash Javadekar notified that the 50th, the Golden Jubilee edition of the International Film Festival of India (IFFI) 2019 will be held in Goa from November 20-28, 2019 with Russia as the partner country. For the first time, films with audio deion will be screened for the visually impaired.

• Overview of Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's visit to India

Bangladesh's Prime Minister **Sheikh Hasina** paid a four-day official visit to India at the invitation of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. This is the first visit of Bangladesh PM since the completion of elections in both Bangladesh and India. A total of 3 bilateral projects were inaugurated through video link. They were

- Import of Bulk LPG (liquefied petroleum gas) from Bangladesh.
- Vocational training and
- Social training facilities.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina was invited as the Chief Guest at the 33rd edition of the India Economic Summit organized by the World Economic Forum (WEF) in partnership with Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) from 03-04 October 2019. The theme for the 2019 summit was 'Innovating for India: Strengthening South Asia, Impacting the World'.

• 39th WCP for 2019 held at KIIT University, Bhubaneswar, Odisha

Chief minister of Odisha, Naveen Patnaik inaugurated the **39th World Congress of Poets** (WCP) for 2019 at the **Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology** (KIIT) **University, Bhubaneswar, Odisha**. It was held from October 2-6, 2019 under the theme 'Compassion through Poetry'. It was held for the third time in India.

- India to shift to BS VI vehicular emission norms from BS IV by April 2020
- India will shift to Bharat Stage Six (BS-VI) vehicular emission norms from BS IV by April
 2020 in order to curb vehicular pollution. This announcement was made by the Environment and Forest Minister Mr Prakash Javadekar in New Delhi.
- BS6-compliant vehicles will be available in Delhi in April 2020 and BS6 petrol/diesel is already available in Delhi/NCR. A green logo and Quick Response (QR) coding system have been developed in order to differentiate green crackers from the conventional crackers.
- 10th edition of Indo Maldives joint military exercise Ekuverin 2019 begin at Aundh Mil Stn, Pune

This 14 day joint exercise between Indian Army (IA) and Maldives National Defence Forces (MNDF) will be conducted till October 20, 2019.



- Indian Army's first mountain combat exercise 'Him Vijay' 2019 begun in Arunachal Pradesh
- Jal Shakti Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat launched 'Ganga Aamantran' Abhiyan in New Delhi.

It is the first of its kind effort by **National Mission for Clean Ganga(NMCG)** to raft across the entire stretch of the river. It is also the longest ever social campaign undertaken through an adventure sporting activity in spreading the message of river rejuvenation and water conservation on a massive scale.

• Revenue Secretary Ajay Bhushan Pandey inaugurated National e-Assessment Scheme of Income Tax department & New Delhi:

Revenue Secretary Shri **Ajay Bhushan Pandey** who is also the Chief Executive Officer(CEO) of Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) inaugurated **National e-**

Assessment Scheme (NeAS) in New Delhi. This e-Assessment scheme along with the National e-Assessment Centre (NeAC), would benefit the Income Tax(IT) department in imparting efficiency, transparency, accountability in the assessment process and would have no physical interface between taxpayers and tax officers. Section 143(3A) & (3B) of the IT Act empowered notification of E-assessment scheme.

• On October 7, 2019 the External Affairs Minister(EAM) Shri Subrahmanyam Jaishankar inaugurated e-Vidyabharti (tele-education) and e-ArogyaBharti (Tele-Medicine) projects for all the 54 African countries in New Delhi on the 55th anniversary of Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation(ITEC) which is India's flagship capacity building programme. These are e-learning platforms to ease the delivery of online education. It will serve as a digital bridge between India and Africa. These will be delivered by Telecommunications Consultants India Ltd (TCIL).



- Supreme Court judge, Justice S. Abdul Nazeer inaugurated the first Government-sponsored and operated day-care cum recreation centre for senior citizens in Leh, Jammu & Kashmir (J&K) in presence of Chief Justice J&K, Gita Mittal. It is co-sponsored by Government and the District Legal Service Authority of J&K. It is a one-stop-shop for entertainment, medical services and legal aid for the aged people of the region.
- The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) in partnership with the Indian Institute of Management- Bangalore (IIMB) will launch a new 2-year program called 'Mahatma Gandhi National Fellowship' (MGNF). It will be delivered by IIMB's Centre of Public Policy (CPP).

Key Points:

- i. Objective: To identify and train a group of young, committed and dynamic individuals.
- ii. Coverage: It will be launched on a pilot basis in 6 states namely Gujarat, Karnataka,

Meghalaya, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, and Uttarakhand.

iii. Eligibility: Graduates from a recognized university and Indian citizens in the age group of 21-30 years will be eligible to apply.

iv. The MSDE for their skill components would support a total of 75 districts.

- Union Minister for Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW) Dr.Harsh Vardhan inaugurated the 13th Conference of Central Council of Health and Family Welfare (CCHWF) for 2019 in New Delhi.
- **Objective:** To build a consensus on National wealth priorities.
- **SUMAN:** A new initiative '**Surakshit Matritva Aashwasan** (SUMAN)' for Zero Preventable Maternal and Newborn Deaths, its website and the grievance redressal portal was launched on the occasion.
- Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi has released a commemorative stamp of Marshal of the Indian Air Force (IAF) late Arjan Singh in honor of his exemplary service to our nation. The stamp was issued at an event of the 'at home' program of the IAF to mark its 87th raising day in New Delhi.



- Union Minister for Health & Family Welfare(MOHFW) DrHarsh Vardhan launched 'The WHO India Country Cooperation Strategy 2019–2023: A Time of Transition' in New Delhi. This Country Cooperation Strategy(CCS) paves the way for World Health Organisation(WHO) to work with the Indian govt. in achieving the goals of health sector.
- Union Human Resource Development (HRD) Minister Shri Ramesh Pokhriyal
 'Nishank' has launched 14-day long ambitious Pradhan Mantri Innovative Learning

 Program- 'DHRUV' from Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) headquarters at Bengaluru, Karnataka in presence of Dr K Sivan, Chairman, ISRO, Wing Cdr. Rakesh Sharma, AC (Retd.) among others.

- National Blindness and Visually Impaired Survey 2019 released by Health minister Harsh Vardhan in New Delhi. Visual impairment in India has been reduced by about 52%. Prevalence of blindness in India came down by around 47% since the last survey which was conducted in 2006-2007.
- Railways launched Sahyatri mobile app and a new website for online complaint registration. The Indian Railways launched a Sahyatri mobile app and awebsite www.railways.delhipolice.gov.in through which the passengers can register their complaints online. It was launched by Union Minister of State (MoS) in the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) Mr Nityanand Rai at the NDMC (New Delhi Municipal Council) Convention Centre on Sansad Marg, New Delhi.
- Health Minister Harsh Vardhan released the first National Diabetes and Diabetic Retinopathy Survey report in New Delhi. The survey has revealed that Diabetic Retinopathy (DR) in India is 16.9% The prevalence of Known Diabetes (KD) is 8.0% while diabetes prevalence in the surveyed population is recorded at 11.8%.
- The 2nd edition of Indian Navy(IN) –Bangladesh Navy(BN) Coordinated Patrol (CORPAT) 2019 has been held in Northern Bay of Bengal from October 10-11, 2019 with the participation of INS (Indian Naval Ship) Ranvijay, a guided-missile destroyer and INS Kuthar, an indigenously built missile as well as BNS (Bangladesh Naval Ship) Ali Haider, a Type 053 frigate and BNS Shadinota, a Type 056 stealth guided missile corvette.



• The 'India Sports Summit- Fitness: \$10 Billion Opportunity' was inaugurated by the Union Minister for Sports & Youth Affairs Mr Kiren Rijiju in New Delhi. It was organised by the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), Union Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports (MYAS), Sportscom, and Sportskeeda. India is striving to get Kabaddi a place in the Olympics in 2024.

• Chhattisgarh state Health Minister T S Singhdeo has inaugurated India's 1st 'Garbage Cafe' situated in Ambikapur of Surguja district. The concept of this cafe is that ragpickers and the homeless will collect plastic waste, and in return, the municipal corporation will offer them food. Ambikapur has clichéd the title of the 2nd cleanest city in India after Indore, Madhya Pradesh. It will provide boost to 'plastic-free' India goal set by the central Government.



• 2nd edition of Indo-Japan joint military exercise "Dharma Guardian 2019" to be held in Vairengte, Mizoram.

The **2nd** joint **military exercise 'Dharma Guardian-2019'** to promote military cooperation between **India and Japan** will be held in **Mizoram**. The event is being held from 19, October- 2, November 2019 at Counter Insurgency Warfare School located in Vairengte, Mizoram.

• 10th edition of Indo-US joint military exercise 'Vajra Prahar 2019 ' begins in Seattle, US:

The joint military exercise 'Vajra Prahar' between India and the US (United States) begins at Seattle's (in Washington ,US) Joint Base Lewis-McChord (JBLM). This is the 10th edition of the joint exercise, which will run until 28 October, 2019. It is held alternately in India and America. In 2018,the practice took place in Jaipur, Rajasthan.



• SARAS Aajeevika Mela 2019 begins in New Delhi:

The Sale of Articles of Rural Artisan Society (SARAS) Aajeevika Mela 2019 is underway at India Gate Lawns in New Delhi. It had begun on October 10 and will conclude on October 23, 2019. The mela is an initiative by the Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM), Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD) and was inaugurated by Rural Development Minister Narendra Singh Tomar.



- PM Modi chaired meeting on "Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat" programme in New Delhi
- Prime Minister(PM) of India Shri Narendra Modi chaired the meeting on Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat programme in New Delhi. Govt launches Food Safety Mitra Scheme



- Union Minister for Health and Family Welfare Harsh Vardhan launched Food Safety
 Mitra Scheme, Eat Right Jacket and Eat Right Jhola. Food Safety and Standards
 Authority of India (FSSAI) has introduced the scheme of Food Safety Mitra (FSM) through
 which it plans to engage motivated individuals with the food safety ecosystem at ground
 level.
- A Food Safety Mitra Scheme is an individual professional certified by FSSAI who assists in compliances related to FSS Act, Rules & Regulations with three avatars- Digital Mitra, Trainer Mitra and Hygiene Mitra depending upon their respective roles and responsibilities.
- Indian Railways to become net zero carbon emitter by 2030
- Indian Railways (IR) has announced that it will become a net-zero carbon emitter by 2030. The move will be a part of India's strategy to combat climate change.
- The announcement was made by railways and commerce minister Piyush Goyal at the India Energy Forum by CERAWEEK in New Delhi. India is the biggest emitter of greenhouse gases after the US and China, and is among countries most vulnerable to climate change.
- Indian railways is the **world's largest railway network.** It has a rail network of around 1,25,000km under single management. IR is to go green by setting up solar power generation capacities in its large tracts of land along its network.

• J&K's Chenani-Nashri Tunnel to be renamed after Dr Shyama Prasad Mukherjee



- India's longest Tunnel Chenani- Nashri on NH 44, in Jammu and Kashmir will be named after Bhartiya Jansangh Founder Dr Shyama Prasad Mukherjee.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi in 2017 had dedicated to the nation this 9.2 km long tunnel that reduces the distance between Jammu and Srinagar by 31 km.
- Railways Minister Piyush Goyal flagged off 9 'Sewa Service' trains
- Railways Minister Piyush Goyal flagged off 9 'Sewa Service' trains. These trains are connecting small towns to major cities and one of those, the Vadnagar-Mehsana train, was the railways' gift to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who sold tea at the Vadnagar station during his younger days.
- The 9 "Sewa Service" trains were launched without any additional investment by the railways and it was an example of how to use existing resources to the maximum.
- NITI Aayog launches India Innovation Index 2019
- NITI Aayog with Institute for Competitiveness as the knowledge partner released the India
 Innovation Index (III) 2019. Karnataka is the most innovative major state in India.

- Commemorative stamp on centenary of NIN released





- According to the Central Pollution Control Board of india ,Loni rural of Ghaziabad , uttarpradesh emerged as the most polluted city in india with air quality index figures at 358.

- Col. Chewang Rinchen Setu inaugurated in Ladakh
- Defence Minister Rajnath Singh inaugurated Col. Chewang Rinchen Setu (Bridge) which has been constructed at an altitude of 14,650 feet in the forward area of Ladakh region.
- It is named in honour of Colonel Chewang Rinchen who was one of the highly decorated officers in Indian Army from Ladakh. He was also a Maha Vir Chakara awardee (1952).
- The Bridge, which is 1400 feet span, is constructed by the **Border Road Organization**.
- According to BRO, micropile technology was used during the foundation of the bridge to overcome the technological challenges in this remote area of Ladakh.
- The construction of the Bridge was completed within 15 working months using 6900 cubic meters of concrete and 1984 metric tons of steel.
- Siachen base camp to Kumar Post opened for tourism purposes
- Government of India has decided to open the entire area from Siachen base camp to Kumar Post for tourism purposes. The step has been taken to boost tourism in Ladakh.
- It will also give people a window to appreciate the tough work done by Army jawans and engineers in extreme weather and inhospitable terrains.
- The Siachen Glacier at the height of around 20,000 ft in the Karakoram range is known as the highest militarised zone in the world where the soldiers have to battle frostbite and high winds.
- The Glacier came under the strategic control of India in 1984 following 'Operation Meghdoot'.

NCRB releases Crime in India Report 2017



- National Crime Records Bureau has released the annual "Crime in India Report 2017".
 The report has been released after a delay of 2 years.
- According to the report, **3.59 lakh cases** of **crime against women** were reported in the country. **Uttar Pradesh topped the list** with 56,011 cases followed by Maharashtra with 31,979 cases and West Bengal 30,002 in cases of crime against women.
- Indian Railways install Electronic Interlocking System on Grand Chord route
- Indian Railways has installed the most advanced Electronic Interlocking System on the Grand Chord route.
- The measure is expected to help Indian Railways speed up trains and achieve the objective of reducing the travel time between Delhi and Howrah to about 12 hours from the existing 17 to 19 hours.
- Grand Chord is part of the Howrah-Gaya-Delhi line and Howrah-Allahabad-Mumbai line. The new Electronic system has replaced outdated 65-year old mechanical signalling system at Tundla Junction in Uttar Pradesh on the route.
- IIM Kozhikode & MRPL to support women entrepreneurs



• IIM Kozhikode and Mangalore Refineries and Petrochemicals Ltd. have announced a special drive Labelled as "La Eve (meaning The Woman)" to support women entrepreneurs in the country.

- Chenani-Nashri Tunnel renamed as Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Tunnel



- J&K's Chenani-Nashri Tunnel, a 9 km-long tunnel that reduces the distance between Jammu and Srinagar by 31 km has been renamed as Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Tunnel.
- The 'Chenani-Nashri Highway Tunnel' is not only India's longest highway tunnel but also Asia's longest bi-directional highway tunnel.
- The renaming of the tunnel aims to preserve Mukherjee's heritage and memory as well as a tribute for his sacrifice for the nation.
- Indian Railway launches One Touch ATVM
- Indian Railways has launched 'one touch ATVM' at 42 suburban stations of Central Railway over Mumbai Suburban Network.
- The machine has been launched to render fast ticketing to millions of commuters. This new machine will reduce the waiting time of the passengers and allow passenger to avoid standing in long queues.

- The new machine is loaded with the user friendly procedure which will greatly ease the load on ticketing system of Mumbai Suburban Network. A total of 92 ATVMs has been installed at 42 suburban stations.

- Female passengers to travel free in DTC buses (both AC and non-AC) by issuance of 'single journey free travel pass'. However, they will have the option to purchase the ticket for the journey.
- Under the free ride scheme, the bus conductors would be distributing pink tickets with the value of Rs 10 each to all female passengers free of cost. The cost of each ticket will then be reimbursed to the transporters by the Delhi Government. The women passengers will, however, have the option of buying regular tickets.

- The first National Corporate Social Responsibility Awards were recently conferred by the President Ram Nath Kovind.
- This award was given to the various companies for their outstanding contribution in the area of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR).
- The award was initiated in the year of **Mahatma Gandhi's 150th birth anniversary**. These awards will be conferred on October 2 every year.
- Nirmal Purja becomes world's fastest mountain climber
- Nirmal Purja, a Nepali mountaineer, has become the fastest mountain climber as he scaled 14 highest peaks in just over six months.
- The previous record of fastest mountain climbing was 7 years, 11 months and 14 days.
- He completed all 14 mountains, all over 8,000 metres (26,250 feet) in seven months under 'Project Possible'.
- India to sign Strategic Partnership Council Agreement with Saudi Arabia
- India will become the fourth country to sign the Strategic Partnership Council Agreement with Saudi Arabia. It would strengthen the robust relations of India and Saudi Arabia.
- Experts believe that this agreement will begin a new era of cooperation among various sectors of India and Saudi Arabia.
- Both the countries also agreed to hold a comprehensive security dialogue mechanism and they have also reached the level of entering into agreements on security cooperation, collaboration in defence industries.

- Air India paints 'Ik Onkar' symbol to celebrate Guru Nanak's 550th Birth Anniversary
- The symbol of **Sikh religion 'Ik Onkar'** has been made on the tail of an Air India aircraft in order to commemorate the **550th Guru Nanak Jayanti**.
- This aircraft will fly between **Amritsar to Delhi** thrice (Monday, Thursday and Saturday.) in a week.
- This flight service will help Sikh pilgrims to visit India on the occasion of 550th birth anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev.
- 80 immigration counters set up for speedy clearance at Kartarpur Corridor
- 7th edition of Tawang festival
- The 7th edition of the Tawang Festival kicked off on October 29, 2019 in Arunachal Pradesh. US Ambassador to India Kenneth Juster had declared the festival opens.
- 'Aarambh', common foundation course for IAS probationers held in Statue of Unity



- The Centre's first-ever common foundation course "Aarambh" (Beginning) for 2019 batch probationer civil servants has begun at the **Statue of Unity** in Kevadia, Gujarat.
- There are around 500 newly recruited bureaucrats are undergoing six-day training. The theme this year is 'How to achieve the goal of making India a 5 trillion dollar economy'.
- Vice President Venkaiah Naidu introduces 15-point charter for Parliamentary reforms
- Vice President M Venkaiah Naidu unveiled the 15-point reform charter for a new political concept to ensure effective functioning in Parliament and State Legislatures. He also discussed the existing shortcomings of parliamentary democracy.

- This is for the first time that a state is converted into two Union Territories. The total number of states in the country will now be 28 while the total Union Territories will go up to nine.

First ever conducted International Institute for Management Development's (IMD's) **Smart City Index 2019**, **Hyderabad** topped among the Indian cities with the rank of 67. It was followed by New Delhi at rank 68. Mumbai and Bengaluru were ranked at the 78th and 79th positions respectively. The list was topped by **Singapore**.

• The World Economic Forum(WEF) released its report on **2019 Global Competitiveness**Index 4.0. In the index, India was ranked 68th in the list, which is down by 10 places from its previous rank of 58 in 2018. The index was topped by Singapore as the world's most competitive economy by replacing the United States in second place.



- Defence minister of India Mr Rajnath Singh visited Paris, France from October 7-9, 2019.
 He was received by a military guard of honour at Hotel de Brienne, the headquarters of the French Armed Forces ministry in Paris. During the visit, he received the first of the 36 Rafale aircrafts. The first squadron of the aircraft will be deployed at Ambala air force station, Haryana and the second at Hasimara base in West Bengal.
- **2019 Henley Passport Index ranking** was released. In the report, **India** is currently ranked at **82nd place** in 2019, which is one place down from its previous rank of 81 in 2018. Japan and Singapore both hold the most powerful passport by ranking 1st in the list. The study was conducted by Henley & Partners.
- World Health Organisation (WHO) has launched its first report on vision. - This is the first graduate-level, research-based AI university in the world. MBZUAI will
 enable graduate students, businesses and governments to advance the artificial intelligence
 field.
- MBZUAI will introduce a new model of academia and research to the field of AI, providing students and faculty access to some of the world's most advanced AI systems to unleash its potential for economic and societal development.
- India hands over 2nd pair of Mi-24V helicopters to Afghan Air forces



- India handed over the second pair of Mi-24V helicopters to war-torn Afghanistan, boosting the capability of the Afghan Air forces.
- The helicopters were officially handed over by Indian Ambassador Vinay Kumar to Afghanistan's acting Defence Minister Asadullah Khalid at a ceremony held in the military airport, Kabul.
- These helicopters are a replacement for the four attack helicopters previously gifted by India to Afghanistan in 2015 and 2016.
- United Nation General Assembly Elects 14 Member States to Human Rights

 Council



- The **United Nation General Assembly** has elected 14 States to the 47 member body of UN Human Rights Council(UNHRC). The UNHRC is responsible for promoting and protecting all human rights around the globe.
- The Assembly elected Armenia, Brazil, Germany, Indonesia, Japan, Libya, Marshall Islands, Mauritania, Namibia, Netherlands, Poland, Republic of Korea, Sudan and Venezuela.

- All 14 members will serve three-year terms beginning on 1 January 2020.
- The newly-elected States are replacing the following outgoing members: China, Croatia,
 Cuba, Egypt, Hungary, Iceland, Iraq, Japan, Rwanda, Saudi Arabia, South
 Africa, Tunisia and the United Kingdom.
- The 14 new members were elected according to the following pattern: 4 seats for the African States; 4 seats for the Asia-Pacific States; 2 seats for the Eastern European States; 2 seats for Latin American and Caribbean States; and 2 seats for Western European and other States.
- NASA Astronauts complete All-Woman Spacewalk



- Nasa astronauts Christina Koch and Jessica Meir have made history by completing
 the first-ever all-female spacewalk. They spent 7 hours outside the International Space
 Station (ISS) replacing a failed power control unit.
- Ms Koch had already carried out four spacewalks but it was the first such mission for Ms Meir, who became the 15th woman to walk in space.
- Sri Lanka has removed from FATF's Grey List
- Sri Lanka has been removed from the "Grey List" of the international terror financing watchdog FATF.
- The Financial Action Task Force (FATF), whose five-day plenary concluded in Paris,
 France stated that Sri Lanka made significant progress in addressing the strategic AML/CFT deficiencies identified earlier.
- In October 2016, the FATF announced that Sri Lanka will be subjected to a review of the **International Cooperation Review Group (ICRG)** of the terror financing watchdog to assess the progress of AML/CFT effectiveness in the country.

- Saad Hariri resigns as Prime Minister of Lebanon



• Prime Minister of Lebanon, Saad Hariri has resigned from the portfolio amid antigovernment protests.

- He resigned bowing to one of the central demands of anti-government demonstrators shortly
 after baton-wielding Hezbollah supporters rampaged through the main protest camp in
 Beirut.
- The protests has paralyzed the country for nearly two weeks. Lebanon is facing a deep-running fiscal crisis as it staggers under one of the highest debt ratios in the world \$86 billion, or more than 150% of the country's gross domestic product.



John Bannister Goodenough** is a German American professor at the University of Texas at Austin, US. **He becomes the oldest winner of a Nobel prize.** The previous record-holder was Arthur Ashkin, who won the Physics Nobel in 2018 at 96. Goodenough doubled the lithium battery's potential, creating the right conditions for a vastly more powerful and useful battery.
- **iii.** In addition **Michael Stanley Whittingham** is a British–American chemist and currently a professor at Binghamton University, New York, US (United States). He eliminates pure lithium from the battery.

About Nobel Prize:

It is a set of annual international awards bestowed for outstanding work in the fields of physics, chemistry, physiology or medicine, literature, economics, and the promotion of peace.

History of Nobel prize in the field of chemistry

- ♦ A total of 110 awards were given in the field of chemistry from 1901 to 2018. Of these, 181 people were given this award.
- ◆ Madame Marie Curie became the first scientist to receive two Nobel Prizes (1903 Nobel Prize in Physics and the 1911 Nobel Prize in Chemistry).


- The Mohun Bagan Athletic Club has conferred life membership to Nobel laureate Abhijit Banerjee.

- The Indian Army (IA) is to conduct exercise codenamed "Sindhu Sudarshan" for the year 2019 in the deserts of Rajasthan from November 29 to December 4, 2019.
- The aim of this exercise is to evaluate the capability of the defence services in an integrated air-land battle.
- In the Sindhu Sudarshan exercise, operational efficiency of the Strike Corps fighting in the desert terrain will be assessed and the Indian Air Force(IAF) will provide support in terms of destruction of targets and airlifting troops.
- The exercise showcasing a high degree of synergy between the Army and Air Force will be reviewed by Lieutenant General SK Saini.
- DRDO starts work on 'next-gen' hypersonic weapon



- The **Defence Research and Development** (**DRDO**) has started work to produce hypersonic weapon missiles that travel at 5 times speed of sound, or a little over a mile every second.
- A wind tunnel to test and fine-tune the technology will be operational soon.
- Hypersonic weapons are specifically designed for increased survivability against modern ballistic missile defence systems.
- These missiles are capable of delivering conventional or nuclear payloads at speeds not imagined hiterto over long ranges.



- Two-day long manoeuvres by **Sudarshan Chakra Vahini** of Indian Army Started at Jaisalmer, field firing range in Rajasthan.
- In this war exercise, the army is going to exhibit its strength regarding Agni Missile and artillery.
- Artillery, Arms and mechanized forces, Army air defence and helicopters of army aviation are participating in this exercise to test mutual coordination.
- Endogenously manufactured light helicopter Rudra and self-propelled artillery gun system K-9 vajra are also taking part in this exercise.
- Defence of Andaman and Nicobar Islands exercise 2019 (Danx-19)

- The focus of the exercise will be to undertake Joint Mobility and Tactical interoperability among the two forces.
- India-Oman begin joint training exercise 'EX EASTERN BRIDGE-V'



• Indian Air Force (IAF) kickstarted its bilateral joint exercise with Royal Air Force Oman (RAFO), named 'EX EASTERN BRIDGE-V' at Air Force Base Masirah, Oman.

- The exercise will be held till October 26. The IAF contingent comprises of MiG-29 and C-17 aircraft.
- MiG-29 will be exercising with Royal Air Force Oman's Eurofighter Typhoon, F-16 and Hawk.
- For the first time, MiG-29 fighter aircraft will be participating in an international exercise outside India.
- The exercise will enhance inter-operability during mutual operations between the two Air Forces and will provide an opportunity to learn from each other's best practices. Last time, the bilateral exercise was held in 2017 at Jamnagar, Gujarat.
- Armies of India, France to take part in bilateral drill in Rajasthan



- The armies of India and France will take part in a bilateral drill, with a focus on counter-terror operations, in Rajasthan from October 31 to November 13The joint drill, christened 'Exercise Shakti', commenced in 2011.
- As part of **Exercise Shakti-2019**, French troops arrived in India on October 26 for training with their Indian counterparts.
- The bilateral training exercise will be conducted at Foreign Training Node at Mahajan Field Firing Ranges, Rajasthan.
- Shakti-2019: Indo-French counter terrorism exercise to begin from Oct 31



• Indo-French joint exercise 'Shakti 2019' is scheduled to begin on October 31, 2019 in Rajasthan. The bilateral exercise will be conducted between the armies of both countries.

• 'Shakti-2019' will be conducted at the Foreign Training Node at Mahajan Field Firing Ranges in Rajasthan The exercise will be conducted from October 31 to November 13, 2019.

Economy

- WTO cuts global trade growth forecast to 1.2% for 2019 from 2.6%
- The World Trade Organisation (WTO) in its report reduced the global trade growth forecast to 1.2% for 2019 from 2.6% growth forecast made in April 2019 due to trade tensions and sluggish global economy. It is the weakest level in a decade. The global trade growth forecast for 2020 was reduced to 2.7% from 3%.



• S&P Global Ratings projects India's growth to 6.3% from previous 7.1% for 2019-2020.



Government reduces interest on house building advance to 7.9% from 8.5%

To overcome the sluggishness of the real estate sector & boost housing demand, the government has reduced the interest rate on **House Building Advance (HBA)** from 8.5% to **7.9%** for one year.

As per the Union Housing and Urban Affairs Ministry, the new interest rate was effective from October 1, 2019 & will apply to all loan amounts.



- International rating agency **Moody's** has reduced India's gross Domestic Product(GDP) growth forecast to **5.8%** for FY20 (Fiscal Year20) from its previous estimate of 6.2%.
- Energy Efficiency Services Limited (EESL), a joint venture of PSUs (Public Sector Undertakings) under the Union Ministry of Power and National Investment and Infrastructure Fund (NIIF) have joined hands to formulate an electricity distribution plan to install smart electricity meters in all households. The two companies have formed a joint venture called IntelliSmart Infrastructure Pvt Ltd (IntelliSmart) which will execute, finance and operate the smart meter program.
- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) came up with a new reporting system for all cooperative banks (urban, State & district central) called Central Information System for Banking Infrastructure (CISBI) in which they will submit information related to opening/ closing/ conversion of branches, offices, non-administratively independent offices (extension counters, satellite offices), and customer service points (ATMs- Automated Teller Machines) in a single proforma online.



- An annual report on the most valuable and strongest nation brands named Brand Finance Nation Brands 2019 was released by Brand Finance in which India was ranked 7th from 9th rank of 2018 with 18.7% growth in brand value to \$2,562 bn. The list was topped by the United States of America (USA) with 7.2% growth in brand value to \$27,751 bn.
- World Bank slashes India's growth projection to 6 % for 2019, down from 7.5%:
 World Bank in its report, "South Asia Economic Focus, Fall 2019: Making (De)centralization Work", has lowered India's growth forecast to 6 % for 2019 (down

from 7.5 %) for the second consecutive year ,after a wide decline in the initial quarters. In 2018, India's GDP (Gross domestic product) growth stood at 6.8 %, down from 7.2 % in 2017.




 Air India becomes world's first airline to bring aircraft to runway using taxibot technology

Air India has become the first airline in the world to use **taxibot** on an A320 aircraft with passengers onboard at Indira Gandhi International Airport ,New Delhi. The taxibot is a pilot-controlled semi-robotic aircraft tractor, bringing the aircraft from the parking bay to the runway and vice versa.



India ranked 102 in Global Hunger Index 2019



- The **2019 Global Hunger Index** (**GHI**) indicates that the level of hunger and undernutrition worldwide falls into the serious category. As per the index, India ranks **102nd out of 117** qualifying countries, with a score of 30.3.
- India has slipped from 95th rank in 2010 to 102nd in 2019 on the Global Hunger Index (GHI), with the increase in the prevalence of wasting (low weight for height) among children with score under 5 contributing the most to the country's poor performance.

- Seventeen countries, including **Belarus**, **Ukraine**, **Turkey**, **Cuba and Kuwait**, shared the top rank with GHI scores less than 5.
- There were only four countries in the alarming hunger category are Madagascar, Chad, Yemen and the Central African Republic in the extremely alarming hunger category.
- IMF cuts World and India growth rates



- The World Bank-International Monetary Fund (IMF) annual meetings kicked off on a somber note, with the IMF downgrading global growth in 2019 to 3%, the slowest since the global financial crisis.
- India's growth projections have also been downgraded to 6.1% and 7.0% in 2019 and 2020 respectively, down by 1.2 percentage points and 0.5 percentage points relative to April projections, owing to weaker than expected domestic demand.
- The IMF projected the U.S. would grow at 2.4% and 2.1% in 2019 and 2020 respectively.
- For China, growth was projected to grow at 6.1% and 5.8% in 2019 and 2020.

- On the **70th** National Day of **China** which was observed on October 1, 2019, it launched **DF-41** (Dongfeng-41) the most powerful intercontinental-range ballistic missile on the planet during the National Day parade at Chang'an Avenue in Beijing. It made its first appearance along with a clutch of new military hardware.



• NASA gets it first all electric experimental aircraft X-57 Mod II, codenamed Maxwell

National Aeronautics and Space Administration's (NASA) Armstrong Flight Research Center (AFRC) in Edwards, California received its first all electric experimental aircraft (X-plane) X-57 Mod II (Modification II) codenamed Maxwell from Empirical Systems Aerospace (ESAero) of San Luis Obispo, California, United States (US).

• China launches new Gaofen-10 satellite to take high quality photos

On October 5, 2019, **China** has sent the new **Gaofen-10 satellite** into space with a March-4C rocket developed by the Shanghai Academy of Spaceflight Technology under the China Aerospace Science and Technology Corporation from the Taiyuan Satellite Launch Center in North China's Shanxi Province. The satellite has successfully entered the planned orbit & will start receiving pictures and other

data with a resolution of less than a metre. This Gaofen-10 satellite can be used in land survey, urban planning, road network design, crop yield estimation as well as disaster relief.



• For the first time, researchers see individual virus formation

The researchers, including those from Harvard University in the United States (US) have captured images of the **formation of individual viruses**. The study was published in the journal **Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences of the United States of America** (PNAS).



- Union Science and Technology Minister Dr Harsh Vardhan launched a disaster warning
 device and satellite based Gagan Enabled Mariner's Instrument for Navigation and
 Information (GEMINI) system. It will help provide information related to disaster
 warnings when fishermen move away from the coast beyond 10 to 12 kilometres,
 Potential Fishing Zones (PFZ) and Ocean States Forecasts (OSF) to fishermen.
- A team of researchers at Shiv Nadar University in Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh (UP) have discovered two 'plastic-eating' bacterial strains namely Exiguobacterium sibiricum strain DR11 and Exiguobacterium undae strain DR14 from the wetlands of Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh.
- NASA launched ICON (Ionospheric Connection Explorer) space weather satellite to study earth's ionosphere. Ionospheric is the layer of the earth's atmosphere that contains a high concentration of ions and free electrons and is able to reflect radio waves. In 2018, NASA had launched a satellite named Gold which is studying the upper atmosphere.

- Mobile app "mHariyali" & website for "Environment Protection in Government Colonies" launched by MoHUA(Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Housing & Urban Affairs) in New Delhi, which encourages people to plant trees and for Green drives.
- Debayan saha ,ITI Kharagpur graduate invents "PM 2.5" device to curb air pollution
- Debayan saha, a mechanical engineering graduate from ITI (Indian Institute of Technology)Kharagpur has invented a device called "PM 2.5" when fitted near the silencer pipe in vechicles will curb air pollution. 1 car fitted with the device can neturalise the pollution emitted from 10 cars in its vicinity.
- World's oldest pearl discovered near Abu Dhabi




- The 8,000-year-old pearl was found during excavations at Marawah Island which also revealed the earliest architecture in the UAE.
- Authorities said the discovery proved that pearls had been traded in the region since
 Neolithic times.
- The pearl will go on display later this month at the Louvre gallery, Abu Dhabi.
- "The discovery of the oldest pearl in the world in Abu Dhabi makes it clear that so much of our recent economic and cultural history has deep roots that stretch back to the dawn of prehistory," said Mohamed Khalifa Al Mubarak, the chairman of Abu Dhabi's Department of Culture and Tourism.

Meet the White bellbird, the world's loudest bird



- Bellbirds have the loudest bird calls yet documented in the world, according to a study
 which found that their mating songs pack more decibels than the screams of howler
 monkeys and the bellows of bisons.
- According to the study, published in the journal Current Biology, the male white bellbird's mating call is about three times louder than screaming phias — the previously loudest bird singer.
- The researchers, including those from the University of Massachusetts in the U.S., said that the bellbird's calls were so loud that they wondered how the females of the species listened to them at close range without permanent damage to their hearing.
- IIIT Hyderabad create first ever Indian Brain Atlas



- Researchers from the Indian Institute of Information Technology Hyderabad (IIIT-H), Telangana have created the first-ever 'Indian brain atlas' (IBA).
- The Indian brain atlas was constructed in collaboration with the Department of Imaging Sciences and Interventional Radiology, Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute for Medical Sciences and Technology, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala.
- The study has revealed that the Indian brain, on an average, is smaller in height, width and volume when compared to Western and other Eastern populations.
- This will help in early diagnosis of Alzheimer's and other brain-related ailments.

• The World Mental Health Day (WMHD) is observed annually on the 10th of October in order to raise awareness on mental health issues and the efforts needed to support mental health. It is organized by the World Federation for Mental Health with the World Health Organisation's support, the International Association for Suicide Prevention(IASP) and United for Global Mental Health (United-GMH). The theme for 2019 is "suicide prevention".

- The day which was first established in 2015, aims to raise awareness on obesity and

 crisis.

- (RMDs). The **theme** of this day for 2019 is "**Time2Work**". Arthritis is an inflammatory condition causing pain and stiffness in joints.

 aim to create broader awareness about the India Post's role and activities in the lives of
 people and business and its contribution to social and economic development.



- On October 12, 2019, World Migratory Bird Day (WMBD)was observed all over the

- Osteoporosis is also called a Silent disease.
- National Solidarity Day 2019 observed on October 20



- The day which commemorates the national integrity shown by indian at **sino-indo war against china**. China had attacked india on this day in 1962.
- This day honours our armed forces who guard our borders.
- 61st Edition of National Police Commemoration day is observed every year in memory of the policemen who made the supreme sacrifice at hot springs in ladakh by chinese troops on Oct 21,1959.

- World Stroke Day observed on October 29,2019


